These Agents provided [redacted] with some "off-the-record" training, which consisted mainly of what to expect while working at U.S. Naval Base Guantanamo Bay, Cuba. [redacted] also spent a day at Ft. Belvoir attending a portion of the training the military was providing to their Naval Criminal Investigative Service, Air Force Office of Special Investigations, and Army CID Agents. [redacted] was told that the portion he attended was the most important part or most relevant part for [redacted].
