SUBJECT: Findings 15-6 use of deadly force 2-70th AO

1. On 30 September members of A Co 1-41 INF (TF 2-70) used the proper escalation of force measures resulting in the death of a local national. The squad was conducting a mounted patrol when at approximately 1900 hours, in dusk conditions allowing visual recognition up to 300 meters; the squad encountered a suspicious vehicle. One M2 Bradley stopped approximately 200 meters behind the sedan and the second vehicle stopped approximately 50 meters in front of the suspect vehicle. (see Exhibit K Diagram A)
2. The following dismounts were involved in the escalation of force: SSG [REDACTED], SGT [REDACTED], PFC [REDACTED], PVT [REDACTED] and their interpreter [REDACTED]. The patrol's escalation of force detailed in Exhibits D, E, F, G, H, and I corroborate the following: There was enough ambient light to see without night vision enhancement beyond 300 meters.
3. The escalation of force include in the following order: voice commands, sure-fire flashes, 3 warning shots away from the vehicle, several vehicle disabling shots, and finally PVT [REDACTED], fearing for his life, and hearing SSG [REDACTED] command to "take the occupants down" shot into the vehicle. All Soldiers then raced for cover behind the M2 each one expecting the vehicle to be a VBIED and explode. The vehicle was within 25 meters and continuing forward toward the dismounted Soldiers when they engaged with deadly force.
4. The Soldiers did have positive ID against a legitimate target demonstrating hostile intent, therefore deadly force was authorized.
5. A Co 1-41 and Battalion S-3 (Major [REDACTED]) reported that the technique of "locking down" a vehicle from front and rear to establish overwhelming fire superiority has been a standard operating procedure for several months without incident prior to this event.
6. The actions taken by the local nationals resulted in the shooting. There were no mitigating circumstances which Alpha Company 1-41 INF should change which would have altered the outcome.

SUBJECT: Recommendations for investigation of use of deadly force 2-70th AO

1. On 30 September members of A Co 1-41 INF (TF 2-70) used the proper escalation of force measures resulting in the death of a local national. The squad was conducting a mounted patrol when at approximately 1900 hours, in dusk conditions allowing visual recognition up to 300 meters; the squad encountered a suspicious vehicle. One M2 Bradley stopped approximately 200 meters behind the sedan and the second vehicle stopped approximately 50 meters in front of the suspect vehicle.

2. The following recommendations are made:

- a. The current SOP of locking down suspect vehicles on the side of the road uses the principles of surprise, speed, and overwhelming combat power. This maximizes Soldiers safety and ensures any enemy force remains passive and on the defensive reaction mode.
- b. 2-70th has created an SOP that allows US Soldiers to dictate when and where a potential enemy contact will occur. This enhances US security and I recommend no changes to the current SOP.
- c. I recommend no action be taken against the leadership of Alpha Company, or any of the members of the B section, 1st Squad.

SUBJECT: Appointment as Investigating Officer

1. Pursuant to AR 15-6, paragraph 2-1, you are hereby appointed as an investigating officer to investigate the use of deadly force by 2nd Platoon, A Company, 1st Battalion, 41st Infantry Regiment that allegedly caused the death of a local national.

2. In your investigation, use procedures under AR 15-6, Chapter 4, for an informal board of officers. All witness statements will be sworn, and you will follow the procedures in AR 15-6, paragraph 3-7e for Privacy Act statements. If the person you are interviewing states that he/she does not know anything about the allegations, prepare a sworn statement to that effect for the witness to sign. If, in the course of your investigation, you suspect a soldier has committed an offense under the UCMJ, you must advise and read him/her their rights under the UCMJ, Article 31, or the Fifth Amendment, as appropriate, prior to conducting any interview.

3. In your investigation you need to answer the following questions:

- a. What was the sequence of events that led up to the incident?
- b. Did the soldiers involved properly escalate the use of force?
- c. Did the patrol have Positive Identification (were they reasonably certain that they were taking action against a legitimate military target) before engaging?
- d. Was deadly force authorized?
- e. Was the use of deadly force (warning shots, disabling shots, etc.) appropriate for the situation?
- f. Were there any Law of War violations?
- g. Are there any operational lessons that should be captured and disseminated?
- h. Were there any other contributing factors that, if changed, could have altered the outcome?

LINE 6: SUMMARY: 2/A/1-41IN, TF 2-70AR, while conducting hasty TCPs, conducted escalation of force against a local national car (white Toyota Corona) vicinity [REDACTED]. The vehicle matched the [REDACTED] list. As the dismounts approached, the vehicle began backing away from the dismounted Soldiers, and then began driving towards the dismounts. The interpreter yelled at the driver to stop and get out of the car. The vehicle continued toward the dismounts. When the vehicle was approximately 30m away from the dismounts, SGT [REDACTED] (dismounted) fired 1 x warning shot (M4). The vehicle continued toward the dismounts and SGT [REDACTED] fired 2 x disabling shots (M4) into the grill from his Bradley as the vehicle closed to within 25m. The vehicle continued and at approximately 20m away PVT [REDACTED] fired 1 x shot (M4) into the vehicle's passenger compartment, killing the passenger. The driver then pushed the passenger out of the car, turned the car around, and started moving south. The second Bradley then blocked the vehicle from retreating. The vehicle and driver were searched with no contraband found. The driver stated he is a taxi driver and did not know the passenger. A follow up CIR will be submitted upon completion of a commander inquiry. The Brigade Commander has directed an AR15-6 has been initiated.

On 30 SEPTEMBER 05 AT 1900 HOURS MYSELF, BRAVO SECTION AND 1ST SQUAD STARTED ON OUR EVENING TOP'S. WITH A23 LEAVING SOUTH IN [REDACTED] TO WEST [REDACTED] TO SOUTH [REDACTED] WHERE WE WERE TO START OUR MISSION. AT [REDACTED] WE STOPPED OUR FIRST VEHICLE, A WHITE 4 DOOR TOYOTA SEDAN. A 23 STOPPED FURTHER DOWN ON [REDACTED] ABOUT 200 METERS AND I STOPPED MY TRUCK ABOUT 50 METERS TO THE FRONT (NORTH) OF THE VEHICLE. MY DISMOUNTS FROM 1ST SQUAD INCLUDES SGT [REDACTED], PFC [REDACTED], RT [REDACTED] AND [REDACTED] THE INTERPRETER. WITH THE DISMOUNTS OFF TO THE LEFT AND RIGHT SIDES OF THE ROAD. [REDACTED] WAS SCREAMING FOR THE OCCUPANTS OF THE VEHICLE TO GET OUT OF THE VEHICLE BEGAN TO BACK UP, SGT [REDACTED] FIRED A WARNING SHOT INTO A DIRT BIRM. THE VEHICLE THEN PULLED FORWARD TOWARD THE

DISMOUNTS AND SGT [REDACTED] MY GUNNER SHOT THE NEXT 2 SHOTS INTO THE SKILL OF THE VEHICLE. THE VEHICLE CONTINUED TO MOVE FORWARD, BY THIS TIME THE VEHICLE WAS NOW ABOUT 25 METERS FROM THE DISMOUNTS. FEARING FOR THE LIVES OF MY MEN I TOLD THEM TO TAKE THE OCCUPANTS DOWN. PUT [REDACTED] TOOK THE SHOT AND KILLED THE PASSENGER. THE DRIVER REACHED OVER THE PASSENGER AND OPEN HIS DOOR AND THREW HIM OUT OF THE VEHICLE. THE DRIVER CONTINUED TO MOVE TOWARD THE DISMOUNTS. I TOLD THEM TO GET BACK BEHIND THE BRADLEY THIS COULD BE A TRAP. I ALSO BACKED MY VEHICLE UP OUT OF THE WAY THE DRIVER MADE A U-TURN IN THE STREET CHANGING HIS DIRECTION

SOUTHWARD. I SAW BOTH HIS HANDS THEN COME OUT OF THE VEHICLE, I DISMOUNTED MY BRADLEY AND PULLED HIM OUT AND ONTO THE GROUND. I SEARCHED THE DETAINEE FOR WEAPONS, HE HAD NOTHING ON HIM EXCEPT FOR A PACK OF CIGARETTES, A FEW DINAR AND A I.D. MY TEAM OF DISMOUNTS WITH [REDACTED] RAN UP TO ME TO SEARCH THE CAR. NOTHING WAS FOUND IN THE VEHICLE THAT WAS INCriminating. USING DADY I ASKED HIM

WHY DIDN'T HE STOP AND GET OUT. HE SAYS THAT HIS BROTHER, THE PASSENGER TOLD HIM NOT TO STOP, THE AMERICANS WOULDN'T STOP THEM. O.K. I SAY SO WHAT IS YOUR BROTHER'S NAME, HE THINKS, NOTHING. I PULL [REDACTED] ASIDE, [REDACTED] CALLS ME FOR SURE SO I FOLLOW

THEM IN UP TO THIS POINT. [REDACTED] ADVISES ME TO TAKE A STATEMENT FROM THE DETAINEE ABOUT WHAT HE WAS DOING. [REDACTED] AND I ASK HIM AGAIN WHAT IS YOUR BROTHER'S NAME? HE REPLIES, "I DON'T KNOW I AM A TAXI DRIVER AND I DON'T KNOW HIM." AT THIS POINT WE REALIZE THAT HE WOULD CONTINUE TO LIE ABOUT HIS INVOLVEMENT. [REDACTED] ADVISE ME TO BAG THE BODY AND DETAINEE THE DRIVER AND BRING THE CAR BACK TO THE

TAC ONCE WE LOOKED OVER THE DETAINEE FOR ANY WOUNDS, BECAUSE HE HAD A LARGE BLOOD STAIN ON HIS DRESS WE LOADED HIM IN MY TRUCK WITH SGT [REDACTED] TEAM AND VEHICLE. AT THIS POINT [REDACTED] ALSO ADVISED US TO LINK UP WITH [REDACTED] TO HAND OFF THE BODY. AT THE TAC MY A23 TRUCK HAD MAINTENANCE PROBLEMS.
