Thu 07/17/2003 - Tue 09/02/2003	During [redacted] second tour at U.S. Naval Base Guantanamo Bay, Cuba he observed a detainee in an interrogation room sitting in a chair and shackled to the floor. The room was darkened except for a strobe light and [redacted] could hear that very loud music was being played in the room. [redacted] described the music type as "heavy metal." [redacted] could not recall the number of the detainee involved. Also there appeared to be nobody watching or monitoring this detainee while he was in this room. [redacted] did not know how long this detainee had been in the room prior to his observation.	[redacted] Interview Notes 02/02/05 @ 1, [redacted] Interview 1
Fri 07/18/2003 - Tue 09/02/2003	[redacted] described the interrogation tactic of loud music and strobe lights as "ordinary." However, he advised that he had never used this technique. [redacted] speculated that such a tactic might be useful to break somebody down. [redacted] initially said that he did not report this activity around the time that he observed it, but later he said that he did report it verbally to his unit commander soon after he observed it. [redacted] thought that his on-scene unit commander at that time was probably [redacted] did not consider what he saw to be abusive treatment of the detainee involved.
