1. Enclosed is the 15-6 investigation outlining the circumstances of the use of escalation of force that resulted in the shooting of a local national. As a result of the incident one Iraqi citizen was killed. The shooting occurred along ASR [REDACTED] vic the town of [REDACTED] at approximately 1900 hrs on 24 August 2005.

2. SUMMARY: 212005AUG2005 an IZ male entered the [REDACTED] Iraqi Police Station and reported that a U.S. Motorized Combat Patrol consisting of 4x M114s shot at his vehicle on RTE [REDACTED]. The IZ claims that the incident took place at approximately 1900 hrs. The IZ claimed that as a result of the shooting a passenger in the IZ's vehicle was struck and died due to the injury sustained by the bullet wound. The IZ stated that the patrol continued on its direction of travel to the east. A second IZ (IZ2) claimed to have witnessed the incident from the roadside where he and his son were fishing. IZ2 stated that as soon as the shot was fired the IZ (vehicle operator) pulled the blue mini van off of the road and came to a stop at which point all of the passengers in the van exited the van and fled the scene on foot. The only passenger that remained in the van, the IZ claims, is the IZ3 that was wounded from the gunshot. IZ2 stated that he approached the van to ensure that the vehicle operator was all right. Upon reaching the van, IZ2 recognized that IZ3 was injured and recommended that IZ seek assistance and report the incident to the Iraqi Army Soldiers posted at [REDACTED]. The Iraqi Soldiers Posted at the [REDACTED] informed the two IZs that they would have to report the incident to the Iraqi Police. The two IZs (IZ and IZ2) proceeded to the [REDACTED] Iraqi Police Station to report the incident, where an Iraqi Police official informed them that they would have to report the incident to the [REDACTED] Police Station because the incident occurred in the [REDACTED] area of responsibility. Once at the [REDACTED] Police Station the Iraqi Police notified the Warrior element of the IZ's allegations. Warrior contacted [REDACTED] TOC to inquire if there were any reports of the use of escalation of force requiring warning shots to be fired. The Task Force TOC acknowledged that 3/A/2-70 had in fact fired a warning shot at approximately the time period, which the IZ and IZ2 claim that the incident occurred. The Task Force Executive Officer was dispatched to the Iraqi Police Station to conduct interviews and receive sworn statements from the two IZs and the crew of A32.

3. Relevant to the incident is that as the patrol was traveling east along ASR [REDACTED] and all of the civilian traffic (east and west bound) either pulled off onto the shoulder of the road or were in the process of pulling off onto the shoulder of the road to yield the right of way to the coalition combat patrol (this was verified during the questioning of IZ2). The only vehicle that was not yielding the right of way was the blue mini van. The crewmembers of A32 all perceived the blue mini van as traveling at a higher rate of speed in the center of the road and not showing any signs of slowing or yielding the right of way. Major [REDACTED] asked the IZ why he remained in the center of the road and failed to show signs of yielding the right of way or pulling off of the road, the IZ responded by saying that he was in a hurry to get to [REDACTED]. The IZ acknowledges seeing the coalition convoy to his direct front along ASR [REDACTED].

#### 4. FACTS:

- a) How many local nationals were injured in the incident? One Iraqi citizen was involved in the incident.
- 1x KIA (Male)

- b) What is the description of the vehicle(s) involved in the incident? Vehicle involved in the incident is blue mini van.

- c) When and where was the first warning shot(s) fired? No warning shots were fired.

- d) When and where was the disabling shot(s) fired?

- a. The disabling shot (1x) was fired with an approximate distance of 40 to 60 meters between the van and the lead vehicle of the combat patrol. The vehicle commander directed the disabling shot.
- b. 1x-disabling shot was fired (aimed at the mini vans front grill).

- e) What means has the unit used to educate there assigned soldiers on the use of escalated force (IAW CPFLC ROE ) and the initiation of warning, disabling and lethal fires?

- a. The unit received briefings and conducted Forward Operating Base security missions at the National Training Center as part of the MRE (OCT/NOV 04).
- b. The patrol, as part of the pre mission brief conducted a historical vignette discussing a possible scenario that could be encountered and the actions that could be taken to mitigate a possible ROE violation.

- f) Did the Soldier(s) involved properly escalate the use of force? Yes.

- a. SPC [REDACTED] used hand and arm signals initially to provide warning to the on coming vehicle.
- b. SPC [REDACTED] raised his rifle (at the ready) in an attempt to have the vehicle slow and pull off of the road well before being given the command to fire disabling shots.

- c. Warning shots were not utilized due to the distance between the two vehicles. The decision was made to fire disabling shots.
- g) Did the patrol have Positive Identification (were they reasonably certain that the local national was a legitimate military target) before engaging?
  - a. No. The patrol was not attempting to shoot at the individual, which is claimed to have died due to injuries inflicted by the coalition patrol.
  - b. The gunner fired an aimed disabling shot at the grill of the oncoming vehicle from a moving vehicle to an oncoming vehicle.
  - c. Was deadly force authorized? Yes. The crew felt threatened by the vehicle remaining in the center of the road driving directly towards them and not making any attempt to slow or signs of pulling off of the road.
  - d. Were there any Law of War violations? No.

~~e. Are there any operational lessons that could be captured and disseminated? Yes. Soldiers, as in this case must be taught that when firing a weapon from a moving platform towards another moving platform and both platforms are moving towards each other the gunner must aim lower to the target. The speed and distance are a huge factor and when a gunner fires his weapon at what at the oncoming target the strike of the round will be different than what he has been taught from firing at a stationary target from a stationary position.~~

#### 4. FINDINGS.

- a) All personnel involved in the incident acted in accordance with the "CFLCC Rules For Use Of Force" Card (as of 011800ZNOV03). The soldiers believed that were acting in self-defence, in defence of their unit, and that their acts would prevent the destruction of both military and civilian property.
- b) All soldiers (SPC [redacted]) acted in accordance with the CFLCC guidance in the use "Escalation of Force" with direct fire. All shots were aimed (warning shots in front of the individual; lethal shots were aimed / focused at the fleeing individual); the cease-fire order was given once the individual was observed falling to the ground.
- c) The crew of A32 did not feel threatened until the vehicle was approximately 150 meters away.
- d) The operator of the vehicle (A32) PFC [redacted], in an attempt to provide more time in allowing the situation to develop slowed his vehicle speed from approximately 45 mph to 30 mph.

- e) The use of hand and arm signals were applied in an attempt to having the vehicle pull over onto the shoulder of the road and yield the right of way.
- f) SPC [REDACTED] raised his rifle to the ready and held it in that position for several moments before being given the command to fire a disabling shot.
- g) SPC [REDACTED] fired one disabling shot aimed at the front grill of the vehicle, after which the vehicle operator pulled off of the road to the shoulder of the road.
- h) The disabling shot entered the front windshield of the vehicle on the passenger side.
- i) The patrol did not learn of having possibly injured a local national due to the disabling shot being fired until approximately 90 minutes of the disabling shot being fired.
- j) There is a strong possibility that the local national was unintentionally shot by the coalition patrol and died from the injury sustained due to the gunshot.
- k) All attempts in contacting the local national's family have been unsuccessful.
- l) The vehicle operator claims that he has no knowledge of who the local national was. The vehicle operator stated that he was just giving the individual a ride to [REDACTED].

#### 5. RECOMMENDATION.

- a) Coach, teach and mentor our wheel vehicle gunners on the dynamics of where we are aiming the weapon as to moving platforms are approaching each other is not where the round(s) will strike. The gunner(s) must be instructed on where to aim in allowing the round to strike its intended target.

# 31A/2-70 AR ESCALATION OF FORCE

## SEQUENCE OF EVENTS

\*21 AUG 05 O/A 1500, 3/A/2-70 patrols east on ASR  
[REDACTED] ( [REDACTED] ). Patrols 4 x M114s.

• The crew of A32 (lead vehicle of the patrol) encounters a civilian blue minivan approaching the patrol from the west, traveling in the center of the road towards the patrol at 150 meters.

\*The gunner of A32, recognizes the oncoming vehicle in the center of the road traveling at a high rate of speed. He attempts to slow the vehicle and have it yield by utilizing hand and arm signals. The crew observes no change in the vehicles speed or its position in the center of the road.

•At approximately 100 meters from the oncoming minivan the gunman for A32 raises his M4 (pointing the barrel away towards the north) in an attempt to cause the operator of the van slow and pull off the road. The crew observes no change in vehicle speed or position.

\* The driver of A32, recognizing that the minivan is not slowing, and concerned of a possible VBIED attack, applies his brakes to reduce his rate of speed.

At approximately 30 to 50 meters from the oncoming mine, the gunner of A32 fires one aimed disabling shot at the grill.

\*The mini van immediately slows and pulls off the road. The gunner is unsure of where his disabling round impacts. The crew and follow-on crews observe no unusual activity. The patrol continues to Camp [REDACTED]

3<sup>rd</sup> PLT, A Co was driving in a convoy back to [REDACTED] moving east on [REDACTED]. A 32 was on the lead with PFC [REDACTED] in the gunner seat, and myself in the TC seat. Approx. 1 km away from the [REDACTED] I.A. checkpoint, we came out of a left turn when we saw a blue van moving west. There were shops on the north side of the road, and vehicles that pulled to the right side of the road as we passed, and a couple of vehicles moving east in front of the convoy about 300 mt. The van was about 250 mt, moving at a good speed (approx 40 ml/h). My HMMWV was driving at 45 ml/h. The van continued to move without pulling over to the side. Spec. [REDACTED] waved his hands signaling to the van to pull to the side when the van did not move, Spec. [REDACTED] stood up with a rifle at the ready when we were approx. 100 mt away. The van continued to move without pulling over. When the vehicle was about 40 mt away, Spec. [REDACTED] fired a warning shot. At that time, the van pulled halfway to the side of the road and continued to move. My driver slowed down and moved a little to the right. As we passed the van, the passengers to the front looked fine. The convoy continued to move to [REDACTED] as everything seemed fine.

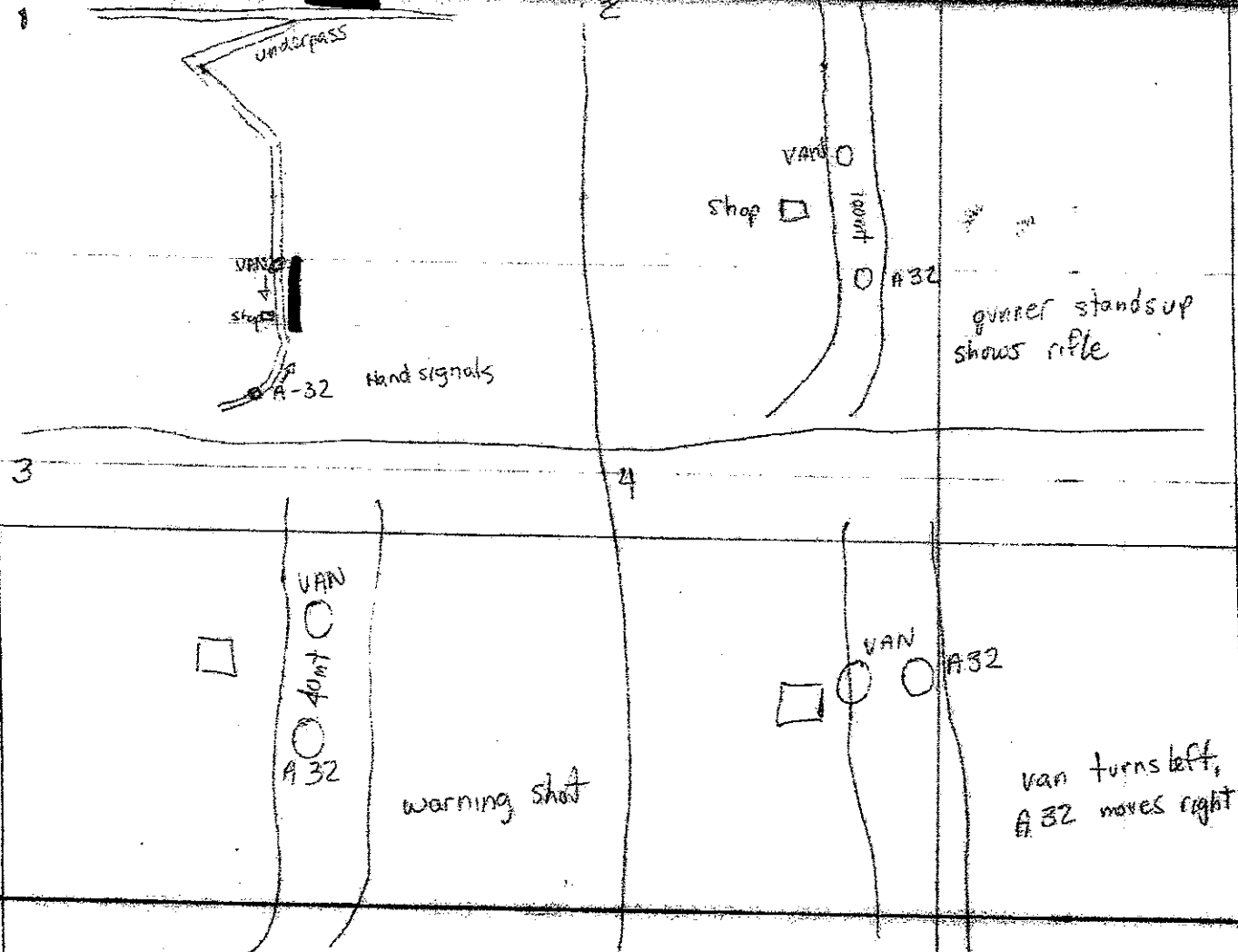

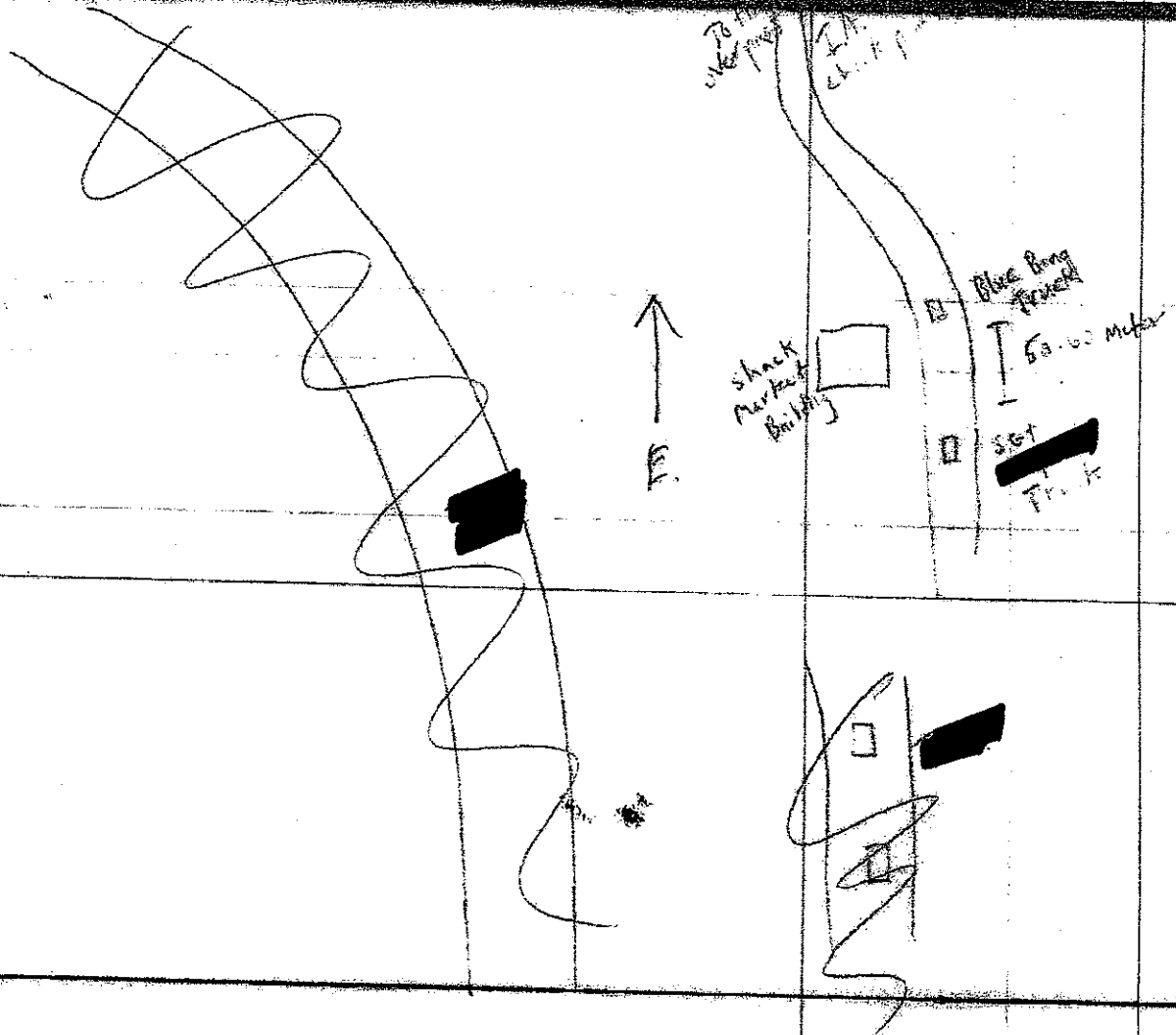
