1. On 26 January 2005, I was appointed as the AR 15-6 Investigating Officer (IO) concerning the 25 January 2005 Accident on ASR Jacksonville resulting in the death of an Iraqi child. I have conducted a thorough investigation of the circumstances surrounding this accident. My observations, conclusions, and recommendations are provided in the following format: Facts, Findings, and Recommendations.

2. FACTS:

a. Unit: 308th Transportation Company, 70th Transportation Company, 354th Transportation Battalion and B Battery 1-178th FA Battalion Convoy Escort Platforms (CEP), see Exhibit C and D.

- e. Truck 40 was in the middle of the convoy, see Exhibits A, B, E, F, G, and I.
- f. Weather Conditions: The weather was normal for this time of year, cool, no precipitation, and visibility was clear, see Exhibits A and B.
- g. Road Conditions: Road conditions were normal for Iraq; the road was a two lane black top road with minimal obstructions to view, see Exhibits, A, B, E, F, G, and I.
- h. The Convoy left FOB Duke at 151000CJAN05, traveling south along ASR Boston, Jacksonville, and Miami towards An Najaf and Ad Dahwiniya and Convoy Support Center Scania, see Exhibit G.
- i. The convoy had adequate rest before starting their mission that day, see Exhibits E, F, G, and I.
- j. Though there was no enemy contact before the incident, see, Exhibits E, F, G, and I; the convoy was approaching a built up Area, An Najaf, which is in Iraq, a combat zone, and has been a hot spot for enemy activity during Operation Iraqi Freedom.
- k. There were numerous Iraqi civilians along the route, see Exhibits, A, B, E, F, G, and I.
- l. One Iraqi male child was killed when his head made contact with trailer 39 being towed by truck 40.

3. FINDINGS.

a. Based on the facts drawn from the statements taken from the [REDACTED] (Convoy Commander), [REDACTED] (CEP Commander), [REDACTED] the Driver of Vehicle 40, [REDACTED] (the Assistant Driver of Vehicle 40), and the video tape shot by [REDACTED] I find that this incident was due to no fault of anyone on the convoy, see Exhibits A, B, E, F, G, and I.

b. Exhibits A and B clearly show that visibility was good, the road was adequate and not congested, to the point where truck 40 was clearly well on the road, the convoy was not speeding as it was slowing down for a turn, and that children were running between the trucks and lining up on the sides of the road waving and begging for food.

c. Exhibits A and B also clearly show that the child in question was standing on the side of the road and watching the convoy pass by and that truck 40 was in the middle of the convoy. As truck 40 drove by the child a cloud of dust was kicked up and the child either leaned into the truck trying to look back to see the next truck coming or the child tried to walk or run across the street. As the child did so he was struck by the right rear of trailer 39 and was thrust backwards face down lying towards the direction of travel.

d. Exhibits A, E, G, H, and I show that [REDACTED] radioed the convoy that a child was struck by the convoy and not to stop as the child appeared to be dead and he conducted a mental risk assessment and determined that the security of the convoy would be in question if they stopped for what he knew to be a dead child. The on-coming convoy did not stop either [REDACTED] and EMT in his civilian career, passed the child behind [REDACTED] and made the same determination based on the amount of blood pooled by the Iraqi child's head.

4. RECOMMENDATIONS.

a. Based on all the evidence I have seen and my investigation, I do not recommend pecuniary action.

b. Based on all the evidence I have seen and my investigation, I do not recommend disciplinary action.

c. Based on all the evidence I have seen and my investigation, I suggest the following corrective actions:

(1) MNF-I in conjunction with the Iraqi Government post signs along major convoy routes near built up areas warning Iraqis to stay clear of convoys and that an Information Operations Campaign begin in Iraqi news papers, and radio and television broadcasts to do the same, see findings 3 b and c.

(2) CFLCC publish guidance to all units that as METTT-C dictates units in congested/built up areas avoid passing each other if possible and that convoys stay as close to the center of roads when approaching large crowds of children. I understand that in many cases this is not only impractical but un-safe to US soldiers, see findings 3 b and c.

(3) 143rd TRANSCOM re-enforce CFLCC guidance with appropriate TTPs for its truck units, see findings 3 b and c.

1. References.

- a. AR 15-6, Procedure for Investigating Officers and Boards of Officers, 30 September 1996.
- b. AR 600-34, Fatal Training/Operational Accident Presentations to the Next of Kin, 2 January 2003.

2. Elements of Legal Review. AR 15-6 para 2-3b, in relevant part, requires the legal review of an investigation report to determine the following:

- a. whether the proceedings comply with legal requirements;
- b. the effect of any errors in the proceedings;
- c. whether sufficient evidence supports the findings of the investigation in accordance with the standard of proof set forth in paragraph 3-9b (i.e., whether the findings are *"supported by a greater weight of evidence than supports a contrary conclusion, that is, evidence which, after considering all evidence presented, points to a particular conclusion as being more credible and probable than any other conclusion"*); and
- d. whether the investigation report recommendations are consistent with its findings.

3. Summary of Legal Review. The Investigating Officer's ("IO") report of investigation addressed the circumstances surrounding an accident in which an Iraqi child was killed after making contact with a trailer being towed by an Army convoy truck ("Truck 40"). Upon review, the investigation findings are:

- a. legally sufficient with respect to the accident not resulting from the fault either of the driver and/or crew of Truck 40, or any other soldier in the convoy; and
- b. legally sufficient with respect to the reaction of the convoy in response to the accident.

Each of the following IO recommendations is consistent with these findings: (i) to have MNF-I and the Iraqi Government post signs along major convoy routes in more populated areas warning Iraqi civilians about the dangers of approaching a convoy too closely, (ii) to more actively educate Iraqi civilians about the dangers of approaching a convoy too closely, and (iii) to revisit, to the extent practicable, CFLCC guidance and relevant TTPs relating to convoys approaching congested areas or large crowds.

4. Discussion of the Findings.

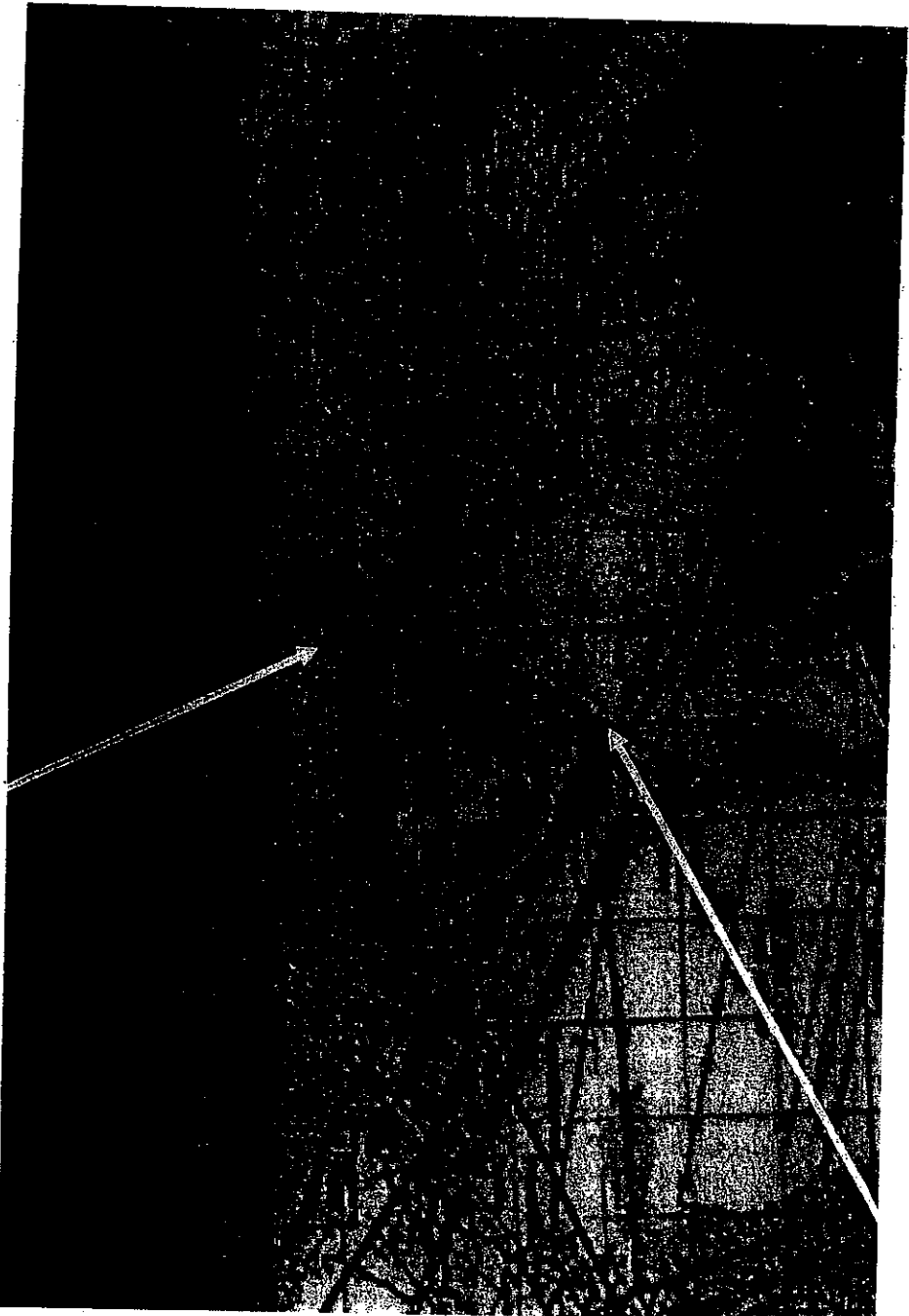
a. Convoy Conduct Up to Incident – The statements from the driver and crew of Truck 40, supported by the statements of other soldiers involved in the convoy and pictures derived from the personal video taken during the accident, demonstrate by a preponderance of the evidence that the driver and crew of the vehicle involved in the accident did not intentionally, recklessly or negligently strike the victim. The driver and crew were well-rested, maintained an appropriate speed in the middle of their convoy, and remained in their lane throughout the unfortunate incident. (It is particularly relevant that the victim was struck by the back end of the trailer being towed by Truck 40, which indicates that the child at some point moved into the trailer, perhaps in the child's confusion resulting from the dust cloud that appears on the video as the vehicle passed.) Moreover, the truck's position on the road was appropriate in accordance with relevant tactical procedures.¹

b. Convoy Conduct in Response to Incident – The statements and exhibits indicate by a preponderance of the evidence that the Convoy Escort Commander made an appropriate mental risk assessment to continue towards the convoy's objective, rather than stop to administer first aid to the victim, based on: (i) the apparent grave condition of the

¹ The 354th Transportation Battalion's Tactics, Techniques and Procedures (TTP) Guidance (December 2004) (the "354th SOP") states that, where road quality is even, convoys should travel in the middle of the road, so as to reduce the risk of IEDs, which are typically planted on the roadside. See 354th SOP, Actions During Convoy, TTP II – Convoy Movement. However, although the 354th SOP's stated TTPs are intended "to provide standardized methodology for dealing with those combat situations that transporters will most likely encounter on the battlefield at the platoon level," they are not intended "to dictate how [leaders] will conduct the mission, but to provide the basic foundation for each mission . . . [i]n other words, . . . to show ways (versus how) then [the leader] (based on METT-TC) will determine how [to] conduct the mission." Memorandum of [REDACTED] for all Leaders in connection with the 354th SOP (18 October 2004). In the instant case, because of the oncoming convoy, the convoy involved in the incident was not able to travel in the middle of the road. Further, a decision for one convoy to stop to permit the other convoy to pass would have been inconsistent with the general guidance and objectives of the 354th SOP.

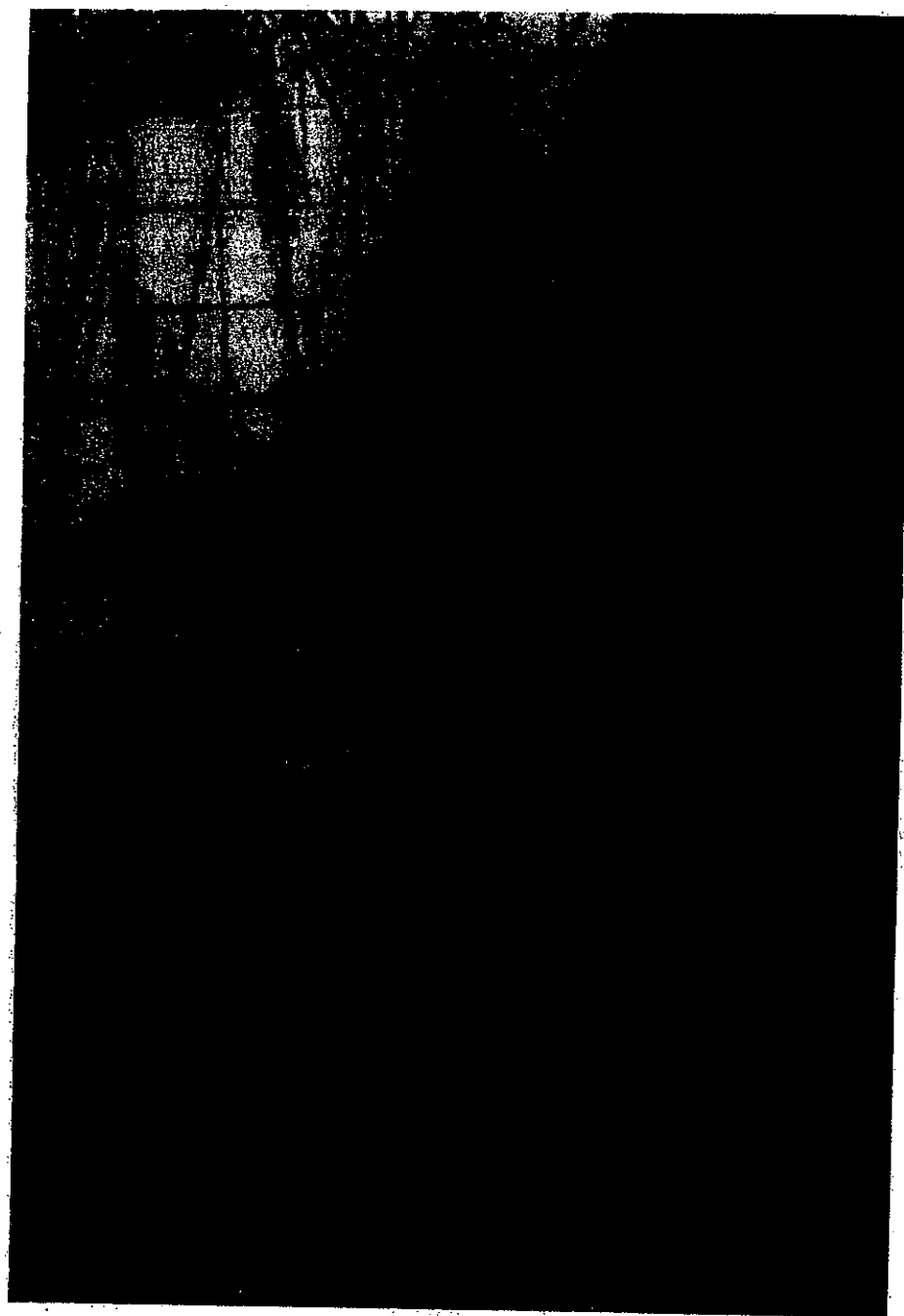

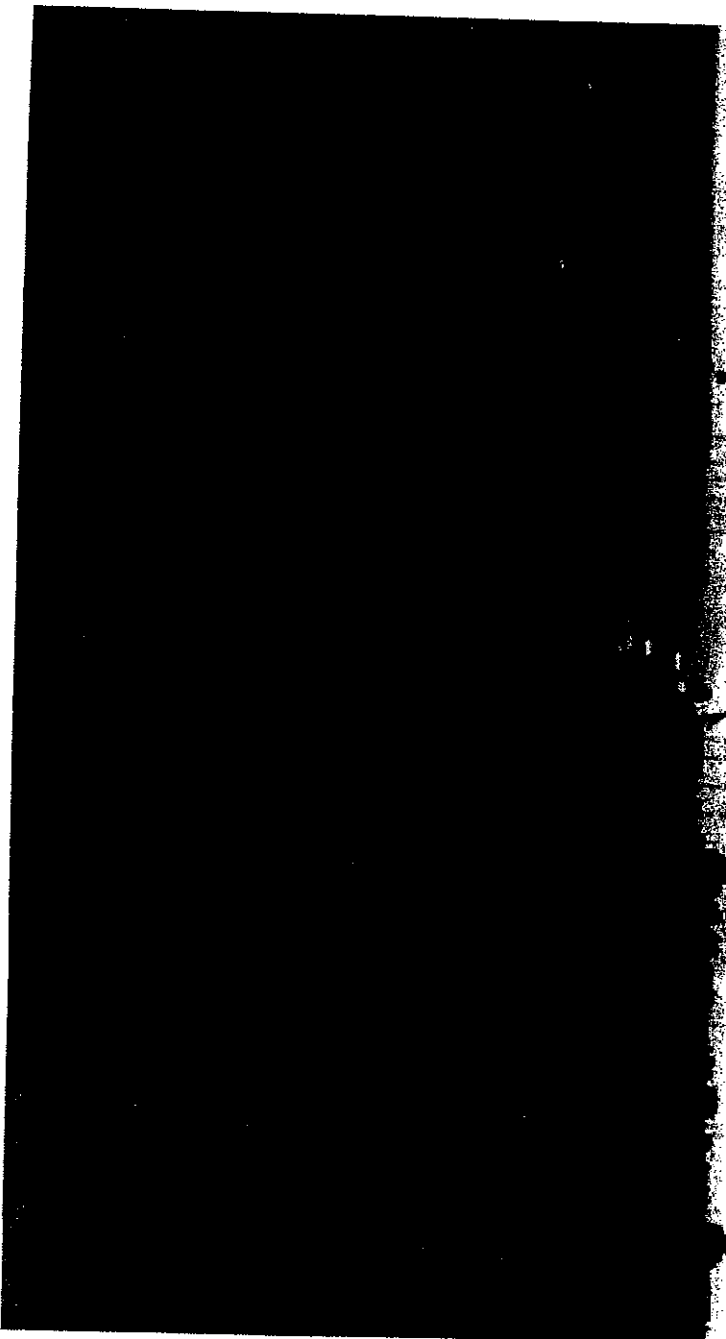
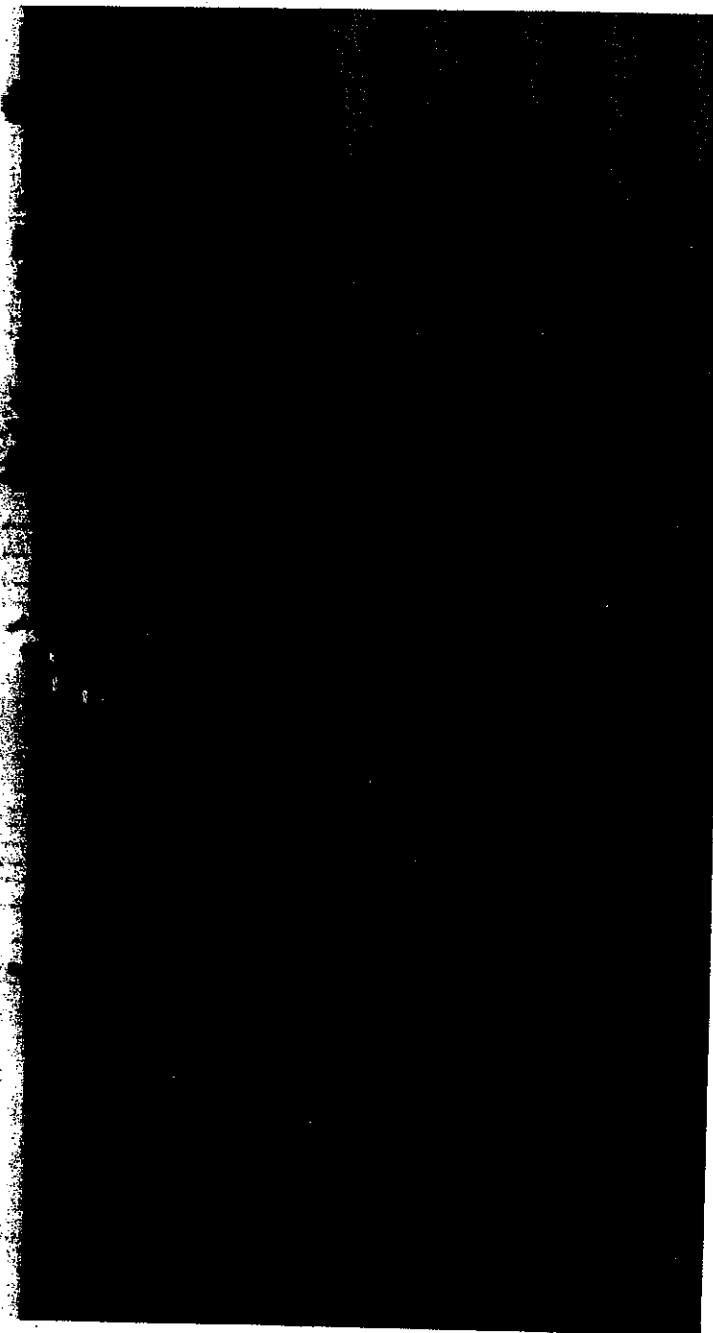

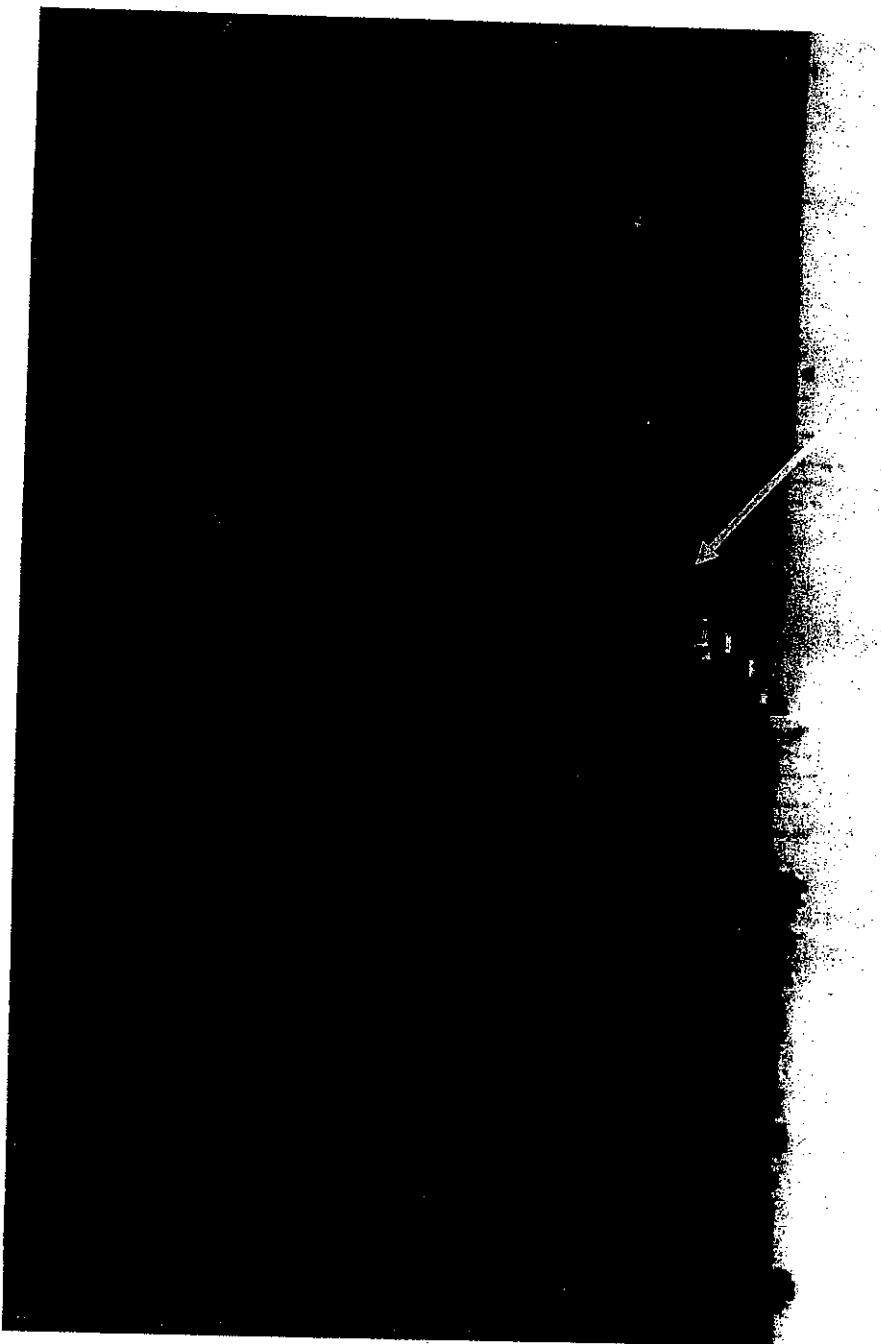
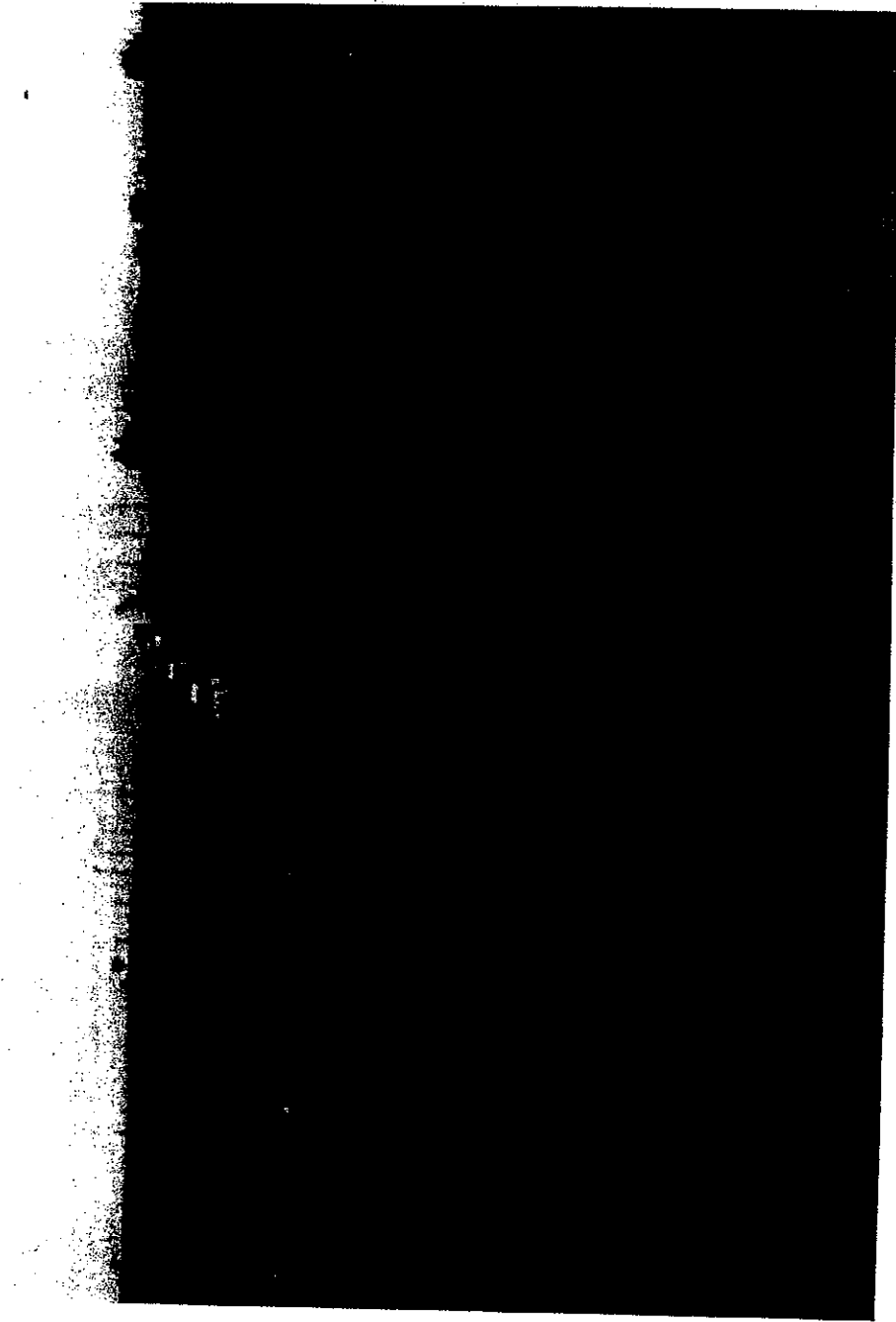

Both convoys are on the road.

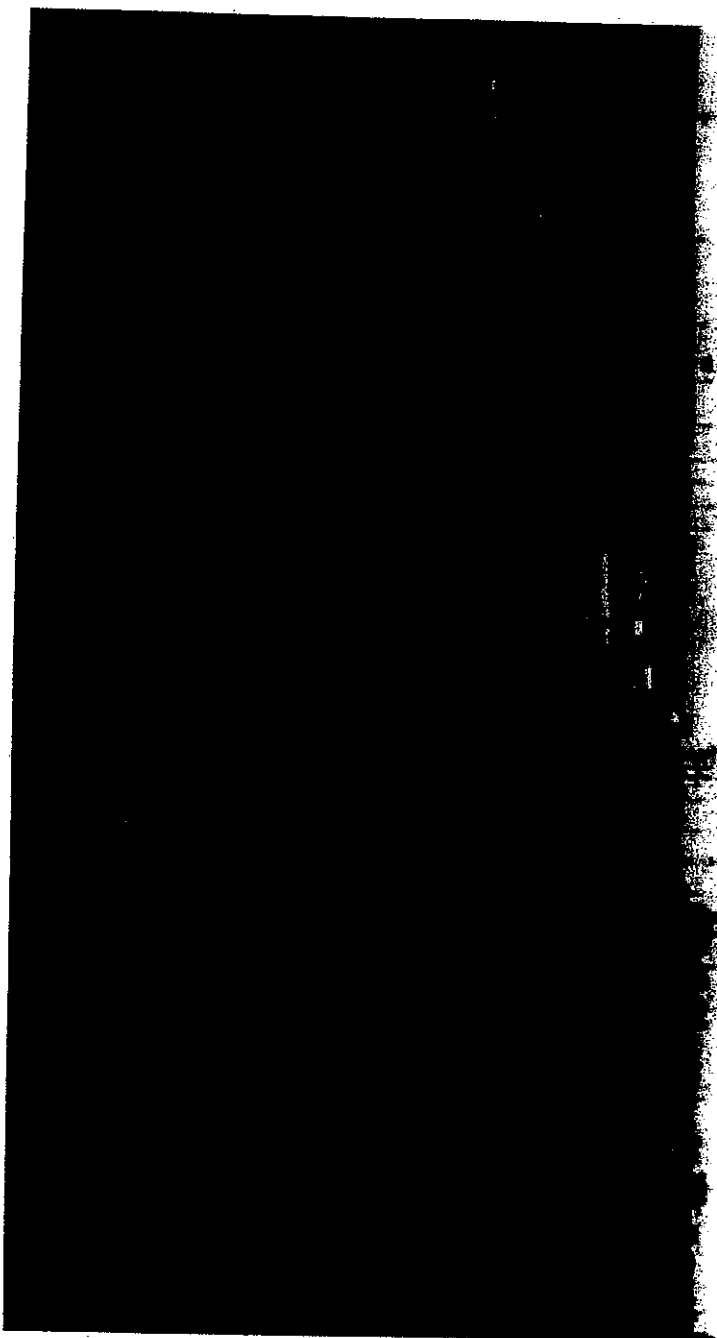
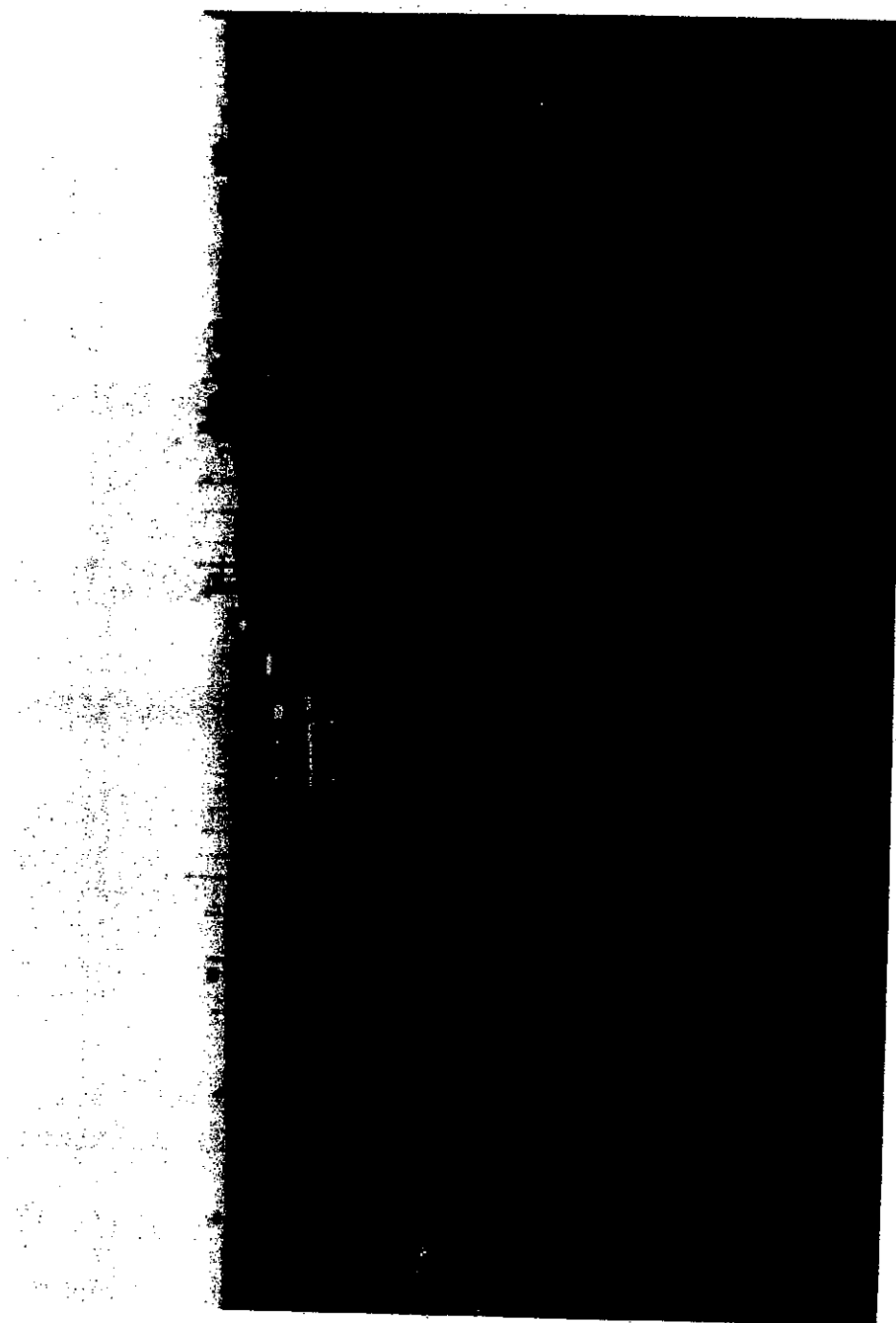

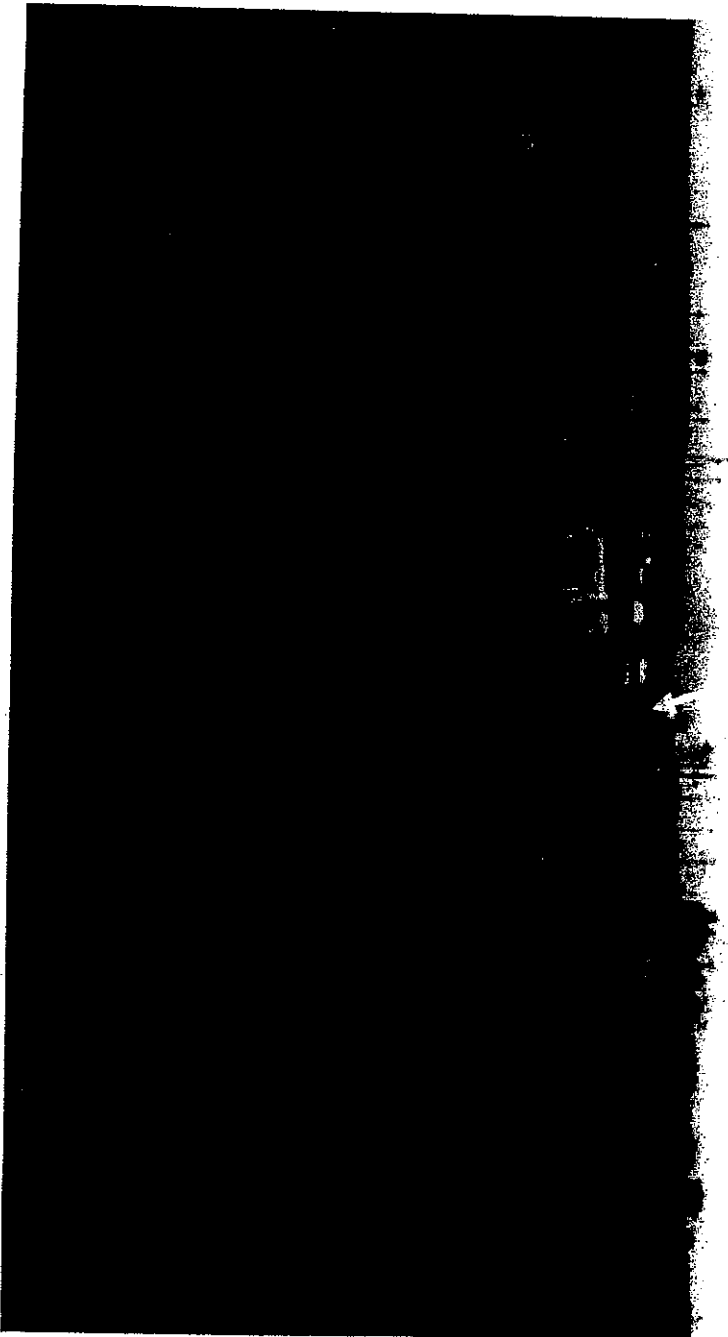
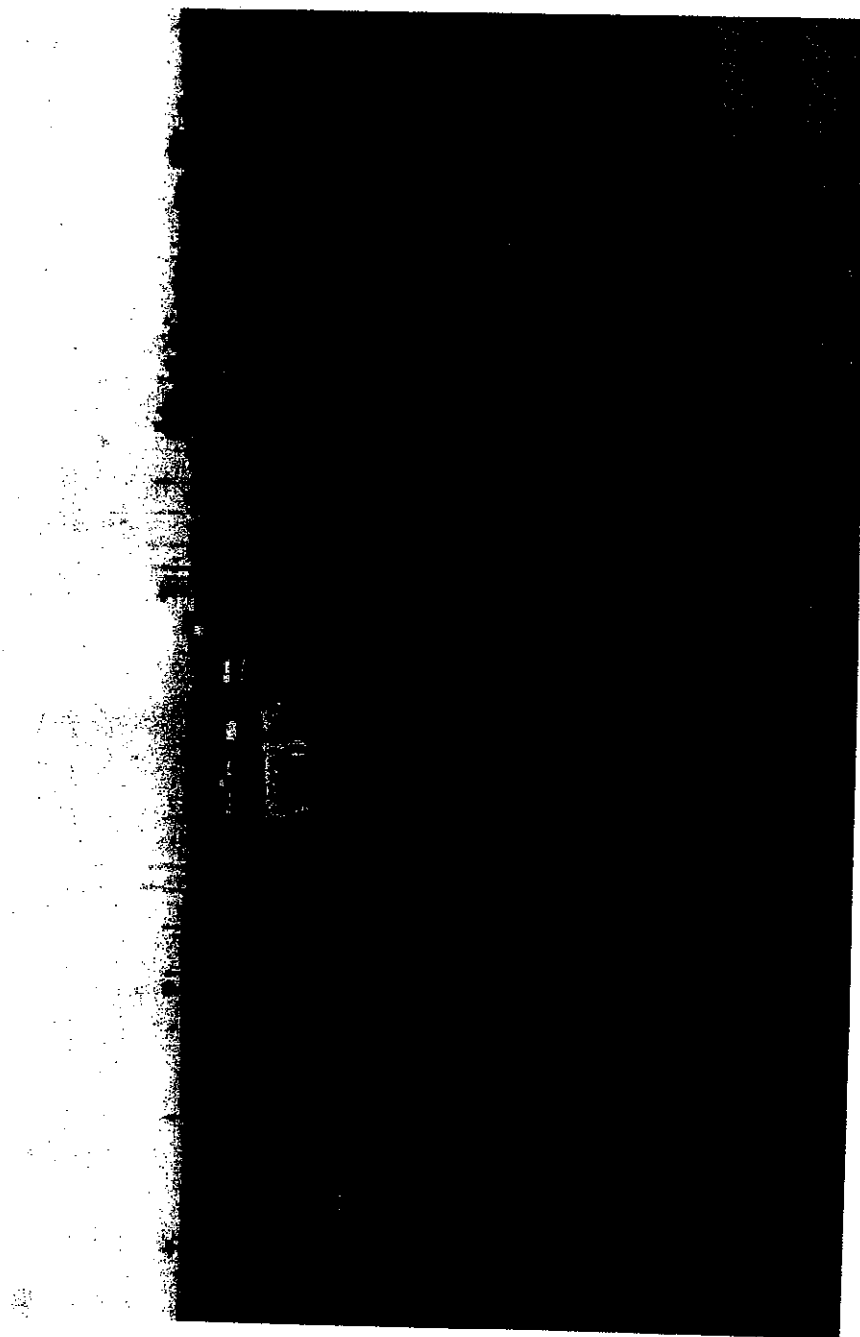

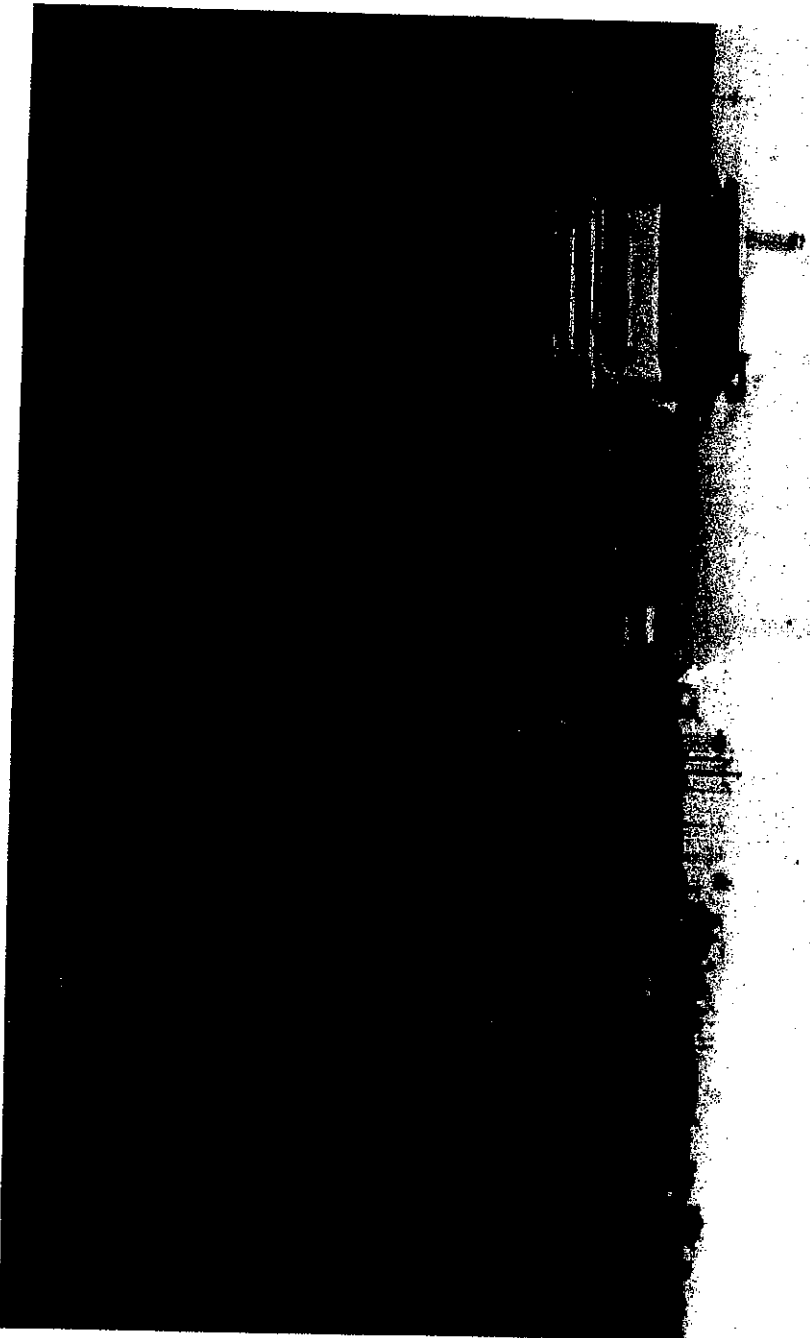
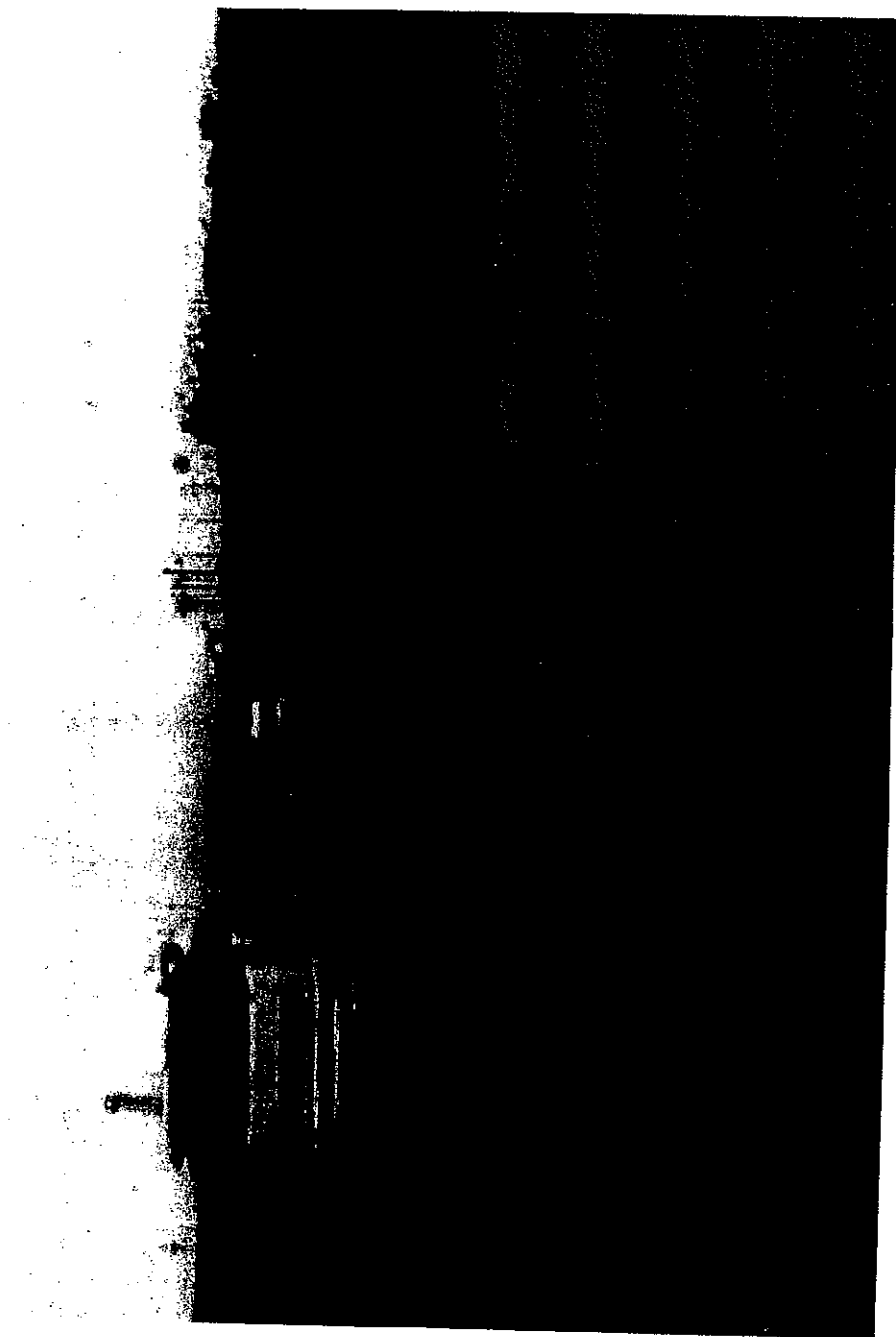

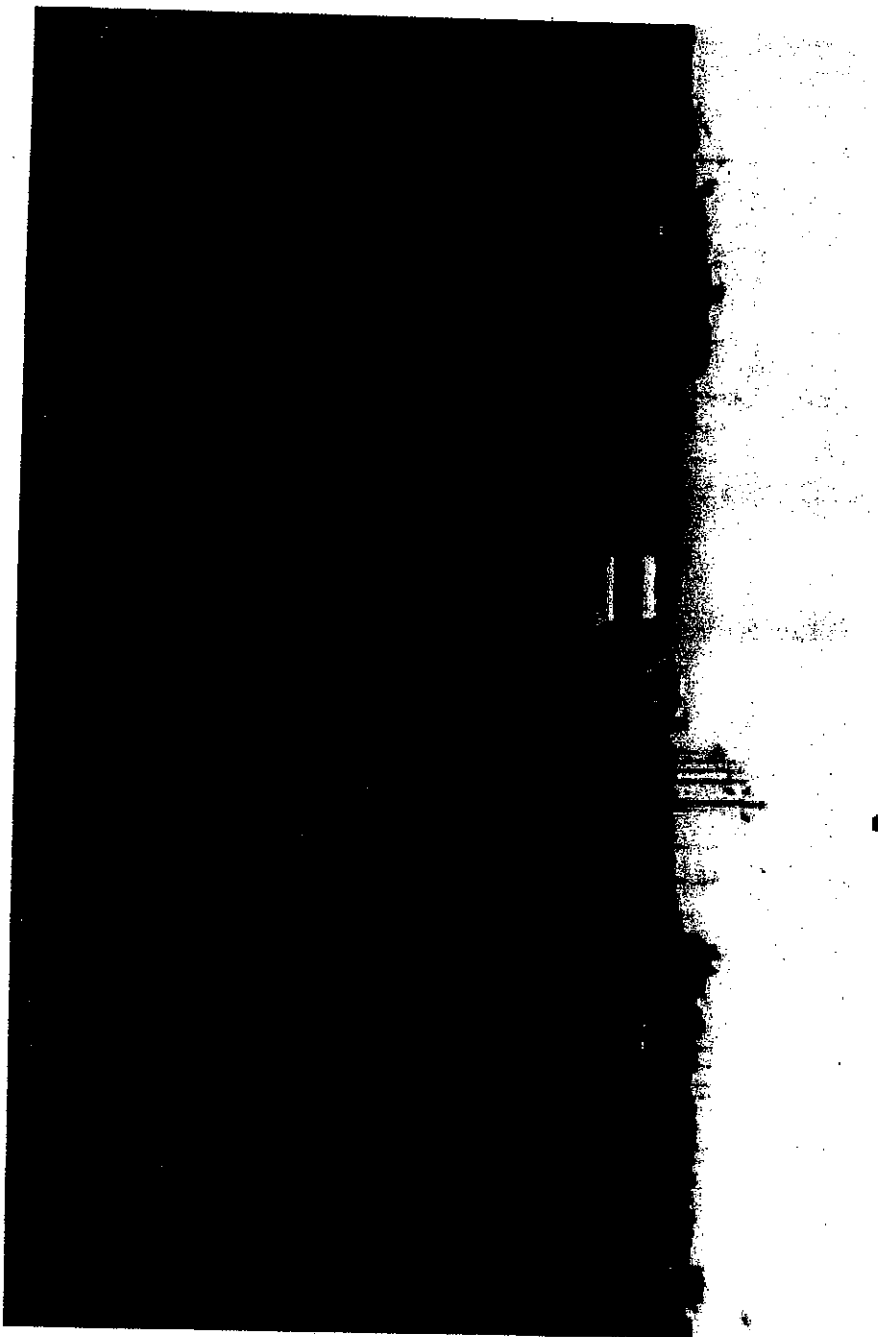
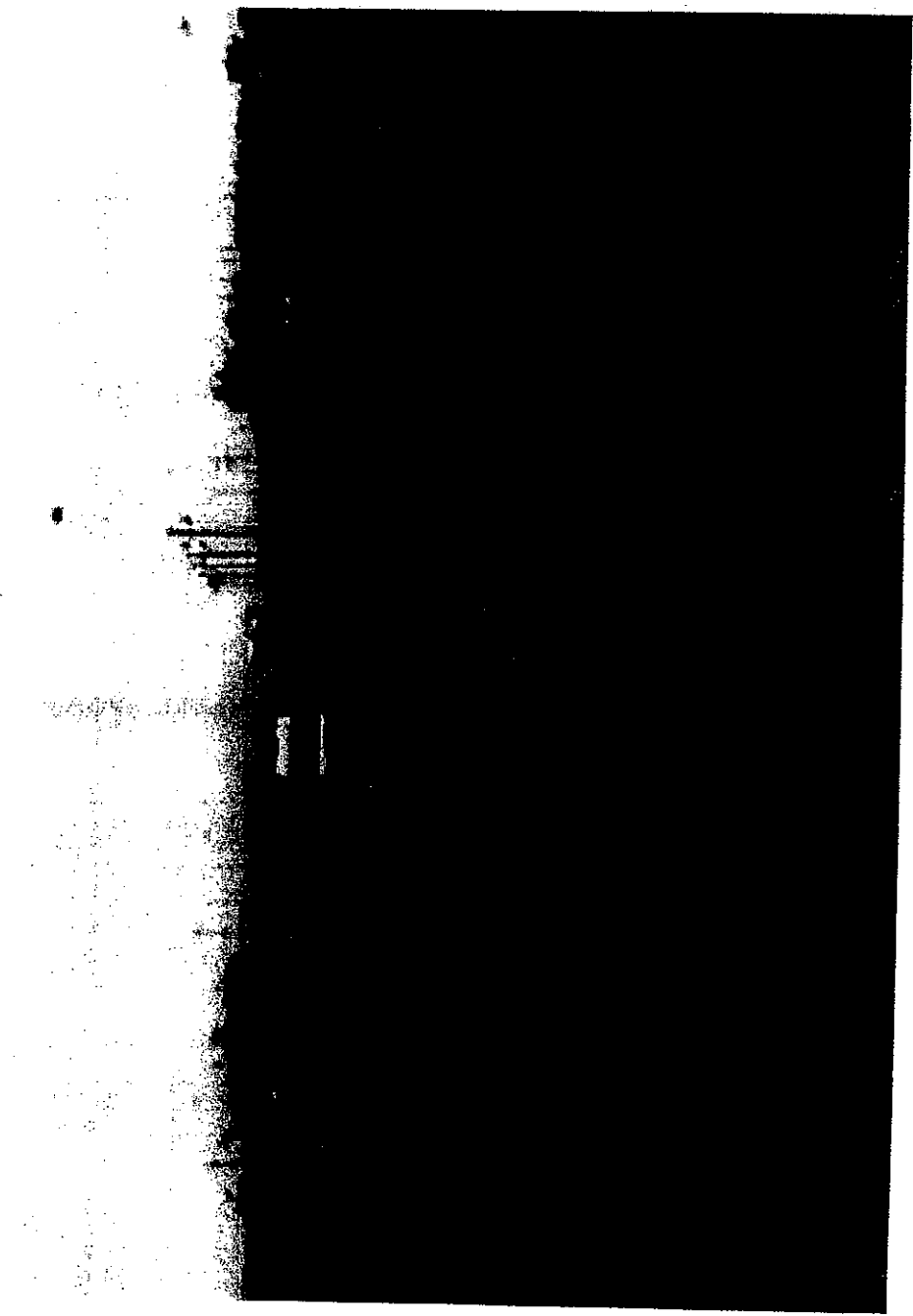

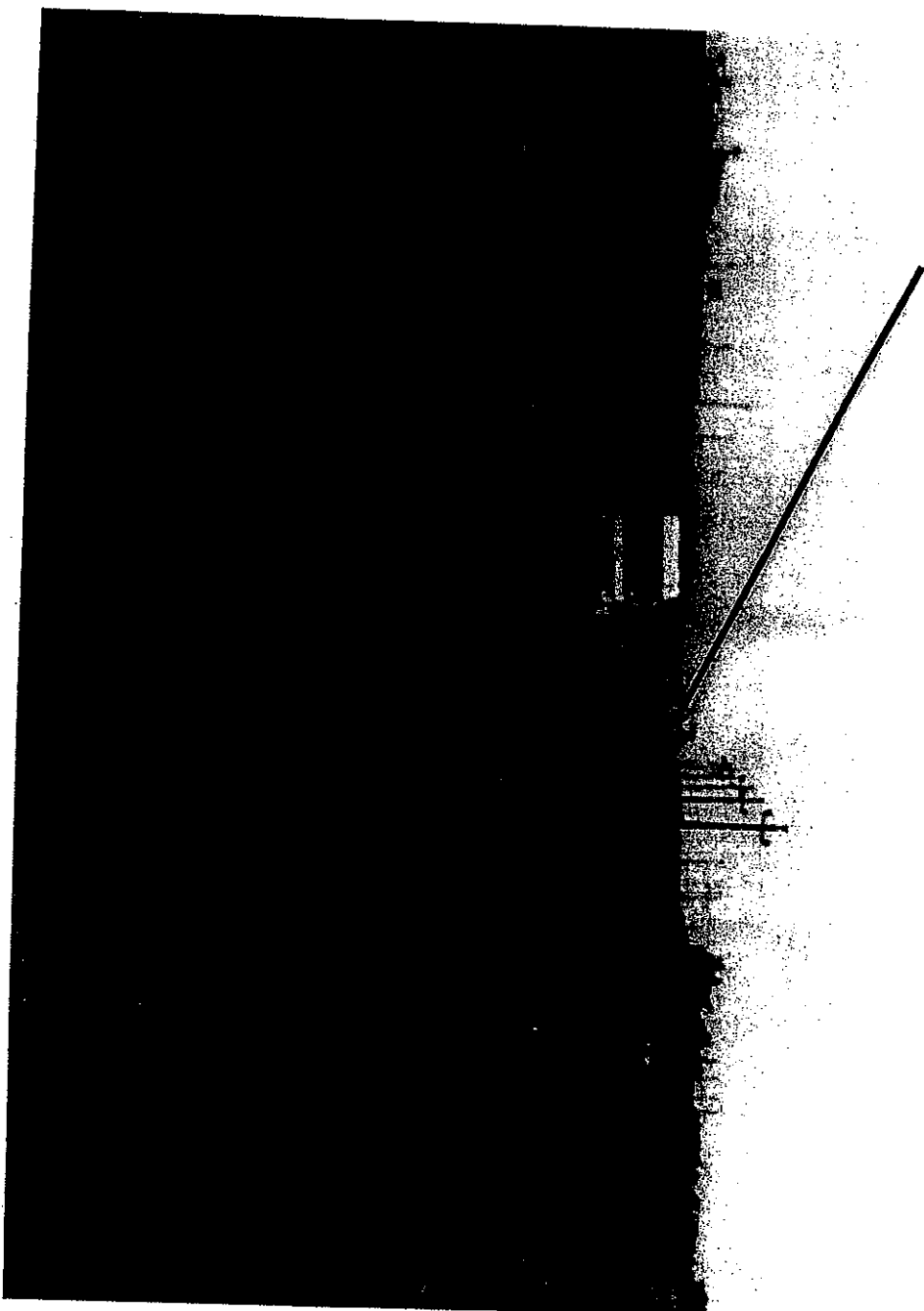
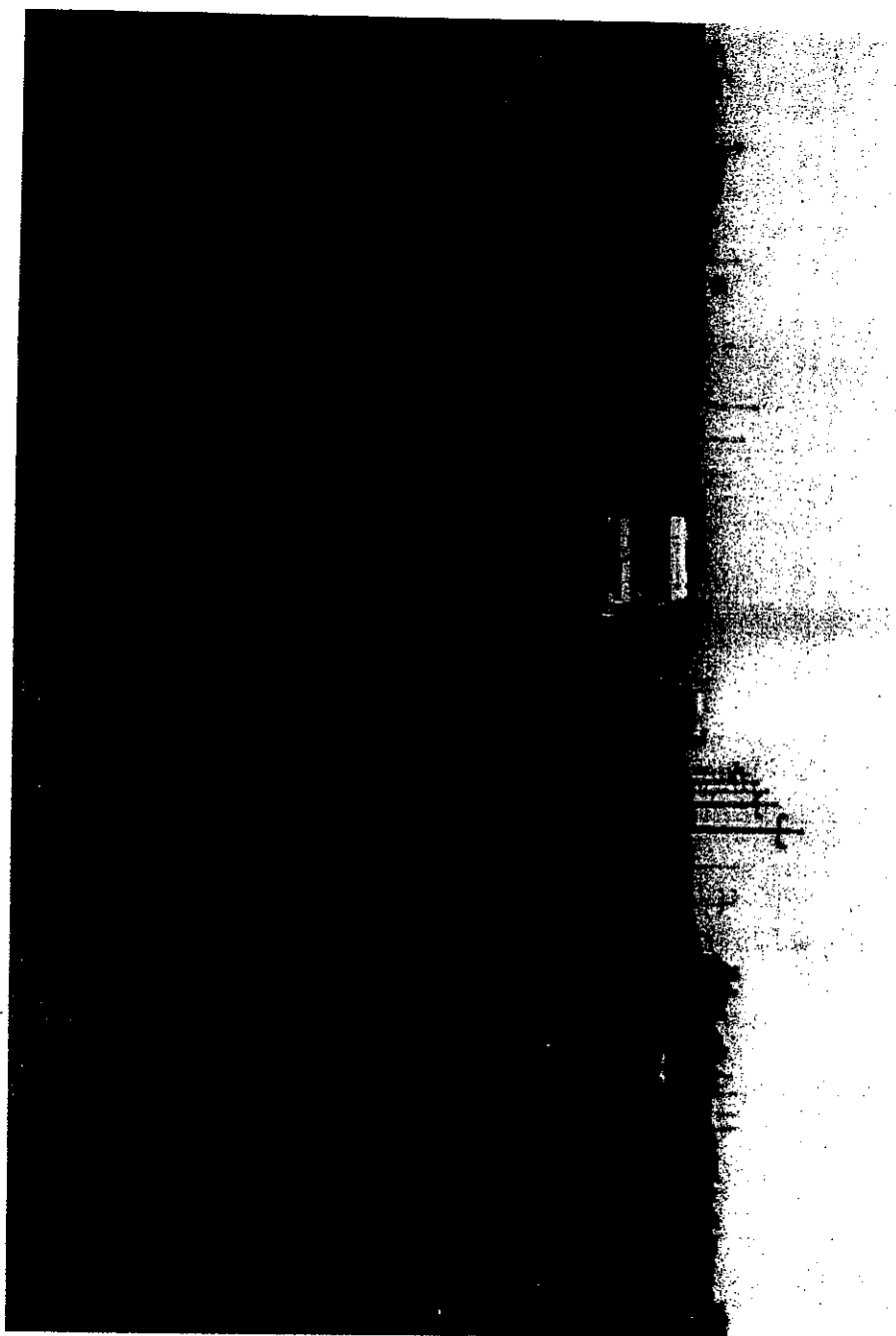

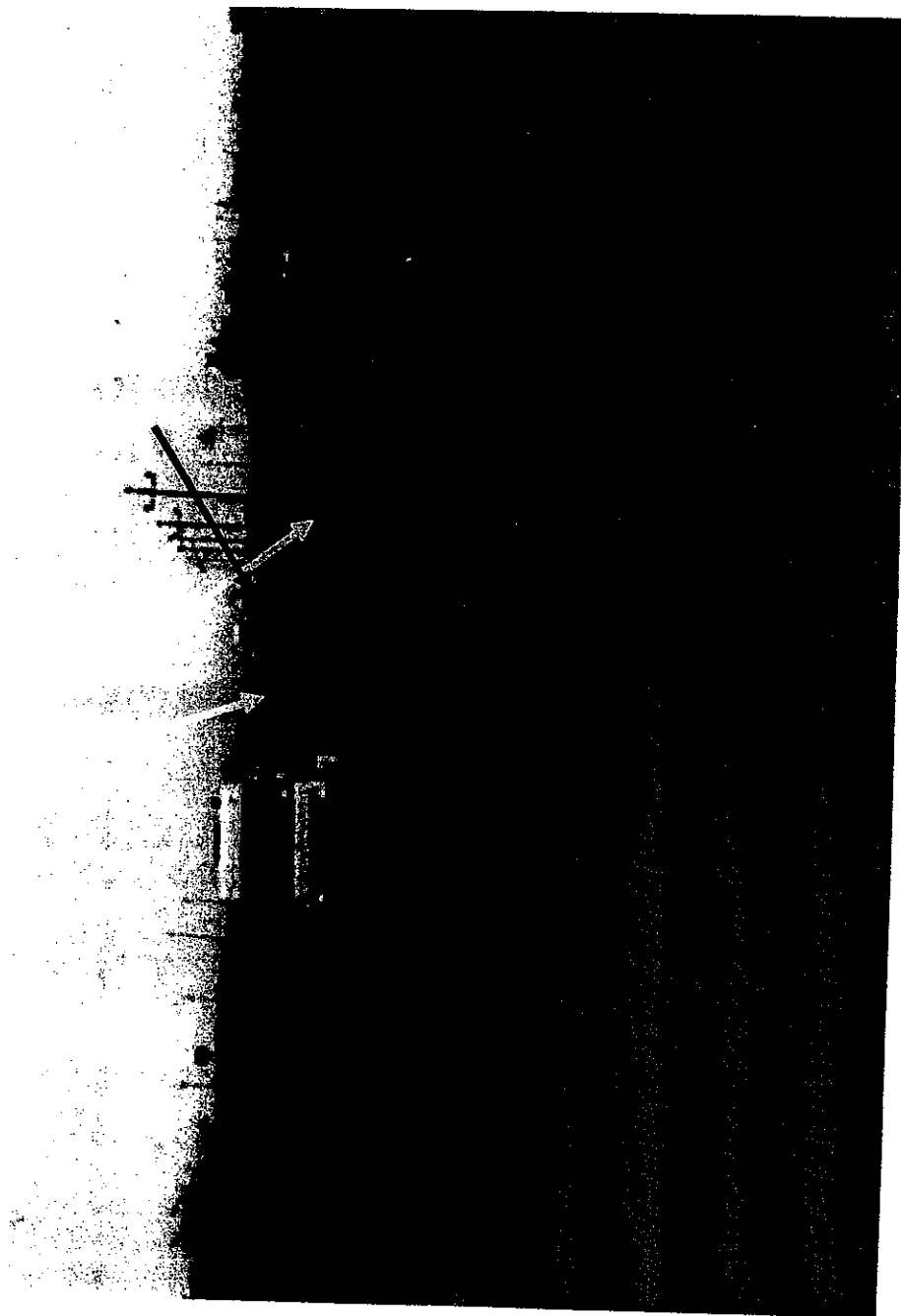
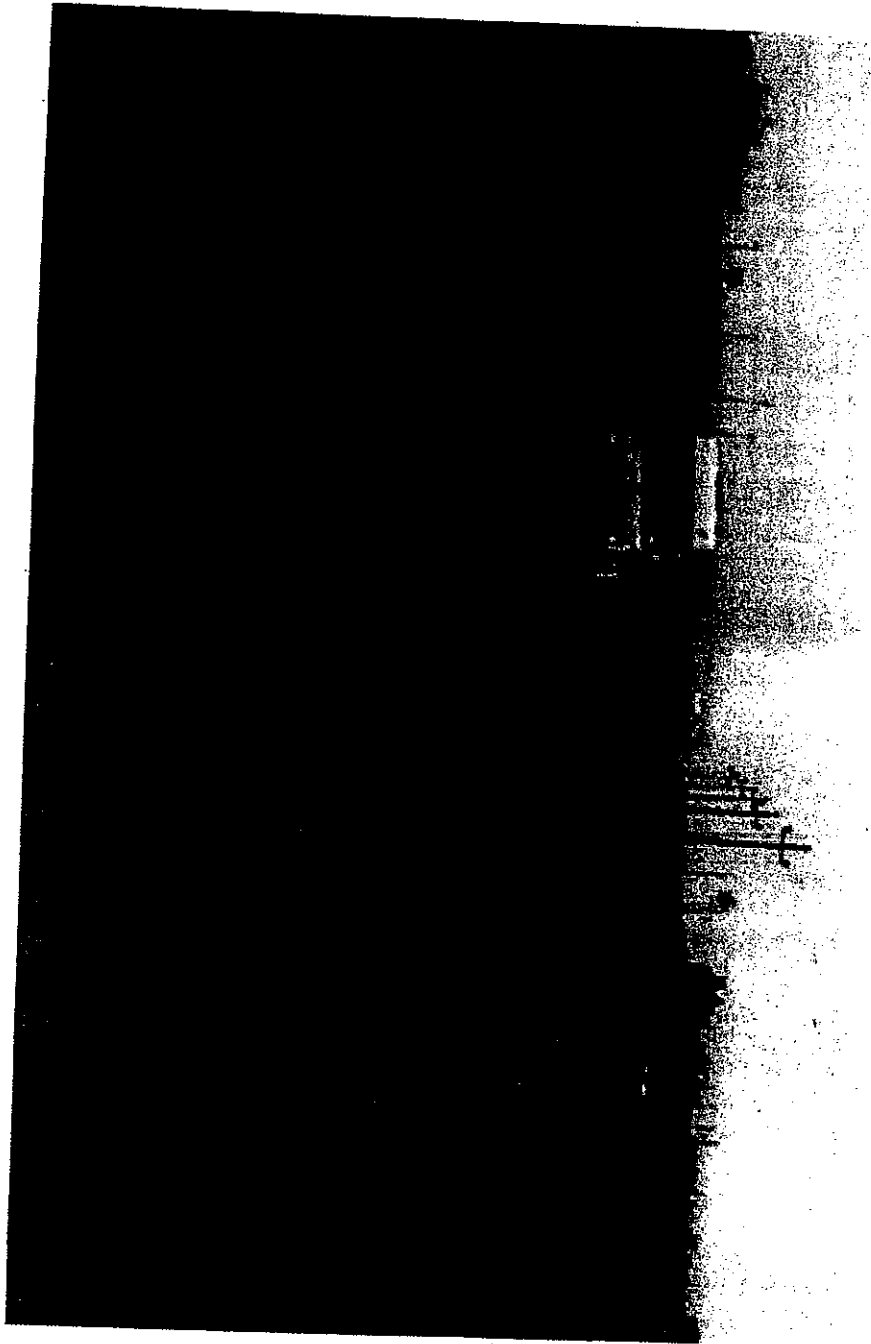

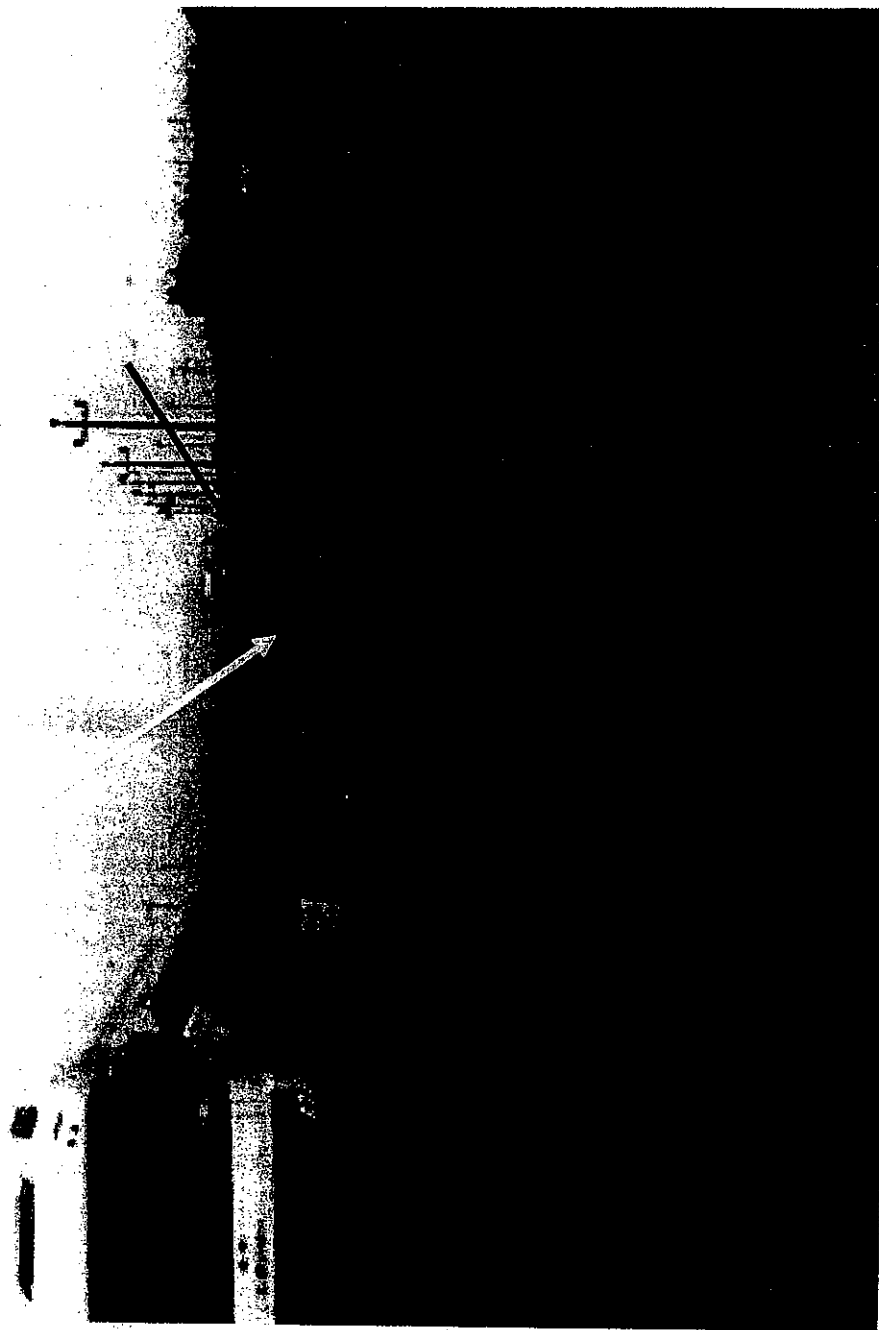
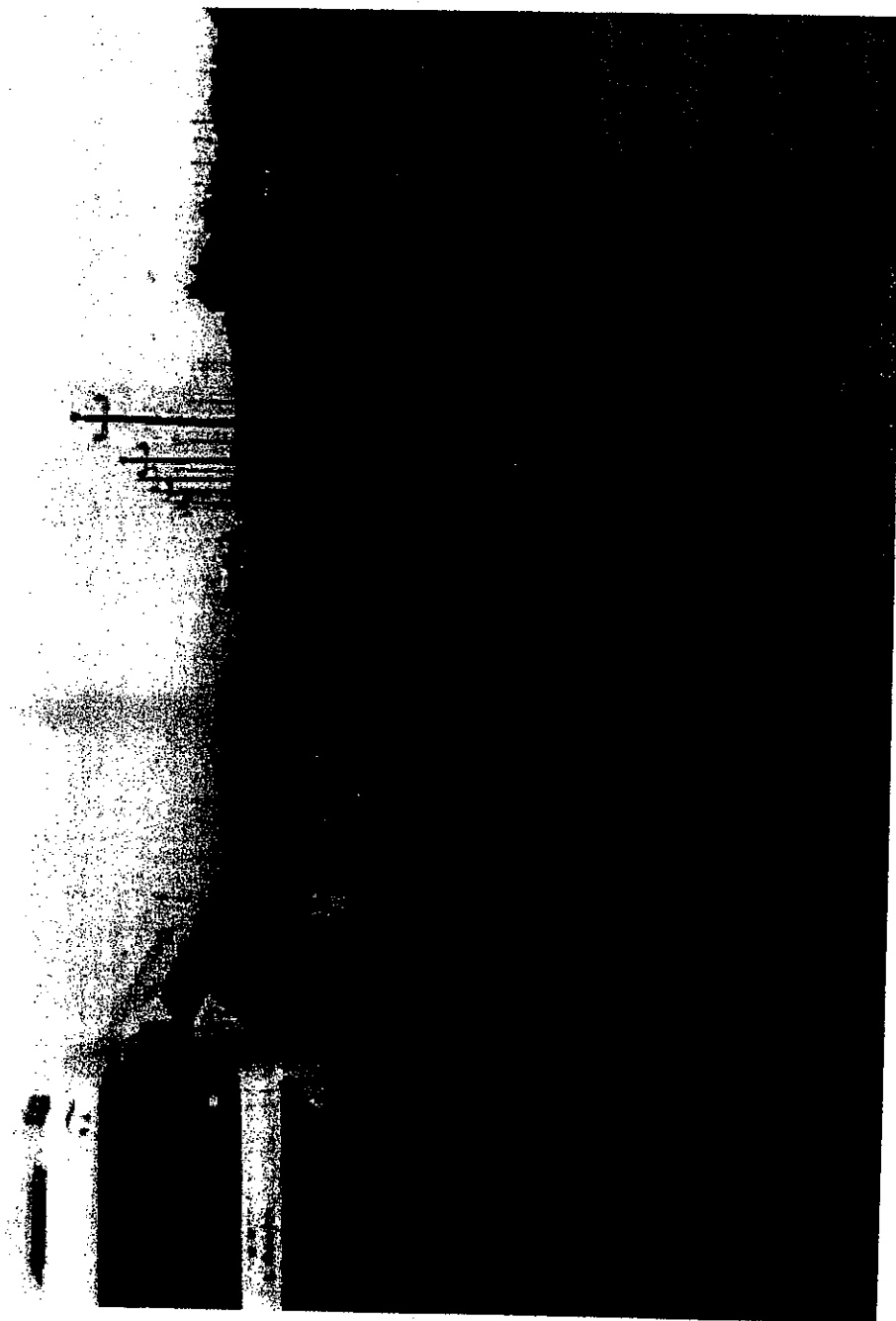


Exhibit B to 25 JAN 05 AR 15-6 Investigation

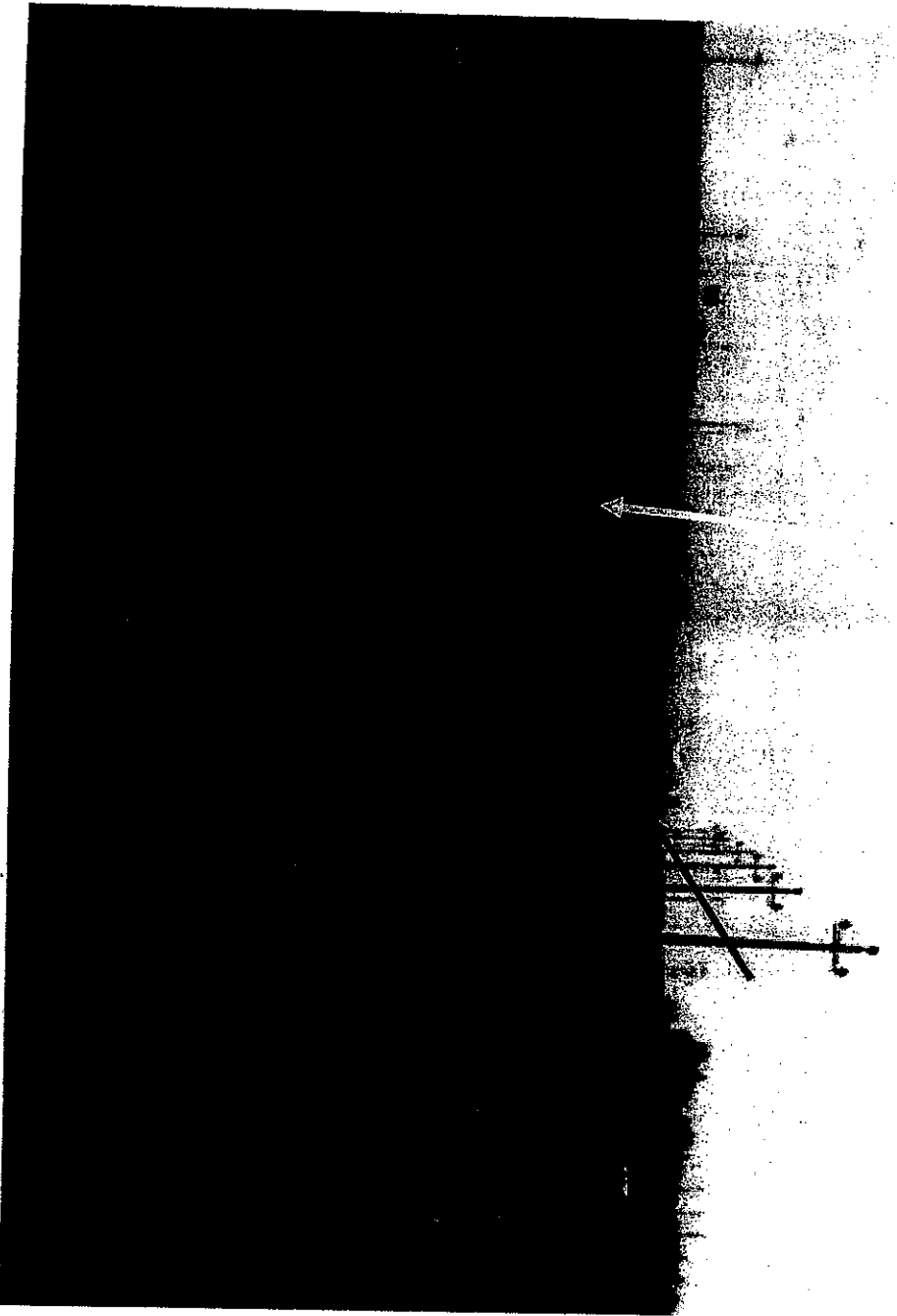
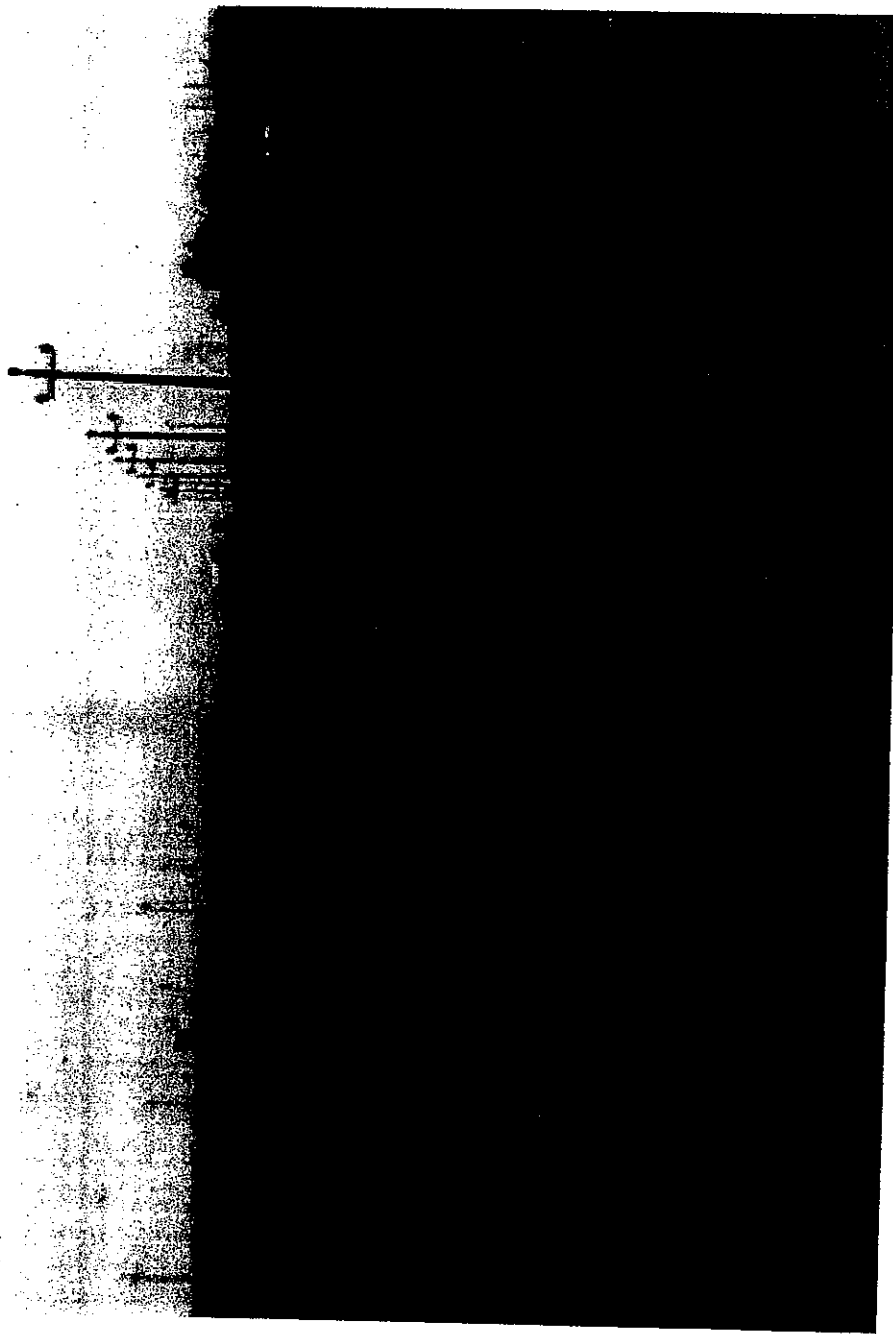

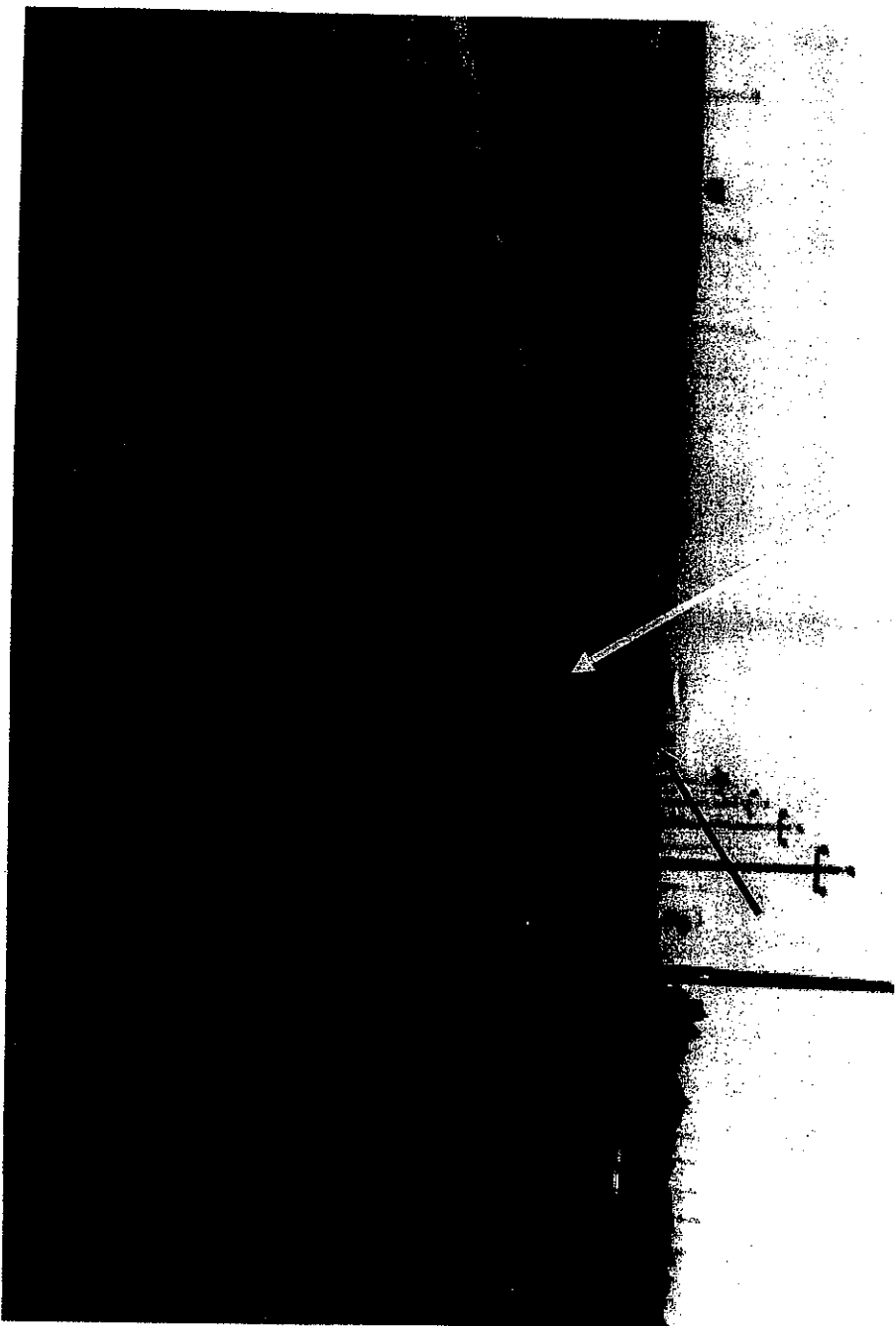
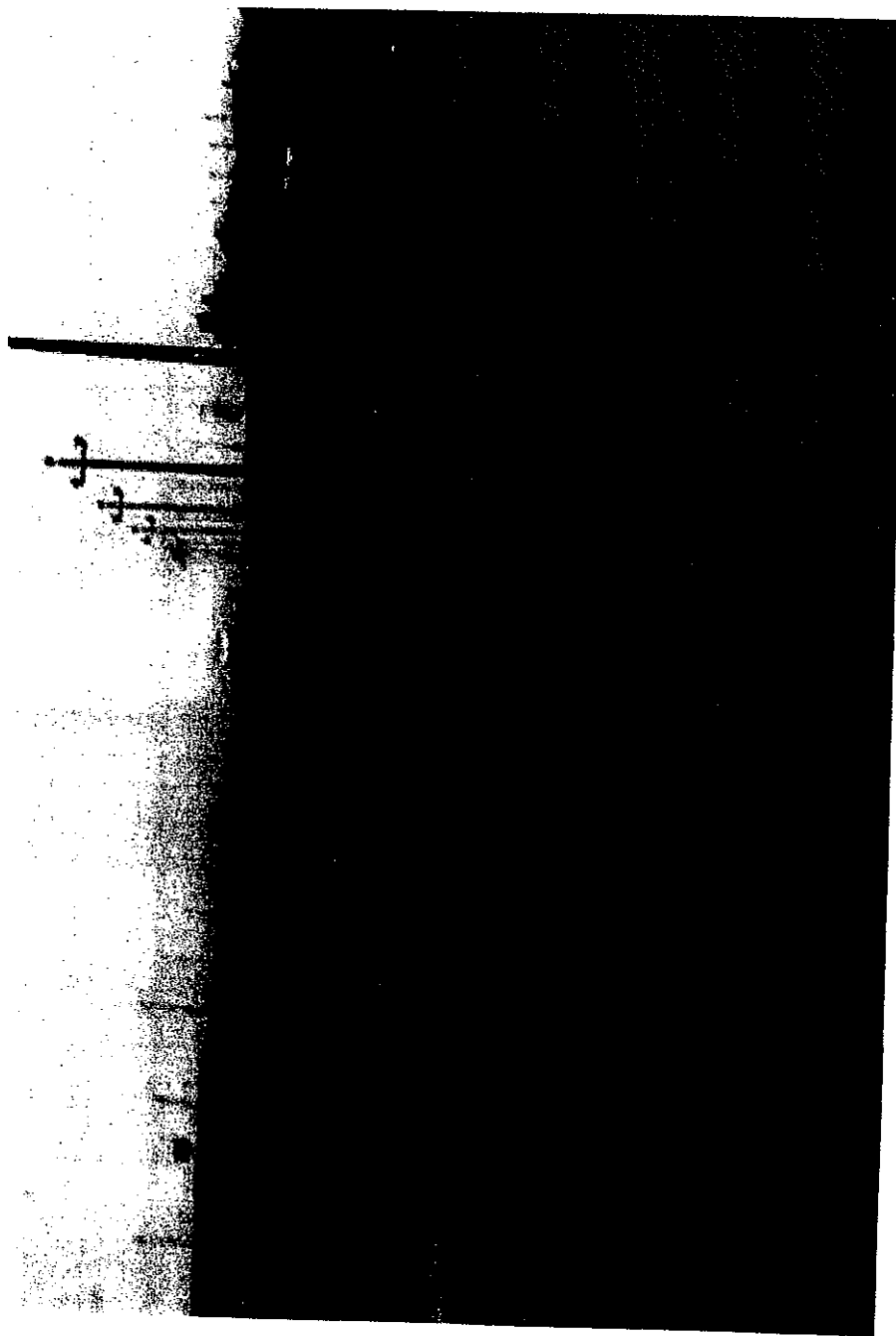

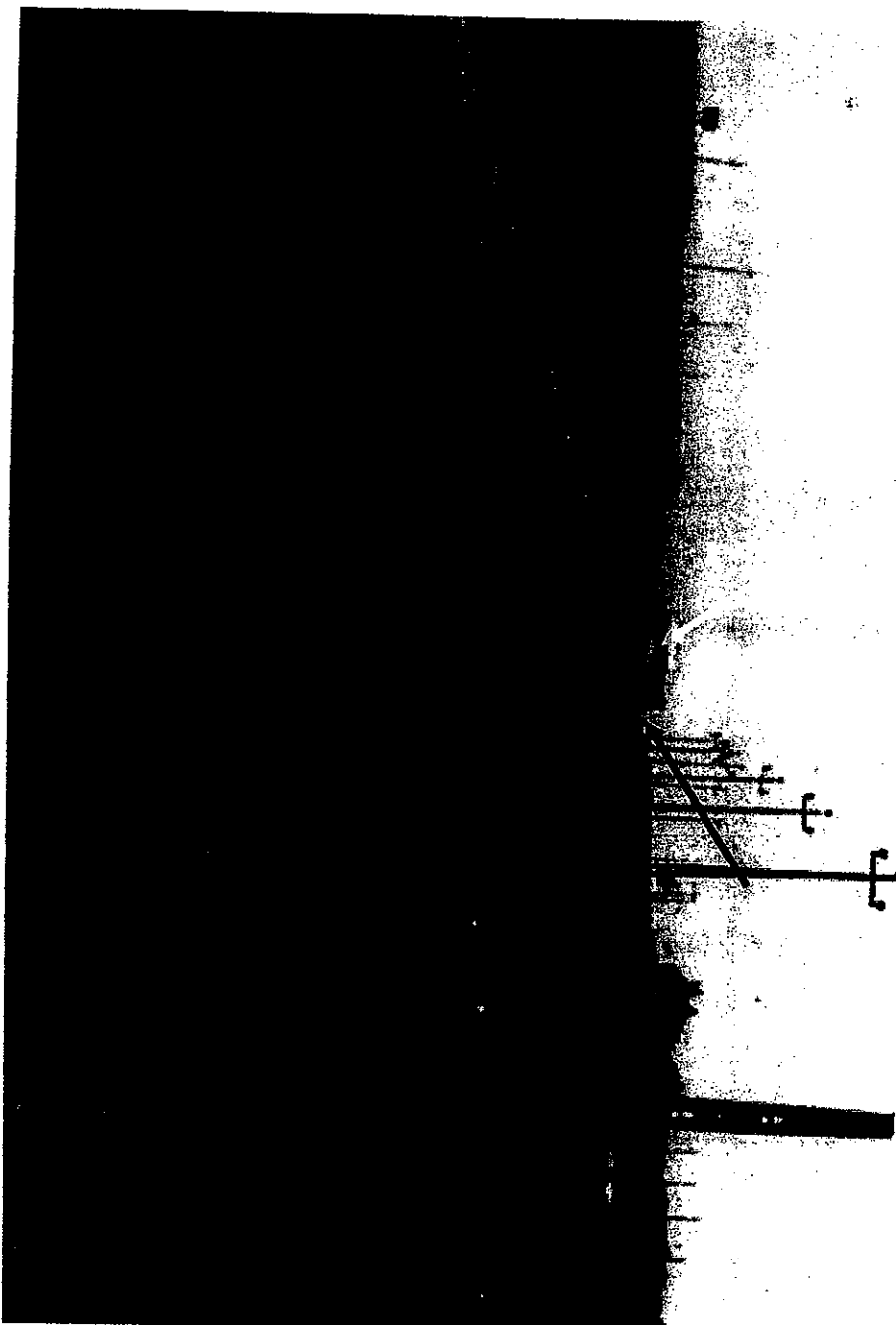

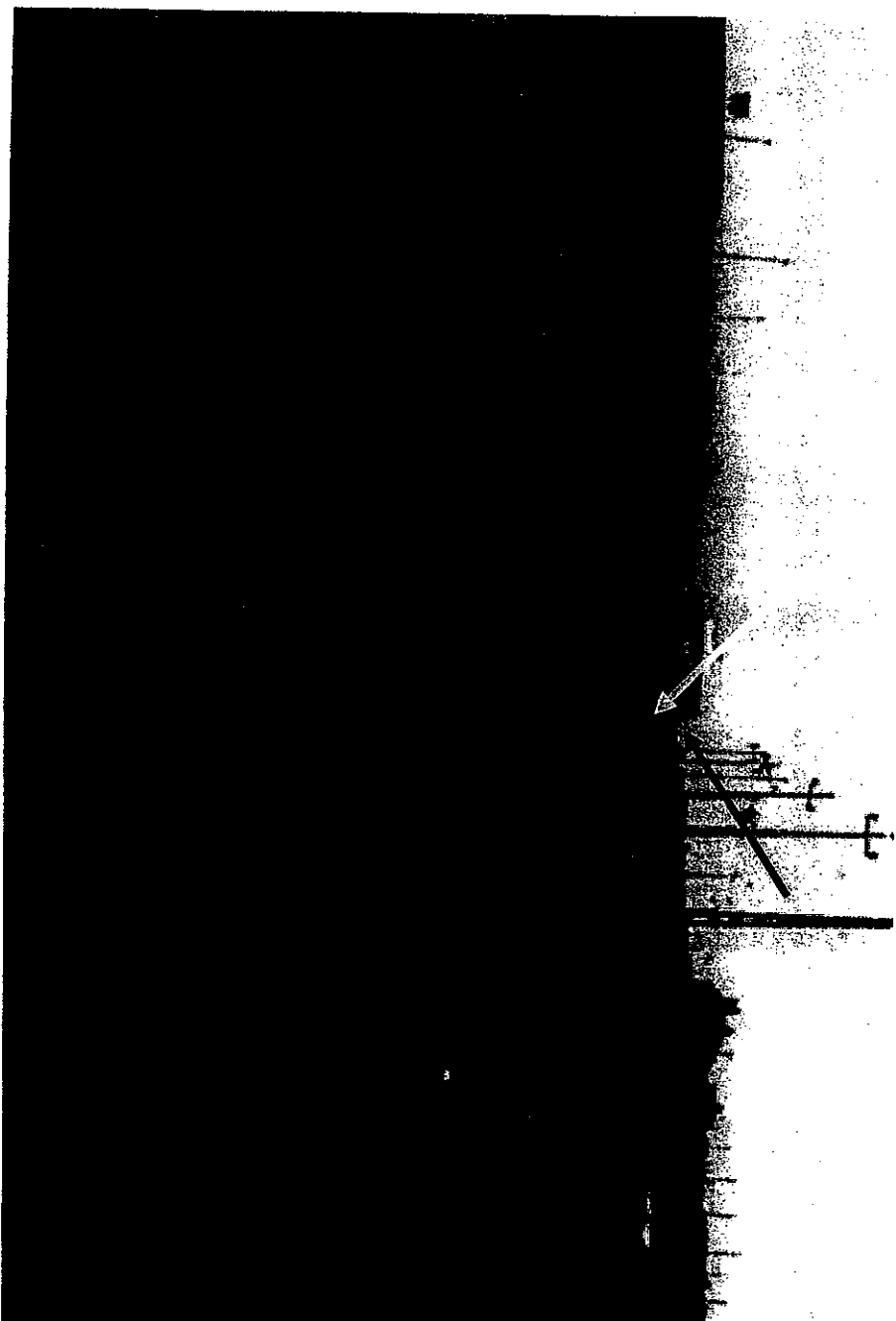
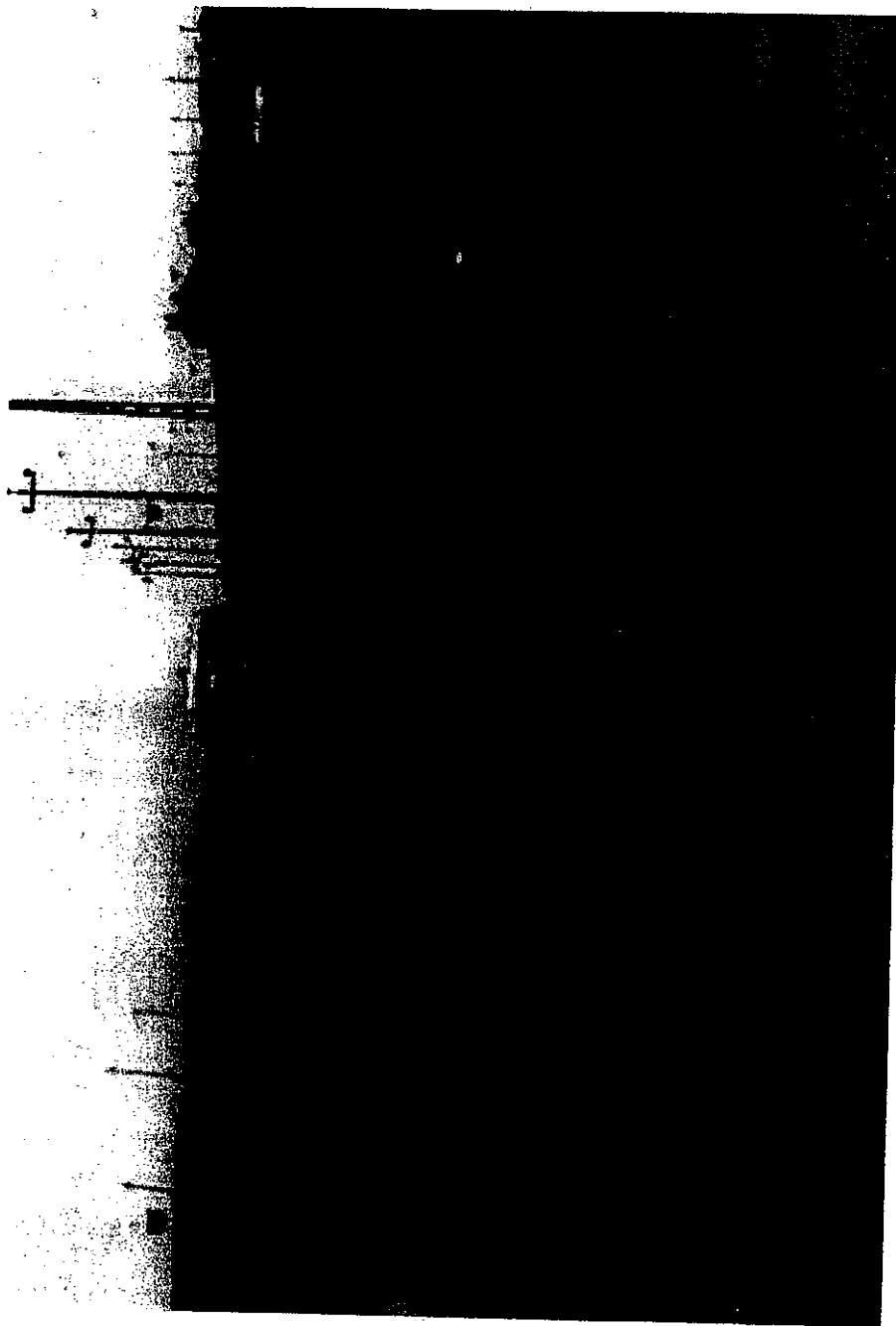


Exhibit B to 25 JAN 05 AR 15-6 Investigation

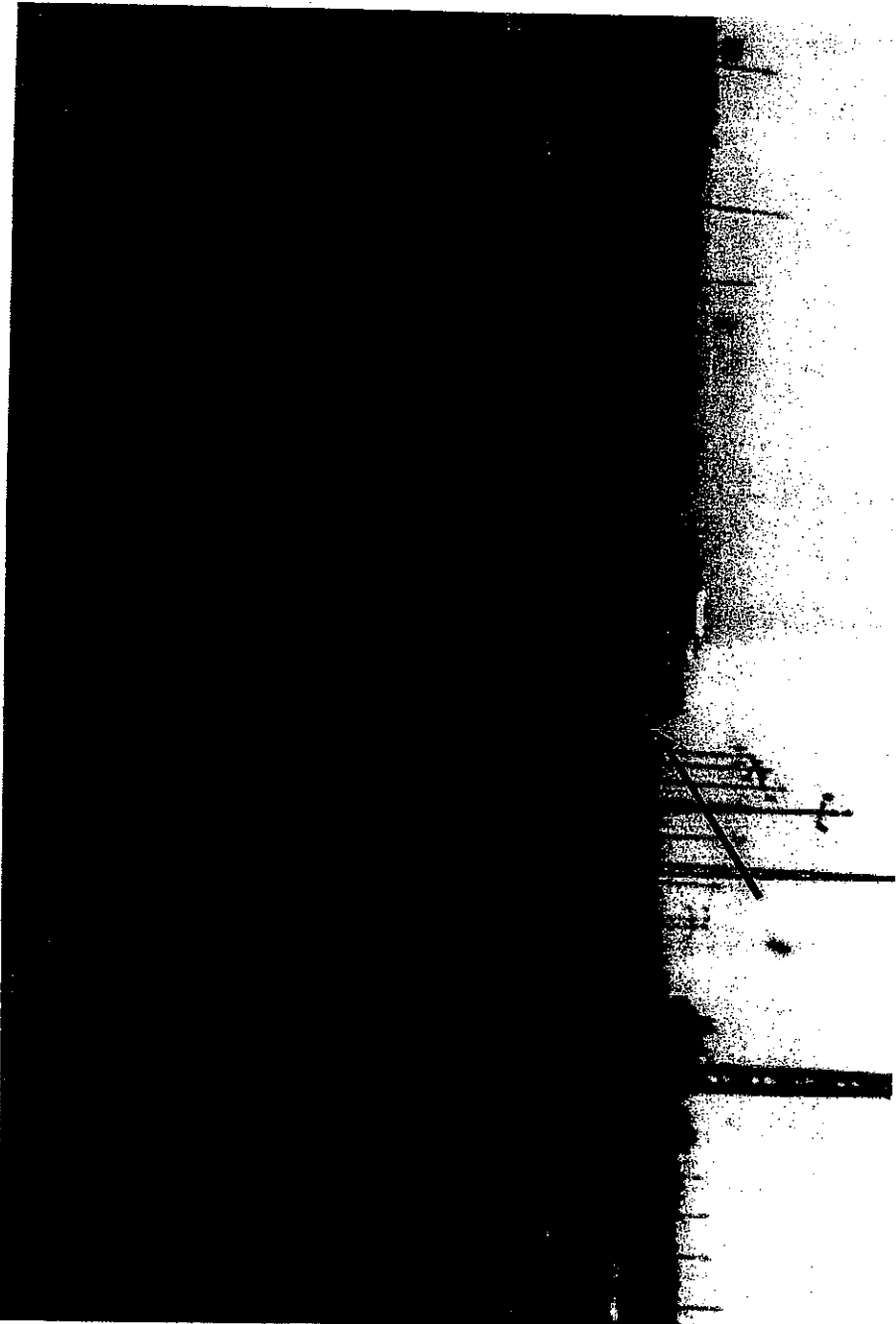
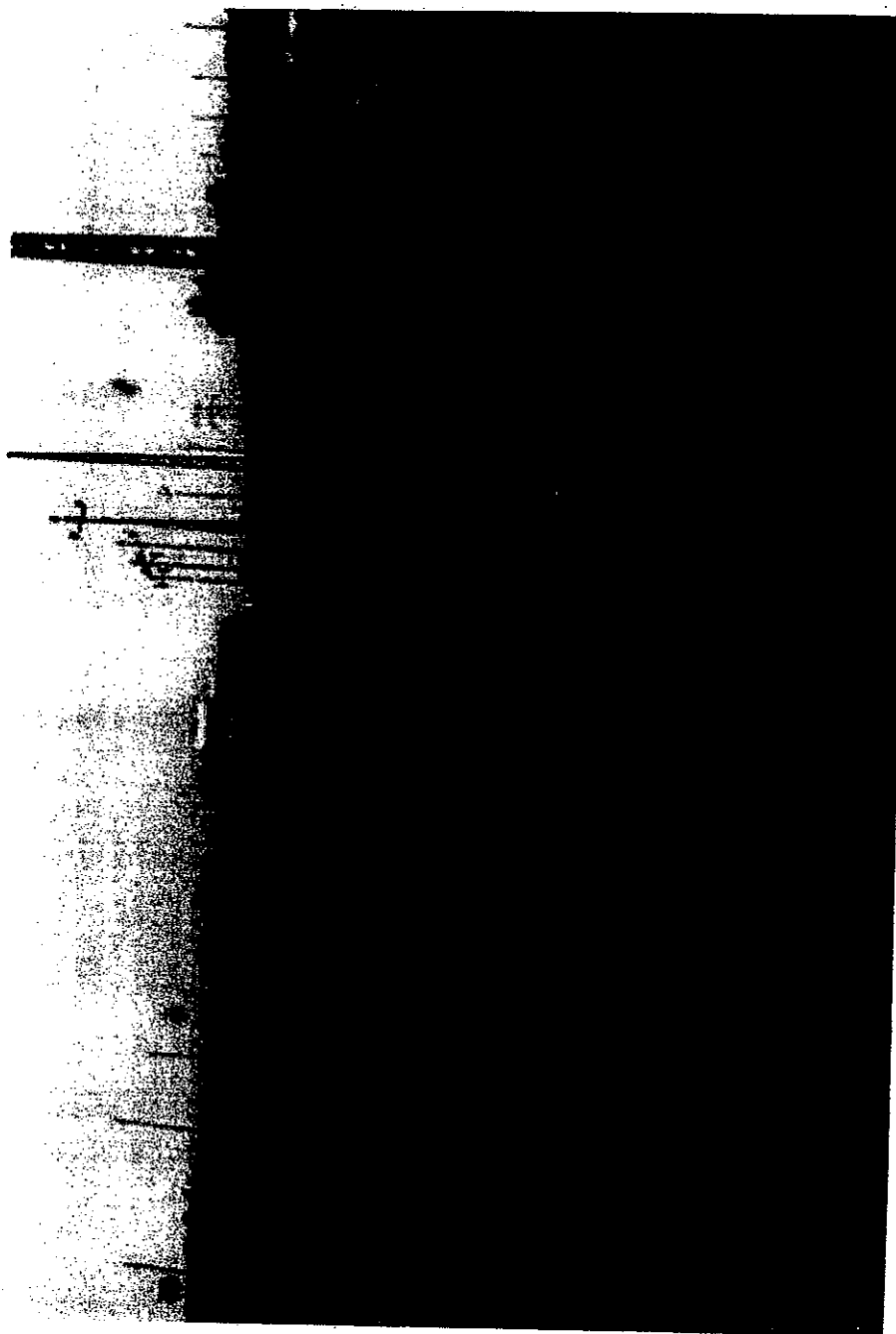


Exhibit B to 25 JAN 05 AR 15-6 Investigation

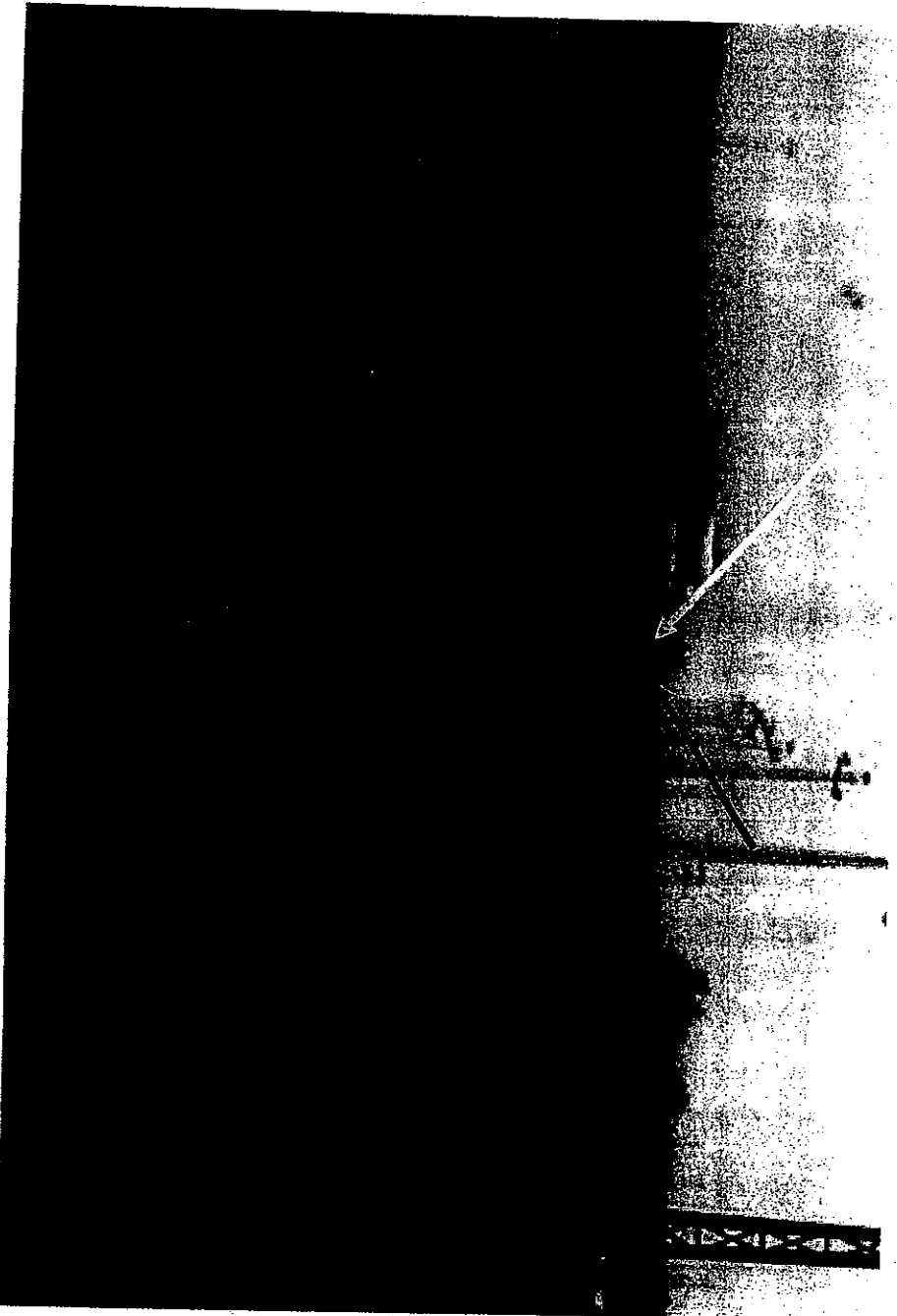
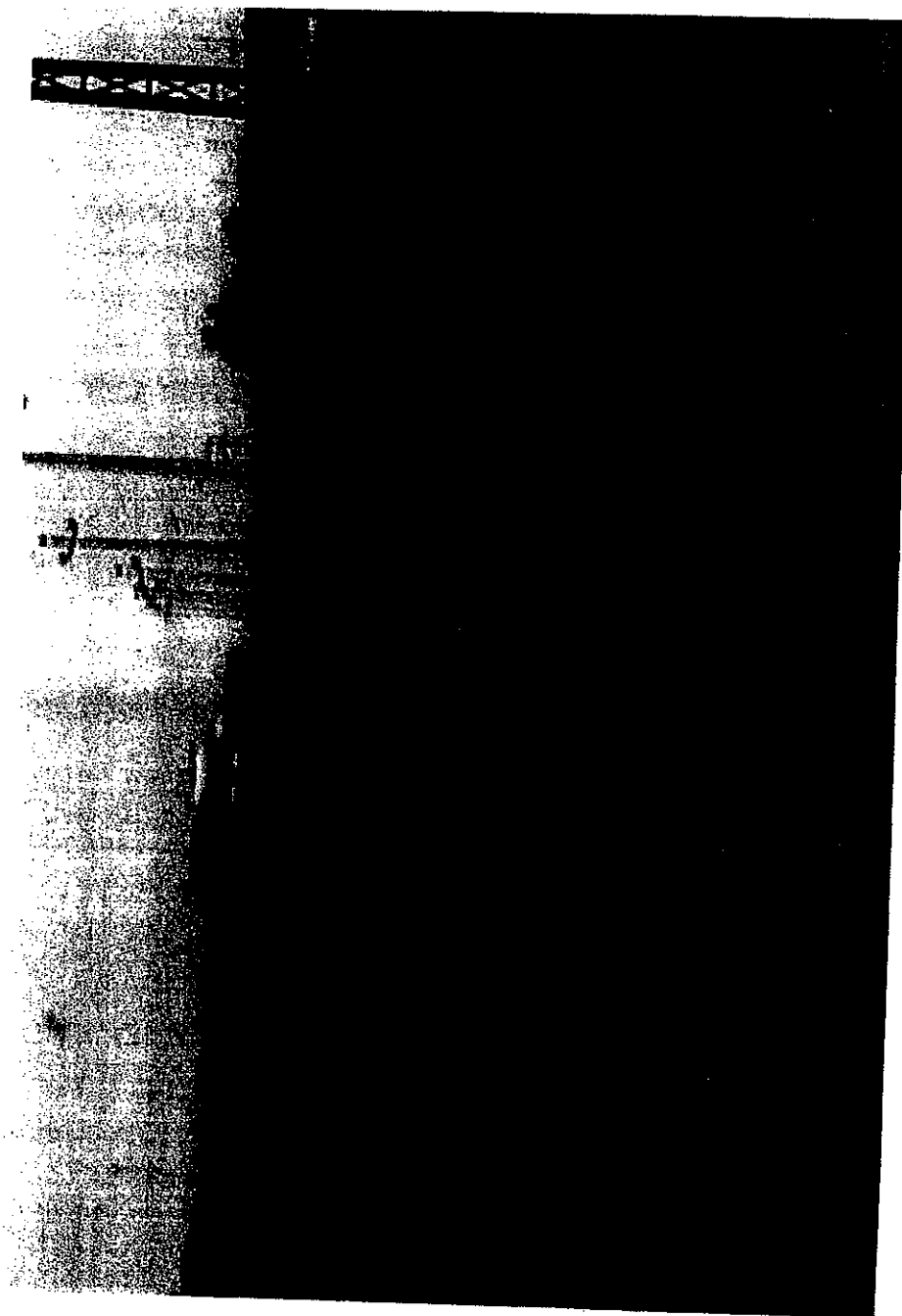

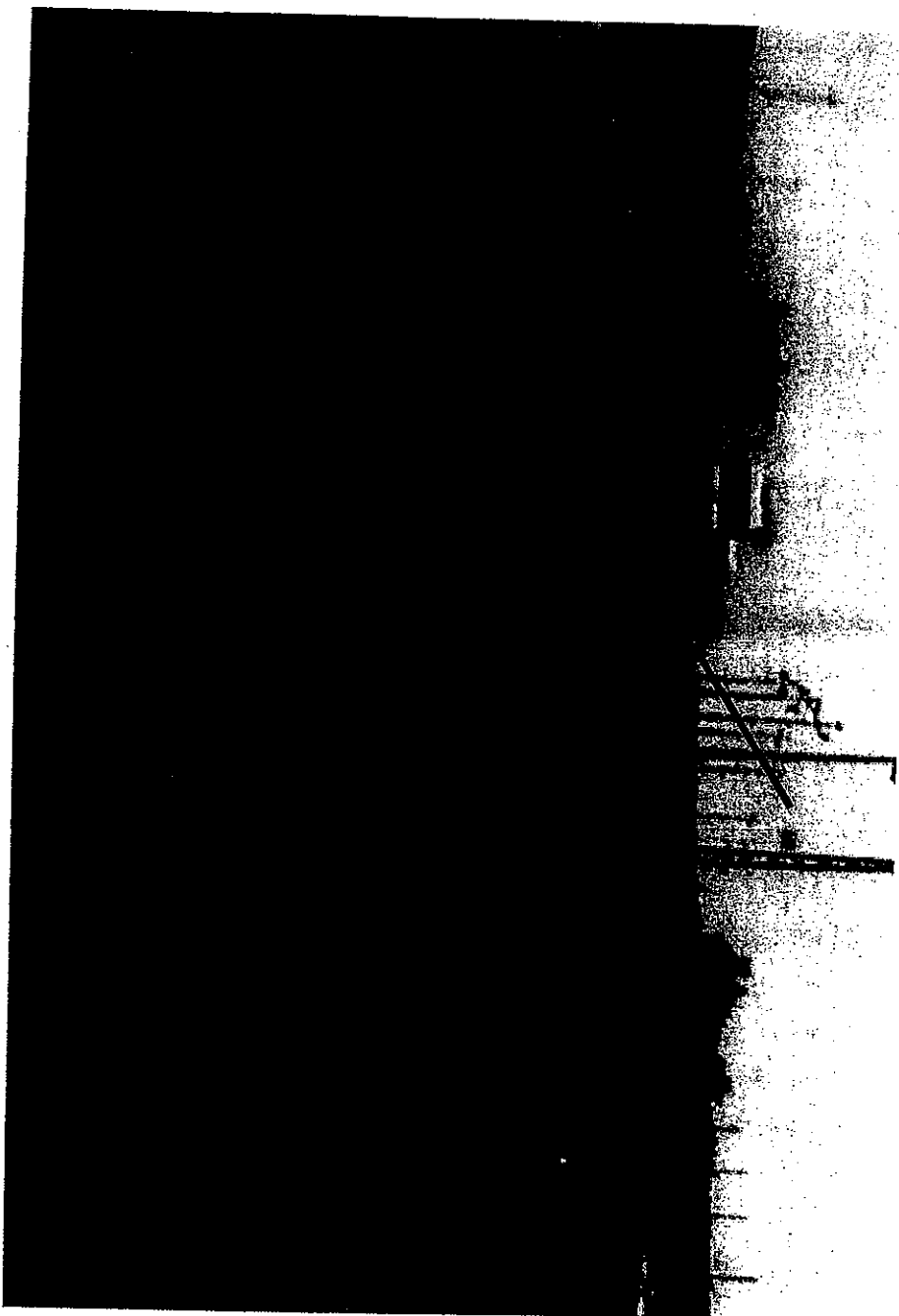

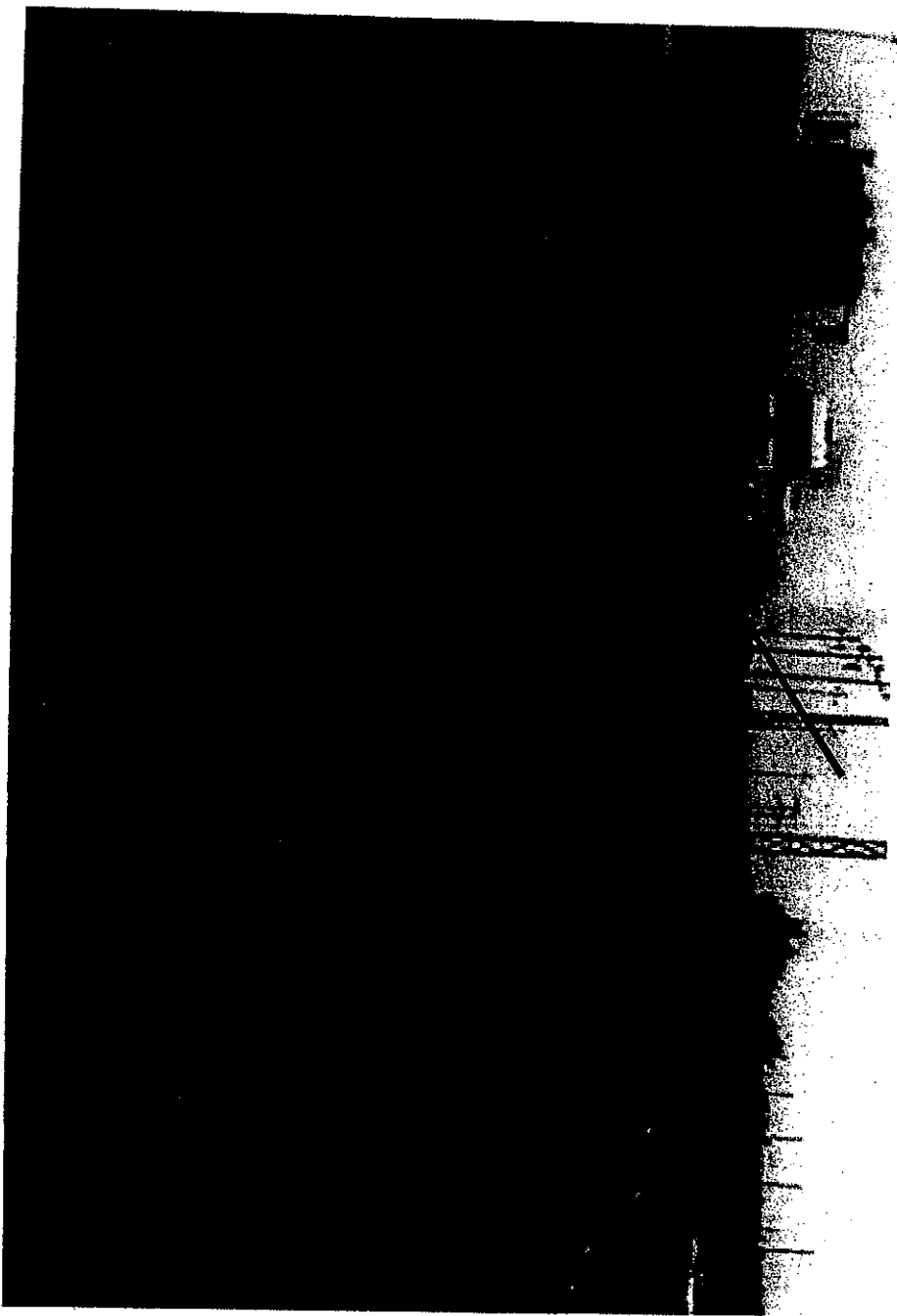
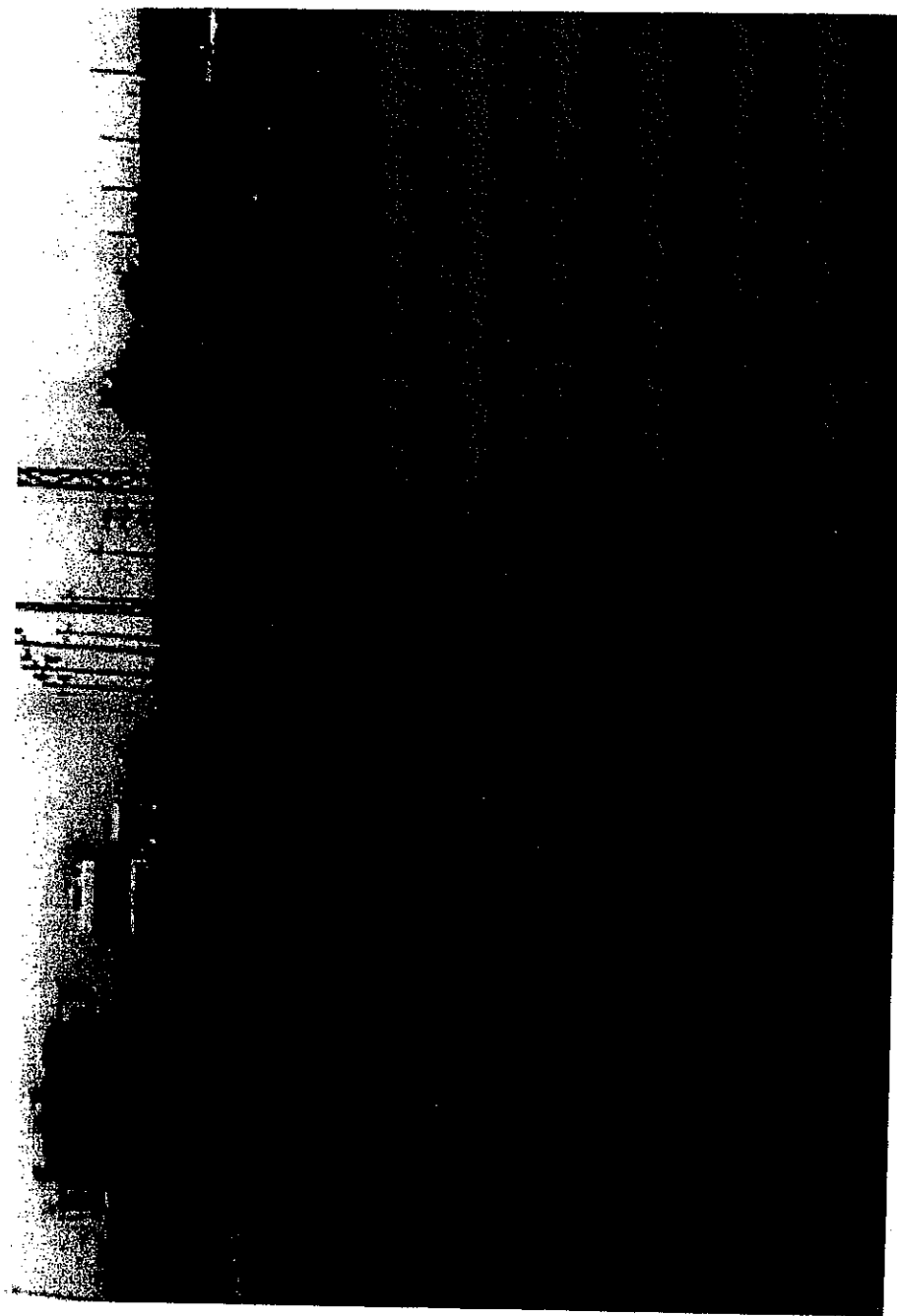

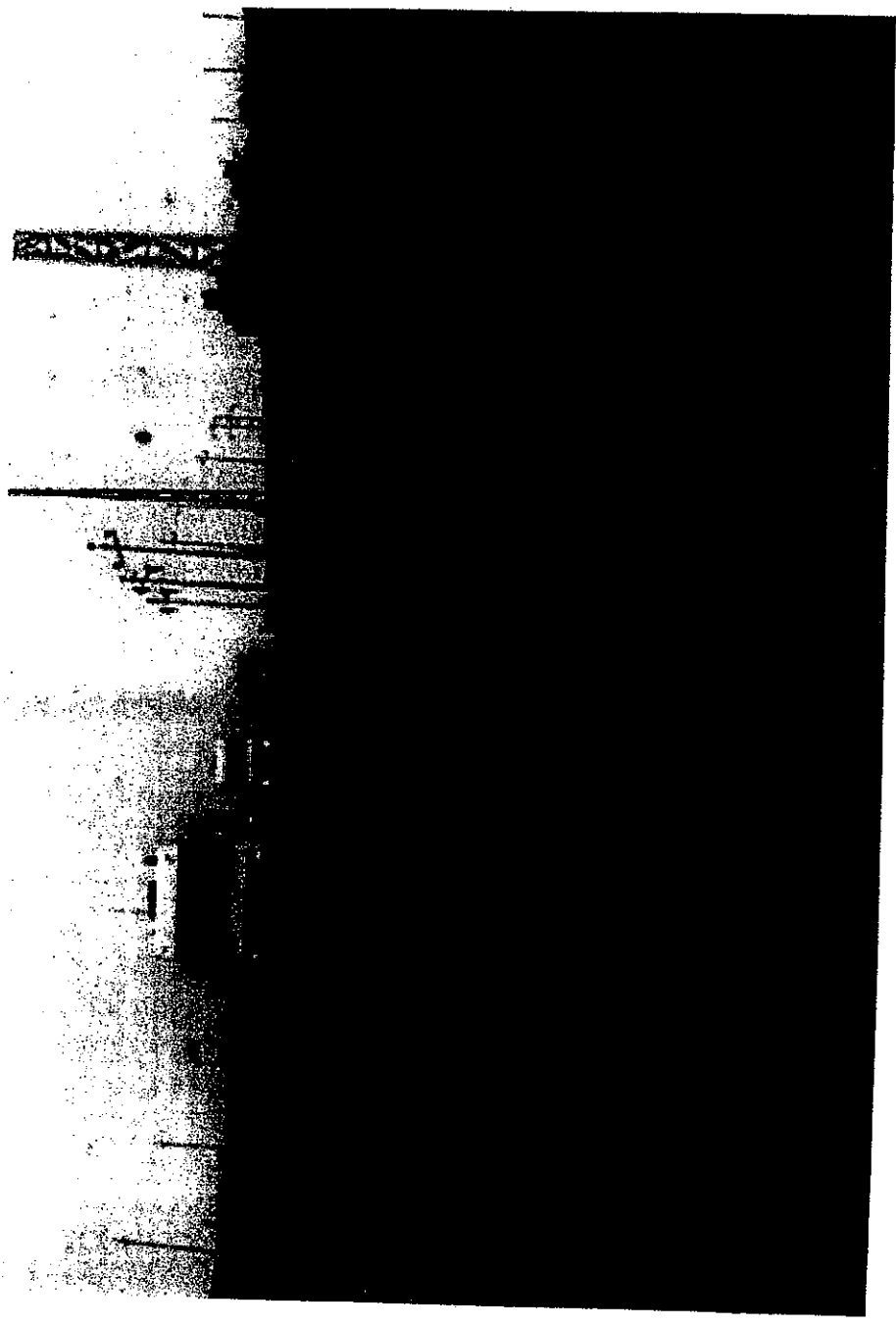

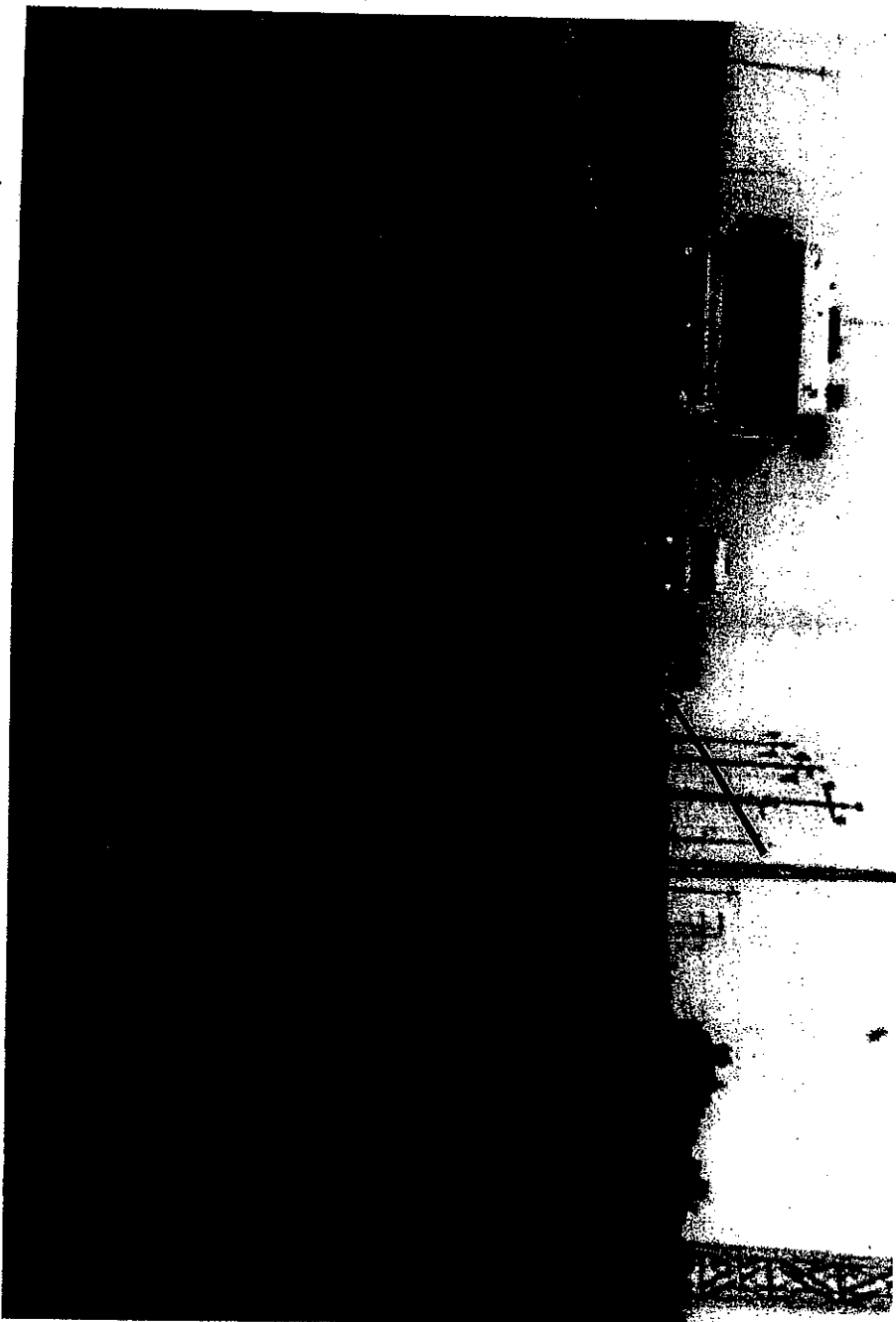
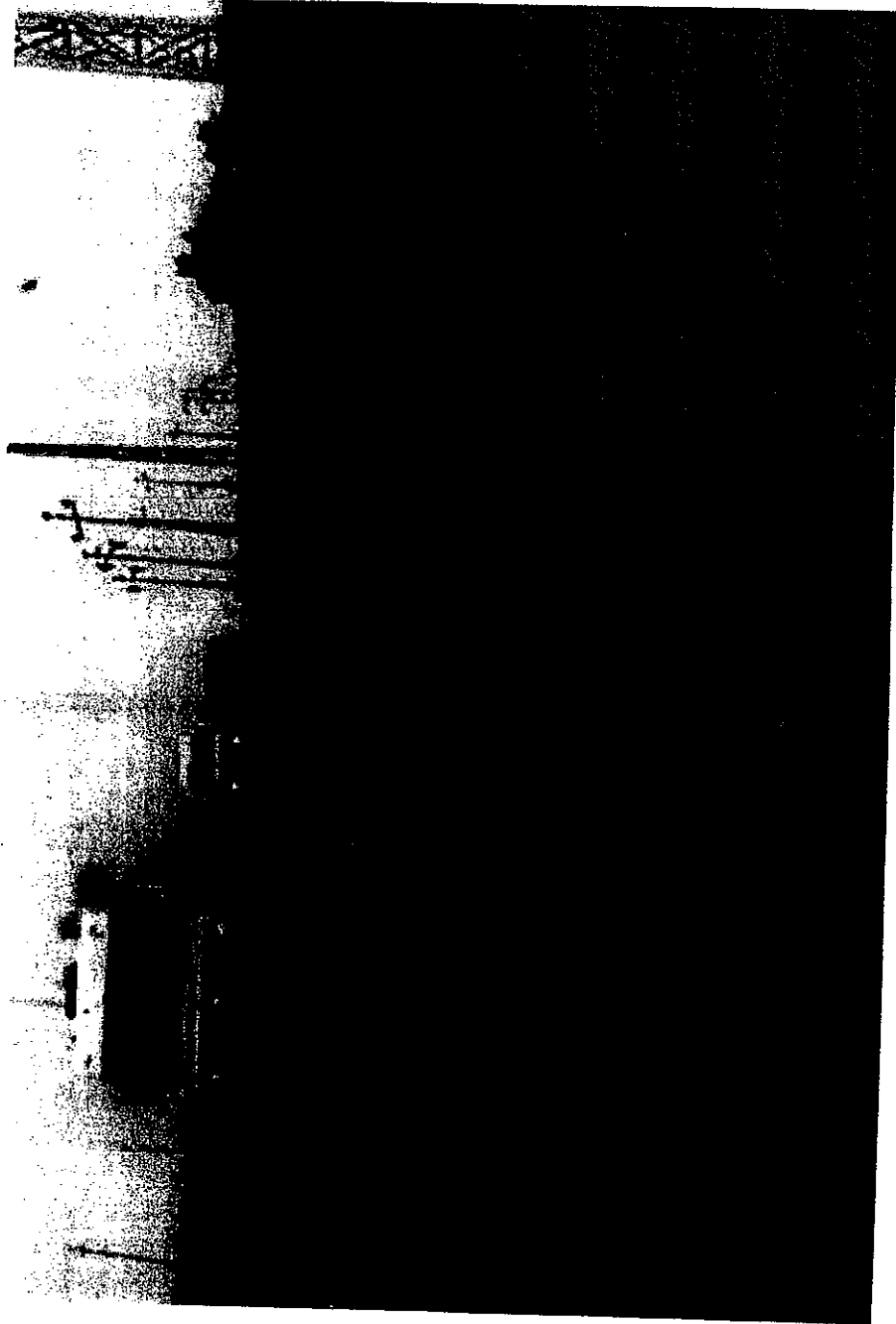

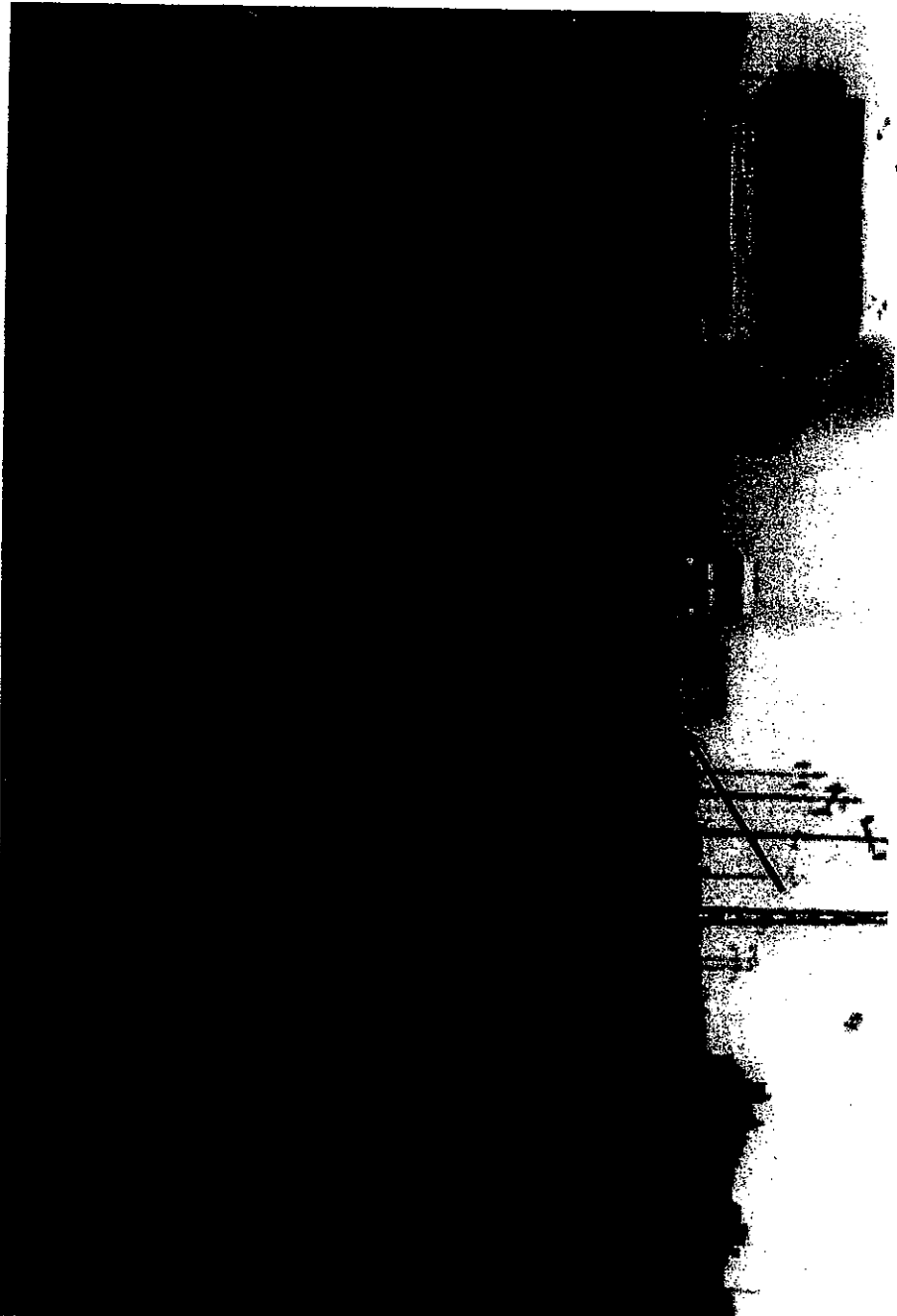
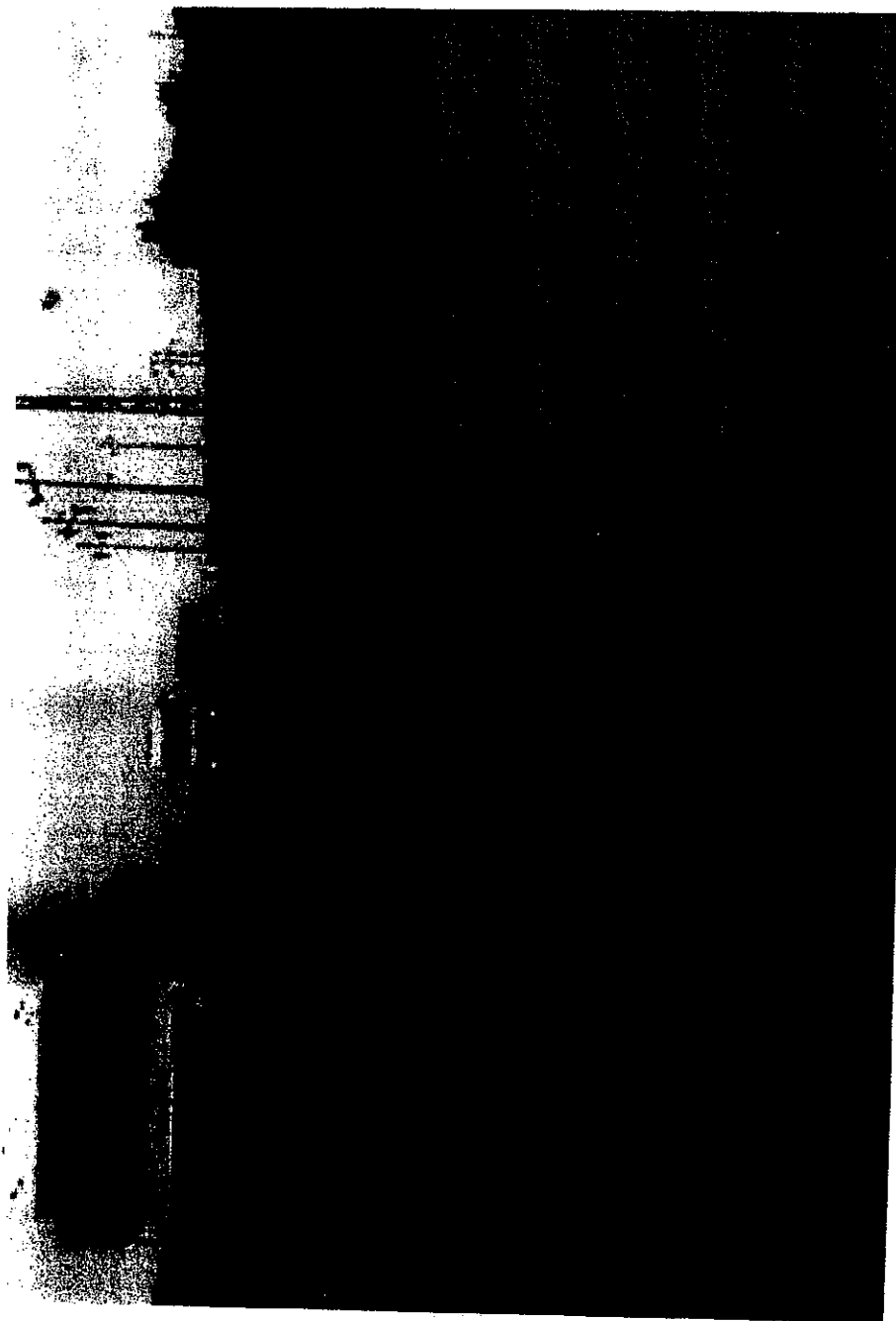

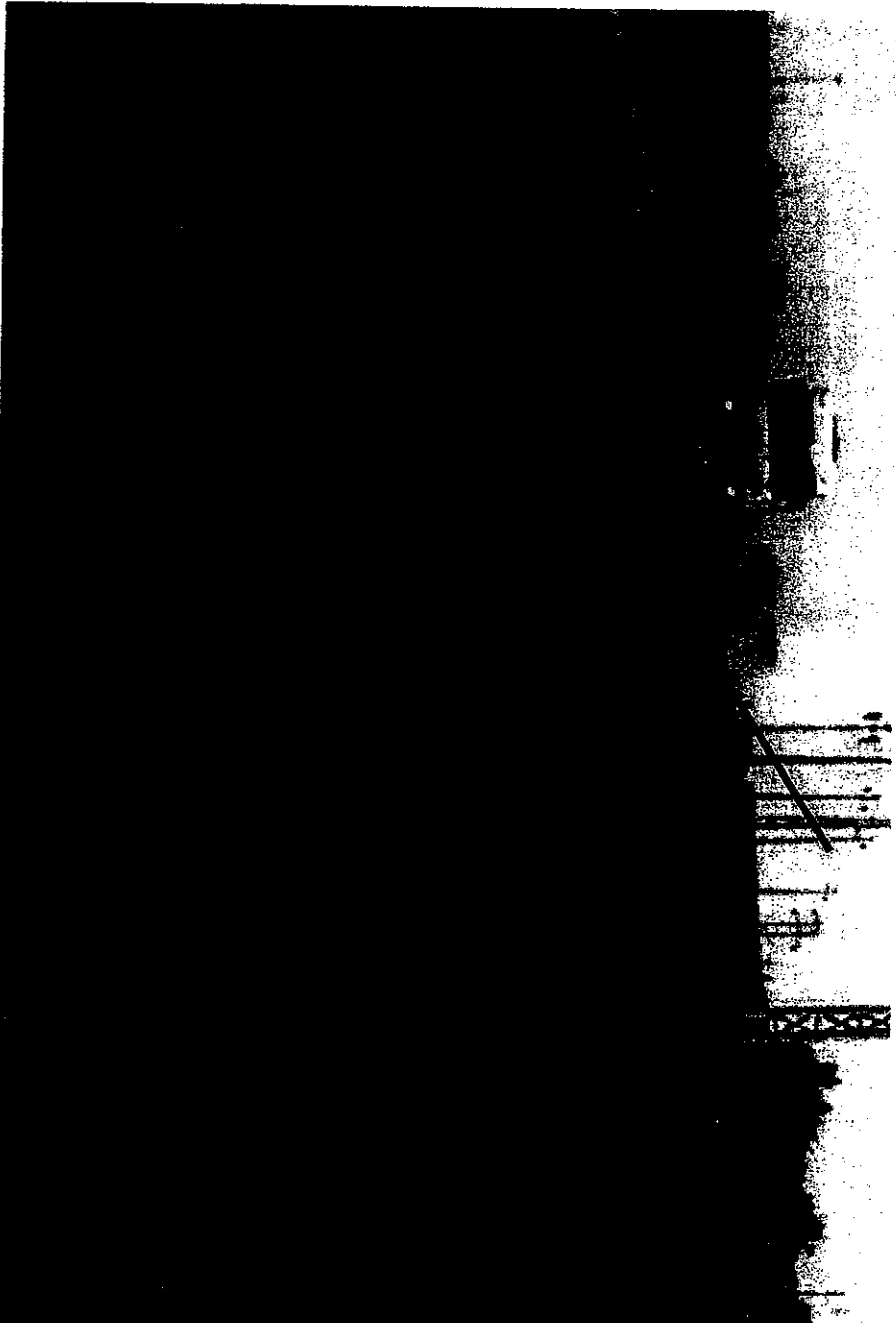

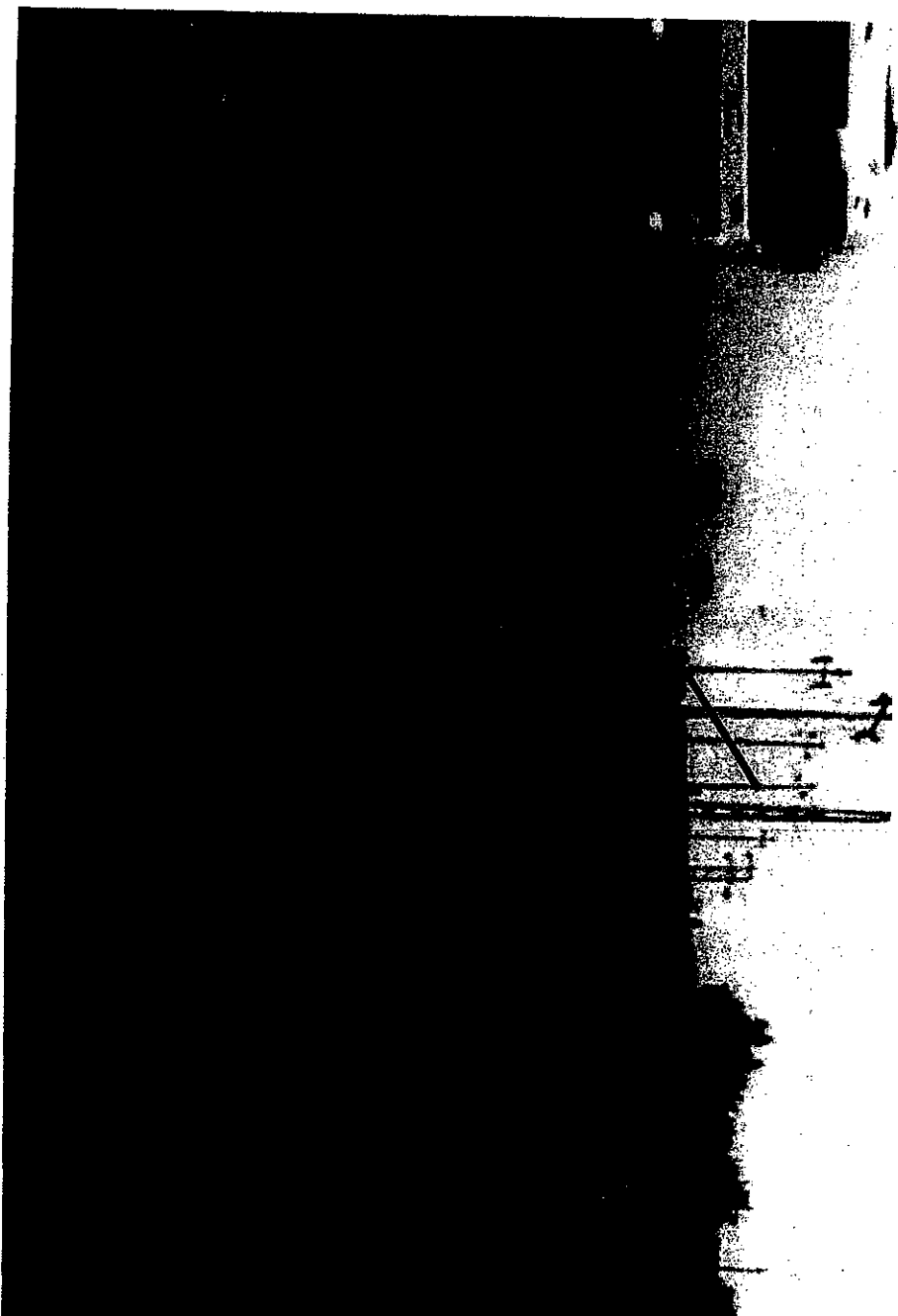
