MEMORANDUM FOR Commander, TF 1-41 IN, APO AE 09303

CUBJECT: AR 15-6 Investigation for vehicle accident between a M1A1 and a civilian vehicle

On 20 April 2005, I was appointed as the AR 15-6 Investigating Officer (IO) for the circumstances surrounding a traffic accident between a M1A1 and a civilian vehicle in vicinity in Baghdad, Iraq on or about 20 APR 05. I have conducted a thorough investigation of the circumstances surrounding this incident. My observations, conclusions and recommendations are provided in the following format: facts, findings, and recommendations.

2. FACTS. On 20 April 2005 at approximately 2250 hours, a section of M1A1 tanks from 2<sup>nd</sup> platoon C/2-70 AR accompanied by a M2 from 1-156th conducting a right-seat ride was setting a blocking position on Route Huskies west of the Phone Card Road overpass IOT establish an outer cordon for a cordon and search to detain target UC0101. A Local National vehicle traveling from west to east on Route Huskies hit the M1A1 (C23). The M1A1 that was hit (C23) was set in the northernmost lane of eastbound RTE Huskies and the M2 was sixting in the southernmost lane of eastbound Huskies. Another M1A1 (C24) was east of the blocking position at the top of the overpass overlooking the immediate area to the east. The values had been set for approximately 1 to 2 minutes and had not yet set out any materials are ciated with a blocking position or TCP when the accident occurred. Other civilian vehicles, approximately 20-30, had been using the service road to bypass the blocking position. The wehicle in question appeared to begin a transition into the off-ramp when it swerved back into the left lane and proceeded to hit the M1A1 (C23). The M1A1 in over-watch (C24) did not see the vehicle approaching because it was facing east. As the crew was getting out of the tank to gather alerted the rest of the crew of a fast approaching blocking materials the Driver whicle. The next person to see the vehicle was the gunner who identified it in his mights but did not initially assess the vehicle as being a threat anticipating it to slow down as it and closer (the off ramp was approximately 300 meters from the blocking position). Once the vehicle had passed the off-ramp, it appeared to the crew that the vehicle was increasing speed instructed the crew to get down in the tank and brace for and the Tank Commander SSG an impact suspecting the vehicle to be a VBIED. The vehicle struck the tank's left number one with the majority of the impact striking on the driver's side. Inside the vehicle were 1 adult male, 2 adult females and three children. The driver, the male, was deceased when he was contracted from the vehicle by the tank crew and PSD. The crew from the M1A1 that was hit Hempted to render first aid to the remaining passengers. PSD/HHC 1-41 and HQ/C/2-70 assponded to the incident with the Company Commander, CPT directing the evacuation Fine casualties to a local national hospital located on Pizza Road.

3. FINDINGS. After discussing the events of 20 April 2005 with SPC (C23), SSG (C23), PFC (C23), SSG (C24) and SPC (C24) I have found that the tank section from 2<sup>nd</sup> platoon C/2-70 AR was not at fault. The Local National was primarily at fault in the incident. The tanks had their lights on and had set the blocking position to allow Local National drivers ample opportunity to see the tanks and either choose another route or slow down in time to stop. The soldiers were in the process of retrieving the materials required to properly establish their blocking position when the vehicle accident occurred. The Local National driver ignored the actions of other vehicles (Approximately 20-30) which had seen the tanks and taken the service road for the 1-2 minutes prior to the incident. No evidence of drugs or alcohol was found by the soldiers at the accident site, but that does not completely rule out their presence. The standard SOP for the platoon, when setting up a blocking position, is to first establish an overwatch ensuring that the vehicles are properly placed. Then the crews begin by putting out cones and warning signs (chem-lights at night), and finally the obstacle wire and tire spikes are placed approximately 100 meters from the cones and signs. Sufficient time did not exist for the emplacement of all these materials. I place no blame on any of the soldiers because there was nothing they could do to prevent the vehicle from striking their tank with the amount of time they had to prepare. It is unknown what the intent of the driver was but the accident was directly due to the high rate of speed of the vehicle and its unexplained inability to see or respond to the presence of the tank.

4. Recommendations: Based on my findings of the events that occurred on 20 April 2005, which resulted in the death of one Iraqi Civilian and the injury of six others, I have concluded that no soldier was at fault. The Tank Commander SSG made the correct and necessary call in order to prevent any injury to his soldiers. For future operations, I recommend that the SOP for blocking positions be reviewed. Some form of hasty high visibility material that can be satisfied in the first 1-2 minutes after setting in position could possibly give drivers in the immediate vicinity of a recently established blocking position or TCP additional time to recognize the presence of US forces and react. This will help prevent another incident such as this one from occurring. Additional training should be conducted specifically on the timely setting up blocking positions and TCP's to reduce the time delay between getting into position and the erecting of cautionary materials.
