Prior to joining the Bureau he was the Joint Detainee Operations Group S-2 at U.S. Naval Base Guantanamo Bay, Cuba from 08/03 to approximately 07/04.	Interview 1 @pp.1
08/17/2003 - 07/17/2004	As the Joint Detainee Operations Group S-2 [redacted] did behavior analysis of the detainees and coordinated with the Joint Interrogation Group to identify leaders in the Camp.	Interview 1 @pp.1
08/17/2003 - 07/17/2004	When [redacted] was the S-2 for Joint Detainee Operations Group nobody came to him to report any instances of detainee abuse.	Interview 1 @pp.3
08/17/2003 - 07/17/2004	[redacted] believes that the Frequent Flyer Program was approved by General Geoffrey D. Miller. [redacted] advised that this was a program in which uncooperative detainees were moved from their cells every two hours. However, the detainees had to have at least a 4 hour rest period each day. [redacted] does not know for how long a detainee could be on the frequent flyer program.	Interview 1 @pp.3
08/17/2003 - 07/17/2004	[redacted] advised that while he was the S-2, the Joint Detainee Operations Group taught many of the Afghan detainees how to read and write in their own language.	Interview 1 @pp.3
08/17/2003 - 07/17/2004	[redacted] recollection is that it was mostly interrogators from the Joint Interrogation Group who requested that detainees be put on the Frequent Flyer Program. [redacted] doesn't think that anyone from the Federal Bureau of Investigation ever requested that a detainee go on the FFP.	Interview 1 @pp.4

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08/??/2003 - 07/??/2004	[redacted] advised that 98% of his interactions while he was the Joint Detainee Operations Group S-2 were with the Joint Interrogation Group. 08/??/2003 - 07/??/2004	[redacted] advised that the Joint Detainee Operations Group employed a military barber and if a detainee had to be forcibly removed from his cell for being uncooperative their head was shaved by the barber.	[redacted] Interview 1 @pp.5
Thu 12/02/2004	Regarding an e-mail dated 12/02/04, from [redacted] to Michael B. Steinbach, et. al., [redacted] advised that he put together a spreadsheet of every person who had interview and Detainee Unit wanted to get ahead of the game. Tue 02/15/2005 - Wed 04/27/2005	[redacted] does not go into the interview booth with the SA's, he usually sits in the observation booth and monitors the interview from there. During his time with the Bureau [redacted] has never seen anything negative with regard to Agent interviews of detainees at U.S. Naval Base Guantanamo Bay, Cuba.	[redacted] Interview 1 @pp.1
Wed 04/27/2005	As an Intelligence Analyst for the Bureau at U.S. Naval Base Guantanamo Bay, Cuba [redacted] assists the SSA's and the SA's by providing information the detainees.
