AM, Jack M. Saville, WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

My platoon moved from Samarra to Balad on 2 January 2004. We began mission planning on a raid to capture enemy insurgents. During the planning phase, FOB Eagle received mortar fire. My platoon was part of the Quick Reaction Force that responded to the mortar attack and went to the point of origin of the fires identified by the Q-36 counterbattery radar. We later learned that the mortar attack killed CPT Eric Paliwoda, the commander of B Company, 4th Engineer Battalion. B/4th Engineers was the engineer company that was task organized under 1-8 Infantry. CPT Paliwoda was a popular commander, well liked, and a West Point classmate of my commander, CPT Matthew Cunningham.

After the QRF mission, we returned to FOB Attack to continue the planning phase of the upcoming raid. During a meeting at our living area at FOB Attack, CPT Cunningham gave a mission briefing to the platoon leaders and company executive officer. During the meeting, CPT Cunningham briefed that of approximately eighteen names on a target list that was distributed to all personnel in attendance, five individuals were identified as the most dangerous and subsequently "were not to come back alive." These targeted individuals' names were marked with an asterisk next to their names on the target list. After this mission brief, LT Nelson and I discussed CPT Cunningham's order. We were both concerned about the illegal order and we decided to clarify the order with CPT Cunningham. During the briefing, we approached CPT Cunningham to clarify what the order meant. I understood the order to mean that those with an asterisk next to their names on the list were to be killed, and asked CPT Cunningham if that was his intent. CPT Cunningham repeated his statement that these detainees "were not to come back alive." I perceived the order to be intentionally ambiguous, and that CPT Cunningham's intent was to "make it happen if you can."

Later, CPT Cunningham gave a second mission briefing that was attended by A Company's squad leaders, platoon sergeants, and platoon leaders. The mission was to conduct a raid in order to capture or kill insurgents responsible for the recent mortar attacks on Eagle FOB. The mission was to raid a number of houses, with LTC Sassaman in overall command, and CPT Cunningham responsible for Company A, 1-8 IN. My platoon and I were ultimately responsible for securing and searching twenty-five houses. The squad leaders, platoon leaders, and platoon sergeants of all platoons going on the raid were present during this briefing.

Although the order was not clear, CPT Cunningham knew our platoon's reputation as being the most aggressive. SFC Perkins was the 1st Platoon Sergeant since prior to deployment. SFC Perkins specifically asked the old battalion commander, LTC Battaglia, if he could remain in 1st Platoon as a squad leader prior to the deployment and then eventually become the platoon sergeant once the position was open. My platoon had a reputation as being very aggressive and successful in combat operations. I perceived CPT Cunningham's order and intent to be that he wanted us to kill the targets with an asterisk if we could find any plausible basis for doing so. CPT Cunningham did not expressly tell us to kill the insurgents at all costs, but did not emphasize that we should exercise restraint during the raid. I am unsure if that is how the other platoons perceived CPT Cunningham's order.

By this time, everyone was aware that there was a mortar attack on FOB Eagle and that there were casualties. SFC Perkins and SSG Werst were present during CPT Cunningham's group briefing. At that time, SSG Werst was aware that CPT Paliwoda was killed. SSG Werst still volunteered to go on the raid; someone higher than me (I am not sure who) approved SSG Werst's participation in the raid.

I attended this second mission briefing along with 1LT Nelson (the platoon leader for 2nd Platoon), SFC Perkins, and other leaders in the company. I went back to my platoon and briefed the mission order given by CPT Cunningham, including the order that certain detainees were not to come back alive. I also told my platoon that they should not do anything that they were not comfortable with, and to notify me directly if one of the Iraqis with an asterisk by his name was captured. I think the platoon knew what was being asked of them after hearing CPT Cunningham's briefing--that is, to ensure the high value targets did not "come back alive" and for us to "make it happen" if we could. SFC Perkins reiterated that if any of the targets were captured that he or I must be notified.

STATEMENT *(Continued)*

Later that evening, one of the Iraqis with an asterisk by their name on the target list was killed by SFC Perkins. I was with SSG Salinas' squad during the mission and generally in the vicinity of the EPW collection point. SFC Perkins' engagement occurred very early in the raid during the first house he cleared. SFC Perkins and SSG Ironeyes were alone in the room when the shooting occurred. I was not present during the shooting, but got the report over the radio. I never physically went to their location.

After the incident, SFC Perkins and SSG Ironeyes talked with me about the incident. SFC Perkins said that he and SSG Ironeyes were clearing a room; in the room was an older man, in his 50's or 60's, sitting with his back against several mattresses. SFC Perkins said they didn't perceive him as a threat because he was old. He said that as they moved towards the man and before they checked his identification, SSG Ironeyes yelled that the man was reaching for a weapon. SFC Perkins said he shot and killed him with two shots to the chest and one to the head. He said that after they searched the area, they found a weapon within the man's reach. After they identified him, they realized that they killed one of the targets identified as one to be killed (i.e., that detainee had an asterisk next to his name on CPT Cunningham's target list). I am unsure how they eventually positively identified him-through the informants that were with us on the raid, through identification on the man, or through family members with the assistance of an interpreter. SFC Perkins told me all of this immediately after the raid occurred. SFC Perkins and SSG Ironeyes were the only U.S. soldiers in the room with the detainee.

SFC Perkins and I are very good friends and I honestly believe SFC Perkins' kill was legitimate. He openly told me what happened after the raid, and I think he would have confided in me if he did something illegal. SFC Perkins never indicated to me that he did anything illegal, and I think he would have had he done so.

SSG Shane Werst, a squad leader attached to my platoon, shot and killed a detainee that CPT Cunningham identified as one to be killed (i.e., that detainee also had an asterisk next to his name on CPT Cunningham's target list). SSG Werst and his squad were attached to my platoon in preparation for and during Operation Ivy Blizzard. We conducted several missions in Balad prior to going to Samarra on Operation Ivy Blizzard in order to develop a working relationship.

Towards the end of the raid, I got a call over the radio that SSG Werst identified a detainee that was marked on the target list with an asterisk. I started moving towards his location; as I did so, Werst said over the radio, "There is about to be contact." I then heard shots fired. When I arrived, I entered the house and saw SSG Werst in the house. SSG Werst's adrenaline was rushing and he was excitable when he told me that he just shot and killed the Iraqi. Afterwards, I told SSG Werst not to be a dumb ass and say things like that over the radio. He acknowledged, and we did not discuss the incident any further either that evening or at any later date.

I think that the stage was somewhat set for SSG Werst. SSG Werst perceived it as an opportunity to kill those responsible for CPT Paliwoda's death and the command would support it. I don't think that SSG Werst would have pulled the trigger if not for CPT Cunningham's order. I have no knowledge of LTC Sassaman's involvement in mission planning or any orders given during this mission.

I, Jack M. Saville, WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

Most of my soldiers did carry Iraqi weapons. We usually had AK-47s and Iraqi pistols when we went out on patrol. It was logical for us to carry pistols because many missions required close-quarters firing and M-4s and M-16s were not conducive to these missions. Most NCOs carried Iraqi pistols. Eventually almost all of my platoon carried Iraqi pistols, but then we changed the policy so that only team leaders and above could carry them.

After the raid in Balad, we conducted an After Action Review the following day. We generally went over some of the tactical issues we had about the raid. In all, the raid was considered a great success-we captured 16 out of the 18 names on the target list and had two KIAs. Nothing remarkable came out of the AAR, as we only discussed the tactical aspects of how the raid was conducted and how we can improve for the next mission.

During the following months back at Fort Carson, SFC Perkins and I routinely talked about our pending cases. SFC Perkins was extremely worried after SSG Werst's story broke and he found out that PFC Stewart made a statement. SFC Perkins realized that he killed a detainee during that same raid and was concerned that his actions would appear to be identical to SSG Werst's situation. At no point has SFC Perkins indicated to me that he did anything illegal during that raid.

After SSG Werst's case broke, I met with CPT Cunningham and SFC Perkins in CPT Cunningham's office at Fort Carson. We discussed the raid again, and the order that CPT Cunningham gave. CPT Cunningham was worried because he knew about the order he gave and statements he made. We all went over the incident again and discussed what happened during the raid. CPT Cunningham was worried that SSG Werst was going to try to place blame on him for what happened, and we specifically talked to collectively recall the events that occurred.

I later talked to SFC Perkins about this conversation with CPT Cunningham and SSG Werst's case generally. We both agreed that we weren't going to do anything improper (i.e., lie, cover up, or obscure the truth) about what happened based on the situation he and I were currently in and the legal actions we were facing. We agreed that we'd just tell the facts about what happened.

I like and respect CPT Cunningham and feel that he was a great company commander. He supported me throughout my case. I understand why CPT Cunningham feels some responsibility for what happened in these cases; he subscribed, as we all did, to the notion that you go very aggressively against the enemy, and that is the way a unit is successful and achieves success. *JMS*

1. On order, enemy military and paramilitary forces are declared hostile and may be attacked subject to the following instructions:

- a. Positive Identification (PID) is required prior to engagement. PID is a reasonable certainty that the proposed target is a legitimate military target. If no PID, contact your next higher commander for decision.
- b. Do not engage anyone who has surrendered or is out of battle due to sickness or wounds.
- c. Do not target or strike any of the following except in self-defense to protect yourself, your unit, friendly forces, and designated persons or property under your control:
 - Civilians
 - Hospitals, mosques, churches, shrines, schools, museums, national monuments, and any other historical and cultural sites
- d. Do not fire into civilian populated areas or buildings unless the enemy is using them for military purposes or if necessary for your self-defense. Minimize collateral damage.
- e. Do not target enemy Infrastructure (public works, commercial communication facilities, dams), Lines of Communication (roads, highways, tunnels, bridges, railways) and Economic Objects (commercial storage facilities, pipelines) unless necessary for self-defense or if ordered by your commander. If you must fire on these objects to engage a hostile force, disable and disrupt but avoid destruction of these objects, if possible.

Front

2. The use of force, including deadly force, is authorized to protect the following:

- Yourself, your unit, and friendly forces
- Enemy Prisoners of War
- Civilians from crimes that are likely to cause death or serious bodily harm, such as murder or rape
- Designated civilians and/or property, such as personnel of the Red Cross/Crescent, UN, and US/UN supported organizations.

3. Treat all civilians and their property with respect and dignity. Do not seize civilian property, including vehicles, unless you have the permission of a company level commander and you give a receipt to the property's owner.

4. Detain civilians if they interfere with mission accomplishment or if required for self-defense.

5. CENTCOM General Order No. 1A remains in effect. Looting and the taking of war trophies are prohibited.

REMEMBER

- Attack enemy forces and military targets.
- Spare civilians and civilian property, if possible.
- Conduct yourself with dignity and honor.
- Comply with the Law of War. If you see a violation, report it.

These ROE will remain in effect until your commander orders you to transition to post-hostilities ROE.

ACHIEVEMENT #1

SSG Werst led his squad in conducting a dismounted raid on a suspected IED-maker on 05 DEC 03, moving house-to-house and maneuvering his soldiers to cordon off potential escape routes as the suspect fled the area. These actions enabled his soldiers to successfully detain the individual, search the surrounding area and led to the discovery of electronic parts and other potential bomb-making material within the adjacent home. His decisive actions exhibited sound tactical judgment and poise in a hostile urban environment.

ACHIEVEMENT #2

SSG Werst led his squad during OPERATION IVY BLIZZARD, attaching his soldiers to a Mechanized Infantry Company and distributing his demolition and personnel resources to accomplish myriad breaching and raid missions. SSG Werst's willingness and ability to manage the preparation and execution of these operations demonstrated superior tactical skill and superlative small-unit leadership, and was responsible for the safe explosive breach of more than 50 targets during a highly complex MOUT operation.

ACHIEVEMENT #3

Attached to 1A/1-8 IN during a nighttime raid on suspected terrorist and insurgent cells in the city of Balad, SSG Werst led his squad in breaching and raiding eight homes. His actions in and around the targets included entry under limited visibility conditions, cordon and search of dense urban terrain, and coordinating to get interpreters on site quickly to confirm verbal intelligence and suspects' identities, demonstrating an ability to manage multiple actions over a wide area and directly contributing to the safe capture of five suspects.

ACHIEVEMENT #4

SSG Werst, serving as a Sapper Squad Leader outside Balad, Iraq, led his soldiers in using local terrain to lay approximately 800m of triple-strand concertina wire to effectively enclose several non-compliant neighborhoods, allowing controlled entrance to only permitted personnel. These actions helped to deny the enemy the ability to emplace IEDs along 2.5 km of a heavily traveled supply route. SSG Werst's leadership in maneuvering his squad demonstrated superior tactical expertise and inspired his soldiers under adverse conditions.
