The information of that arrest was filtered to [redacted] one of the Achille-Lauro case agents, who was granted a TDY to Iraq to interview Abu Abbas. [redacted] stay in Iraq lasted for approximately 10 days. [redacted] never left the Baghdad International Airmort during his time in Iraq.
