NACAC Position Statements

The following statements serve as a historical record of the North American Council on Adoptable Children's position on a variety of issues related to child welfare. In some cases, the statements reflect the belief that a given law, policy, or practice is not in the best interest of children. Regardless of our position on a particular law, however, NACAC complies with existing law at all times, and will continue to do so.

Gay and Lesbian Adoptions and Foster Care — March 14, 1998 (amended April 14, 2002)

Children should not be denied a permanent family because of the sexual orientation of potential parents. Everyone with the potential to successfully parent a child in foster care or adoption is entitled to fair and equal consideration.
