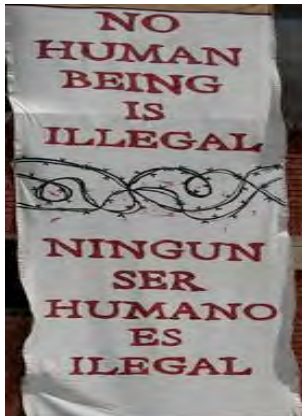


Public Hearing on Migrants' Rights



The U.N. Special Rapporteur on the Human Rights of Migrants, Mr. Jorge Bustamante, is in the United States conducting a three-week official fact-finding mission, and will be reviewing the situation of migrants in the country. This visit of the SR to New York/New Jersey provides us the opportunity to voice our concerns with regard to the human rights abuses of migrants and immigrants. This Public Hearing will feature testimonies of affected community members, advocates and grassroots organizations, and will feature documentaries and short video clips on detention & deportation, workplace rights, anti-immigrant ordinances and post-9/11 human rights violations.
