SUBJECT: AR 15-6 Informal Investigation Concerning the Shooting and Death of a Local National (LN)

1. On 18 October 2005, I was appointed as the AR 15-6 Investigating Officer (IO) for the events surrounding the shooting of a LN which resulted in the death of one LN. I have conducted a thorough investigation of the circumstances surrounding this incident. My observations, conclusions are provided in the following format: facts, findings, and recommendations.

2. FACTS.

a. The following paragraph is a summation of the sequence of events as stated by CPL [REDACTED] in Enclosures E, F and G. On 16 October 2005, [REDACTED] an off duty Iraqi Soldier with 1st BN, 1st BDE, 6th IAD was traveling on RTE [REDACTED] in the [REDACTED] area dinner with his fiancé, traveling in a white 1994 Toyota Corolla. The incident occurred at approximately 161750OCT05 (see enclosure A, Commander's Incident Report). CPI [REDACTED] was on pass from the IA following 18 days of straight duty. He was accompanied by his fiancé, [REDACTED]. CPL [REDACTED] was parked outside of the [REDACTED] Restaurant on [REDACTED] St (RTE [REDACTED]) in [REDACTED]. After purchasing food to go, CPL [REDACTED] returned to his car, initiating his directional lights. As he began to pull forward onto the road, a single shot was fired. A single round entered into the trunk of the car on the passenger side. The round continued through the trunk, entering into the passenger compartment of the vehicle, passing through the rear seat, fragmenting as it entered the front passenger side seat. The round entered the lower left portion of [REDACTED] torso, passing through her body, striking the windshield before stopping. Immediately after the shot, CPL [REDACTED] stated two HMMWVs passed him, shining a bright light into the car as they did so. The only detail he could identify on the vehicles was two traffic cones on the back of the vehicle. The vehicles made no attempt to stop. After the HMMWVs were 50 meters further down the road, CPL [REDACTED] began moving again to take the victim to the hospital. His route kept him in sight of the HMMWVs until they turned into the Gate to FOB [REDACTED]. CPL [REDACTED] then proceeded to [REDACTED] Hospital where [REDACTED] was pronounced dead at 161830OCT05.

b. Throughout the questioning and review of the sworn statement, it is clear CPL [REDACTED] through working with the US Forces, had a clear understanding of US vehicles, ROE, and procedures for escalation of force. At no time did CPL [REDACTED] receive any indication of an American's intent to fire. There were no identified audio or visual warnings prior to the shot being fired.

c. CPL [REDACTED] brought the car to FOB [REDACTED], where it was brought to the attention of B TRP, 1-71 CAV, who are tasked as the 1st BN, 1st BDE, 6th IAD MiTT Advisors. 1LT [REDACTED] was the officer on site, taking photographs and initial statements. In the process of taking statements and photos (Enclosure B), an Iraqi Soldier found the fragmented front half of what appears to be a US .50 Caliber Round. (Enclosure C). The initial entry point of the round and trajectory as shown in Enclosure B clearly indicates a direct fired shot from an elevated position.

d. Upon initial report of the incident, the [REDACTED] began preliminary inquiries, identifying and contacting units operating and travelling in vicinity of FOB [REDACTED]. The Investigating Officer contacted all identified elements and solicited Sworn Statements in reference to movements in vicinity of the incident. No identified unit reported any discharges of weapons, either intentional or negligent on 16 OCT. (Enclosures J-W)

e. On 22 OCT the Investigating Officer along with a Category I OSD Level interpreter, questioned restaurant owners and employees along [REDACTED], which consists of a collection of open air establishments. No one interviewed was aware of any incident occurring on [REDACTED] St on the 16th of OCT or any other time since the arrival of coalition forces. (Enclosure H)

3. FINDINGS. Upon review of duty logs and sworn statements by units operating in the [REDACTED] area on 16 OCT 05, I find the incident did not involve a 1-71 CAV Soldier. I do not believe that any 1/10 Patrol was involved, based on sworn statements by 1-87 IN, and that the known 1-87 IN patrols did not mount .50 Caliber weapons. Based on the round fragment found in the vehicle and the testimony of CPL [REDACTED], it is conclusive that the death of [REDACTED] was caused by a US weapon system, yet the multitude of units passing through AO Cobra without coordination on a daily basis makes it impossible to conclusively determine the responsible party at this time.

4. RECOMMENDATIONS:

a. I recommend that this information and inquiry be passed to the commanders of 1-87 IN, 42nd MP BDE, 2nd BN 5th SFG, and the MNSTCI Public Order Division SpTT, for consideration if they feel they need to conduct their own Commander's Inquiry.

b. Recommend that reparations in the form of a condolence claim, be considered for the family of [REDACTED] through the 1/10 BCT SJA.





[REDACTED]: Yes, the locals call it [REDACTED] Street. The one by [REDACTED] the road by camp [REDACTED]

LT: If we got a map here do you think you show us....

[REDACTED] yes

LT: We are going to the map. What direction was traveling on the road that he is pointing out to us? OK the answer to that question was the he was driving toward Camp [REDACTED] (North to South). OK, the next questions are going to be on the military vehicles that you saw. OK...first question is what kind of vehicles were they?

[REDACTED] Hummer, two

LT: So you saw two HMMWVs. OK, what color?

[REDACTED]: It was kind of dark but it was a kind of tan (which sounded like he said "tint") color.

LT: Tint? Oh, a tan color. A tan colored HMMWV. OK we will stop....OK one more question, what time was this-the exact time.

[REDACTED] The exact time to be honest with you was five five five....

LT: OK, so five-fifty five in the evening...

[REDACTED]: Yes, it was at the break fasting time and he was taking his wife to break fast together since he had spent eighteen days here (at work) and that was his first vacation day... (not clear for about 6 seconds)

LT: Next question with the vehicles, how many did you see?

[REDACTED] Two HMMWVs

LT: Just two?

[REDACTED] yes

LT: Where there any big trucks with the HMMWVs?

[REDACTED] Only two HMMWVs

LT: Any forklift, or barriers....?

LT: Next question, could you identify the type of uniform the soldiers were wearing if you could see the gunner?

████████ He was in the turret and he put the light and it was not easy to concentrate on these things with my wife....

LT: At this time I am showing him █████ and █████ but apparently he was blinded and could not make out the difference. Final question with the uniforms, one last time, anything that sticks out in your mind...?

████████ My wife was screaming and the Hammers with the light in my face I could recognize the cones and then they entered into Camp █████ Like I waited for them to pass for like 50 meters to start to evacuate my wife to the hospital to start to drive the vehicle to the hospital. There was no U-turn on the road we both were taking so I had to drive behind them afterwards and so then I saw that they went to █████ then I made the turn to the hospital.

LT: So you are saying that you physically saw the convoy enter Camp █████

████████ Because I could not have a U-turn to go to the hospital so I had to drive behind them so I drove to with them all the way up then they made the Turn into █████ and I U-turned it back to the hospital.

LT: So, and this happened almost immediately after the shooting at 17:55 in the evening, about that time you are saying that they went into Camp █████

████████ Yes, and they didn't even stop to see what was going on.

LT: Next question, right before the shot rang out what was the disposition of the vehicle...where you in the center of the road....?

████████ You know the road he is talking about is a three lane road, one lane was busy with people parking at the restaurant eating food at the restaurant and he was like the second lane by the first vehicles parking. There were two more lanes they were like three or four other vehicles to be traffic. He was in the middle lane.

LT: When-did you pull away from the restaurant and start driving?

████████ I took the same lane I was in because it was already empty, and he was planning to take the next road after the restaurant which would lead him directly to his family house, there was no reason for me to pull away from the restaurant I took the same lane planning to go but...

LT: When you started driving, and you noticed the vehicles behind you did you any lasers, hear any sirens, did you hear any loud speakers?

██████████ The round, the first thing was the round then there was the light and with the light there was the horn.

LT: OK, so your saying that when you were driving there was no warning or anything, no lasers no sirens?

██████████ No, but after the round there was the light and the horn.

LT: So did the vehicles, did the HMMWVs did they just suddenly appear...just show up and then the shot was fired? Is that what happened?

██████████ Yes....

██████████: OK, could repeat the question because I think I got it wrong.

LT: OK, the question was did the HMMWVs give any advance warning that they were there?

██████████: There was no one in the street or road at that time and I was checking that was nobody till I moved then I heard the shot.

LT: Can you describe to me the disposition of the vehicle when the bullet impacted? Where was the HMMWVs where was your car on the road?

██████████ was like parked....(the Arabic is louder than the translation here unfortunately) distance between my car and their vehicle was like the distance between here and the other wall.

LT: So about 50 meters behind you?

██████████ closer than that

LT: 20 meters? You are saying 20 meters....

██████████ yes

LT: Could you briefly describe what happened when the bullet went through?

██████████: There was kind of like a smoke and the stuffing inside the seat were all over the vehicle. While I stopped and looked I didn't think that they shot...I thought there was something wrong with the vehicle. I hear the shot then I heard my wife screaming. I know

what the rules of an engagement and I know how to act when I am downtown-not to look hostile to the patrol is is not like I would just drive by them not noticing that they are around or being behind me.

LT: Alright , next question, I know this might be a little bit painful but once your wife was hit, what did you do and tell me what the convoy did?

[REDACTED]: She was screaming...I was surprised...like hey what's up? I saw her side was kind of open like (unable to hear the English for about 3 seconds) so I pulled her to my chest and I was like putting my hand on the wound. She was calling my name and asking me to help me like I am going to die I am going to die. So I told her, OK let us wait until they pass, so I started driving and when I waited for them to move another hundred meters and then I started driving.

LT: OK, so how far did drive down the road before you saw them turn?

[REDACTED] I didn't drive I was stopping and looking at them moving until they went to [REDACTED] then I started driving again.

LT: OK, so when you said they went into [REDACTED], was this the main gate of [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] The gate by the bridge, the first gate of [REDACTED], he does not know if it is the main gate or not. It is the one before the bridge.

LT: Could you describe the gate one more time?

[REDACTED] Black, slide, big gate. The gate guard of [REDACTED] the ING they were worried about me because I was driving kind of crazy, so fast so I could get her to the hospital as soon as possible. And they were like wait then I made the turn and said I need to go the hospital and they said OK.

LT: How far away were you from the gate?

[REDACTED] It is like the distance between here and the front gate (the room we were in and the Main gate of FOB [REDACTED])

LT: So probably like three or four hundred meters up the road.....?

[REDACTED] No, like one hundred one fifty

LT: So, 150 to 200 meters away. Alright, the convoy, once they fired did they stop or anything like that?

[REDACTED] They were driving-they did not even hit the brakes.

LT: What was the time that the convoy entered Camp [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] Just like I told you, 1755 hrs and 1800 that was the whole thing. We were doing the break fast thing and that is when the time happened.

LT: Final question was, what hospital did you go to?

[REDACTED] Hospital

[REDACTED] No, nothing, no IPs nothing

LT: There were no big army trucks....?

[REDACTED] Only two HMMWVs

LT: When your vehicle was shot, you were traveling down the road towards Camp [REDACTED]..is that correct? (from North to South)
