The door was closed however, so [redacted] could not tell if anyone was actually in the room. [redacted] thinks that he observed this sometime in the morning b/c he normally conducted his interviews in the morning sometime between 8 am and 12 pm. | Tue 06/03/2003<br>- Fri 07/18/2003        | [redacted] advised that during an interview of a Saudi detainee it became obvious to [redacted] and [redacted] that this detainee was being fed questions and information from other detainees on his cell block. At some point [redacted] asked the detainee if he wanted to be separated from the rest of the Saudi detainees. The detainee defiantly replied something to the effect of sure i don't care. After the interview [redacted] recommended that this detainee be put in isolation. [redacted] advised that this "isolation" was more like segregation. The detainee later told them that he enjoyed his time on the isolation block and was even able to communicate with [redacted] when he exercised. [redacted] said that the detainee even seemed happier after he was moved to this cell block. [redacted] thinks that [redacted] intention for segregating this Saudi detainee was just to remove him from his support system and reduce the influence of the cell block leader on this detainee's cooperation. | [redacted]<br>Interview 1<br>@26:40 - 32:50 |

[redacted] said that other detainees who he interviewed also made similar allegations. [redacted] did not report this allegation to OSC [redacted] [redacted] said that this was widely known that this was a common complaint from detainees and [redacted] would not have been surprised if this had actually happened on occasion.
