What was the enemy threat you were briefed on Yakesh Chank? knew Yakesh Chank was a safe haven. Based off of previous reports, up to ACN loaders, but with everything they had or go to ground and try to evade. Believed they would fight b/c likely hood of finding cache, proximity to loaders. What was the enemy doing in and around Yakesh Chank on the 19th? Everything he received was through Co CP. Received that enemy vicinity HLEZ Grant and fighters in the village. SUBJECT: Appointment as AR 15-6 Informal Investigating Officer

1. You are hereby appointed as an investigating officer to conduct an informal investigation IAW AR 15-6 into the engagement between ISAF, ANSF, and enemy personnel that occurred on 20 October 2007 in the vicinity of Yakah Chinah in Kunar Province, Afghanistan which resulted in the deaths and serious injuries of local nationals.
2. The scope of the investigation should include the following:
 - a. The facts and circumstances surrounding the engagement on 20 October 2007;
 - b. The identities of those who were killed or injured, the nature and extent of those injuries and whether the injuries were caused by U.S., ANSF, or enemy forces;
 - c. The mission and purpose of the patrol at the time of the incident and the risk assessment conducted;
 - d. Whether the U.S. Forces complied with the Rules of Engagement and the Laws of Armed Conflict when they engaged the enemy personnel;
 - e. The efforts taken to treat any wounded civilians; and
 - f. Whether any condolence payments have been made to the injured or killed local nationals or if such payments would be appropriate;
3. This will be an informal AR 15-6 investigation. This will be your primary duty until completed and takes precedence over all other duties and assignments. All statements will be in written form and sworn, using DA Form 2823. If witnesses have redeployed, seek to conduct telephonic interviews of them at their home station.
4. If, during the course of the investigation, you suspect that anyone involved has violated any criminal laws, you should advise that person of their Article 31 Rights, prior to questioning. If anyone attempts to interfere with or obstruct your investigation, notify the appointing authority immediately.

5. Use AR 15-6 to guide the investigation. Consider any evidence in the investigation that you determine to be relevant and material to the incident. You should make appropriate findings and recommendations based on the facts gathered during the investigation. The completed investigation should include:

- a. This letter of appointment;
- b. A completed DA Form 1574;
- c. A memorandum for record with your findings and recommendations. Your findings are to be based on the facts you gather and your recommendations should include whether any adverse action is appropriate;
- d. An executive summary;
- e. An index of exhibits;
- f. A chronology of your investigation;
- g. All exhibits labeled in successive order;
- h. A list of all persons interviewed and those from who no statement was taken; and
- i. Proper classification markings.

6. If Afghanistan National Security Forces (ANSF) were involved in this incident, your findings and recommendations are to include any lessons learned you discover during the course of your investigation that may benefit the ANSF.

7. You may consider any evidence in your investigation that you determine to be relevant and material to the above areas. This investigation is your primary duty until completed and takes precedence over all other duties and assignments.

8. No military or civilian witnesses can be ordered to give testimony that may incriminate them. However, you can direct a military or civilian witness to provide testimony if you believe they have relevant information that is not incriminating.

9. CPT (b)(3), (b)(6) has been designated as your legal advisor. He will assist you with any legal issues that may arise during your investigation. He may be contacted at DSN (b)(2)High or (b)(3), (b)(6) @afghan.swa.army.mil.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: AR 15-6 Investigation into the 20 October 2007 engagement near Yakah Chinah, Kunar Province that resulted in the deaths and injuries of local nationals

1. I have reviewed the AR 15-6 investigation into the engagement that occurred on 20 October 2007 near the village of Yakah Chinah in Kunar Province. The investigating officer (IO) found that the engagement of the building was authorized by U.S. National Self Defense policy and that the On-Scene-Commander's (OSC) positive identification of the targeted compound as an imminent threat was appropriate under the circumstances. The Investigating Officer found that enemy forces were utilizing the building to maneuver on U.S. forces and to prepare attacks against U.S. forces. Although civilian casualties did result, the OSC's decision to engage the building in question was appropriate given the threat from the enemy fighters gathered there. I approve the findings and recommendations of the IO.
2. The recommendation to make condolence payments to the families of those who were killed or injured is returned to the unit for appropriate action.
3. The investigation is returned to the unit for appropriate action consistent with the Investigating Officer's findings and recommendations and my additional instruction above.

3), (b) On 19 October 2007 Battle Company took part in what was to be a large battalion sized operation made up of several company level operations to disrupt ACM C2 and logistical support. Battle Company made up of 30x ANA soldiers, an (b)(2)High 60mm mortar team, 2x scout sniper teams, and 2x infantry platoons with a C2 element was to conduct a 24 hour operation into OBJ Clark IVO Yaki Chinch.

(b)(2)High

Shortly after establish the C2 on LZ Cubs on the high ground to the east of the OBJ we began to pick up significant amounts of (b)(2)High that suggested the ACM were on the OBJ. They were talking about getting into position to attack (b)(2)High as they moved their elements from south to north from LZ Toucans. In support of the operation was (b)(2)High, AC-130, and (b)(2)High 2x AH-64s, in addition to (b)(2)High. These assets helped build the situational awareness needed to target the ACM properly. The (b)(2)High and (b)(2)High immediately began sending up targets based on (b)(2)High. Focusing the assets through the (b)(2)High we were able to PID ACM moving in and around the objective, and allowed us to strike first. Throughout the night (b)(2)High worked with us to engage several ACM on the OBJ and one ACM house. After (b)(2)High pushed off station (b)(2)High engaged those ACM that were egressing after the aftermath of (b)(2)High engagements. Engaging several ACM taking cover in the tree line and continuously using (b)(2)High to focus effects with the help of (b)(2)High.

(b)(2)High

(b)(2)High Once the ACM on the objective were neutralized we pushed the main effort and isolation force further north to isolate the objective. (b)(2)High established BP1 and used three positions to isolate the entire north, west, and southern sides of the objective IOT allow the ME FOM. The ME, (b)(2)High pushed further into the village at day break. Just afterwards (b)(2)High took SAF from an ACM trying to get into his perimeters. What ensued was a short lived SAF attack from the west in addition to the discovery of several RPGs that were near the ACM when he tried to get in the perimeter. (b)(2)High and his element quickly pushed through the attempt and destroyed the ACM. When arriving at the end of the blood trail they found 5 RPGs, and were right next to the home that was engaged the night prior by the (b)(2)High element. While taking SAF (b)(2)High was on station and (b)(2)High dropped 2x GBU's on the SBF position to the west of the OBJ, and immediately suppressed the ACM fire.

While conducting SSE on the house they noticed that no one was in the home anymore. There was no longer a blood trail either. On the outside of the home on the western side they found a cave that could hold in upwards of 15 ACM and multiple weapons for a large cache. After completing the SSE, they completed with pictures and continued with isolating the OBJ.

(b)(2)High began clearing OBJ Clark IOT disrupt ACM log and C2 elements. While clearing the OBJ they ran into several of the village elders including (b)(6) (b)(6). The elders immediately complained of civilian casualties, and in order to demonstrate our sorrow for their loss we called for a routine MEDEVAC of the non-combatants. During the previous nights events it was clear to me that some of the individuals in the home may not be ACM, but with (b)(2)High moving only meters away from the ACM location it was decided that we needed to eliminate the threat.

Hours later the non-combatants were MEDEVAC'd from the OBJ and (b)(2)High and ANA continued to clear. In the end they had located a total of 8 RPGs, 5 boosters, a pistol, shotgun, AK-47, magazines, and quite a bit of propaganda and ACM kit. The caches were found in the homes on the OBJ by the ANA while conducting the clearance. In Compound #2 the floor had loose dirt on the top of it and sure enough as the ANA moved the dirt out of the way they found a false floor that had a suitcase with propaganda with a pistol belt and holster as we

Throughout the day (b)(2)Hig and (b)(2)Hig were in contact on the best way to turn the situation in our favor despite the destruction of ACM on the objective. Perception was reality and although ACM were killed the locals only saw what they wanted. Therefore, (b)(2)Hig and (b)(2)Hig decided to hold a security shura on the following day with all the elders. They would receive 4 bundles of humanitarian assistance in conjunction with it as well. Demonstrating that with the arrival of the government officials comes support and needed items. (b)(2)Hig arrived with a government official, CDR(3), (b) from the PRT, and (b)(2)Hig to push themes of the information campaign. We talked about the small rewards program and pushed that sensors and cameras were everywhere and that with them we could see their daily activity. The elders quickly bought on. CDR(3), (b) and the GoA official spoke about the road project and the ability to increase traffic ability of lumber and ease with which they could get the sick to the hospital. In the end the shura went well and the reception afterwards when (b)(2)Hig handed out the HA was remarkable. Later that night Battle Company air assaulted to HLZ's (b)(2)Hig to clear OBJ Taylor IOT disrupt ACM C2 and logistical support nodes. (b)(2)Hig would push from north to south to clear OBJ Taylor North while (b)(2)Hig would clear from northwest to southeast IOT prevent ACM C2 and logistical support areas along the Sawtalo Sar spur. Next they would clear OBJ Taylor West once they completed the clearance on the spur. The company C2 would establish a CP in a location IVO LZ Polk at the western edge on OBJ Taylor North. On 22 OCT 2007 (b)(2)Hig made his way to LZ Eagles and established a patrol base with security on the high ground of several hill tops. The company C2 element was in the same position located on LZ Polk in order to allow the Legion element proper LOS to provide up to the minute intel. (b)(2)Hig finished his clearance of the Abas Ghar ridge to OBJ Taylor and cleared it. Of note, OBJ Taylor had been destroyed by several bombs, artillery rounds, and mortar rounds from previous fights and there was nothing significant to report about the OBJ. The C2 element with (b)(2)Hig pushed out RNS patrol around LZ Eagles and discovered several (5) caves that would support up to 45 ACM if needed. With signs of life in each we were certain that these were ACM hideouts. The caves were documented and sent to higher.

Throughout the day (b)(2)Hig imminent attacks on (b)(2)Hig and the C2 element. They were whispering to one another about getting into position, and (b)(2)Hig used IDF and artillery to try and push the element back in order to disrupt their plans. (b)(2)Hig Throughout the day the (b)(2)Hig continued. At the end of the day there was still not activity. We believe that with use of CAS and CCA on station ICW IDF and artillery being used to disrupt we pushed the attack off. Towards the end of the night we received word from (b)(2)Hig that we would be extended for another 24 hours because the Bravo 1-508th was going to be emplaced into the Shuryak. This forced me to hold off on several Objectives in order to ensure I was able to block and interdict ACM from the Shuryak and the Korengal from reinforcing. I pushed (b)(2)Hig from moving onto OBJ Taylor East in favor of keeping the BPI established. Also pushed (b)(2)Hig off from clearing Obj Taylor West in favor of interdicting ACM leaving Chichal and Landigal to reinforce in the Shuryak. On 23 OCT 2007, the day started as normal with (b)(2)Hig indicating that they wanted to attack. (b)(2)Hig gave the order for (b)(2)Hig to push out small kill teams in the high ground to destroy and interdict ACM as they moved into position for attacks.

(b)(2)Hig Once I got the word from (b)(2)Hig that his elements were set in position we began receiving more (b)(2)Hig from the man whispering the day prior. Just as SSG3, (b) and SPC(3), (b) were changing out of their snivel gear and into something lighter (b)(2)Hig and the C2 element came under a heavy volume of PKM and SAF from the north. Followed shortly thereafter from the south and then the west. Effective PKM fire was pinning the C2 element down and (b)(2)Hig as well. As reports continued to come in it was evident immediately that we had 2x US KIA. Immediately (b)(2)Hig called for immediate suppression with 120mm and 155mm on targets of ACM SBF positions. The 60mm mortars were used to suppress the enemy up close as they were moving closer on the (b)(2)Hig elements. During the fight communications were lost with (b)(2)Hig and WC1 elements. (b)(2)Hig immediately got on the net and told (b)(2)Hig and his elements that they needed to push immediately to the position to get a sitrep and SA. As they pushed (b)(2)Hig moved to see the fight. Money shot reported hearing Afghan speakers in the caves to the south where were taking fire from and (b)(2)Hig assembled a small element to clear the caves on their way to (b)(2)Hig to reinforce. Leaving (b)(2)Hig with the C2 element on Polk. (b)(2)Hig took 6 pax and cleared the caves. With SSG (b)(3), (b)(6) SPC(3), (b) Airman (b)(3), (b)(6) SPC(3), (b)(6) and one of the (b)(2)Hig SGTs they threw hand grenades in support of their movement through the caves. Engaging likely ACM in caves as they cleared towards (b)(2)Hig. While taking SAF on the way down intermittently the element was successful in reaching LZ Eagles in time to see SSG3, (b) and SPC(3), (b)(6) off. (b)(2)Hig ordered (b)(2)Hig to augment his element with a team to help secure the HLZ while (b)(2)Hig was continuing to fight his way to (b)(2)Hig. At about this time the fire stopped and CCA and CAS arrived on station. Several strikes with ordinance on a home that was used by ACM for a SBF were engaged. Then CCA was used to conduct gun runs on ACM exfiltrating back to Landigal and into Chichal. There were several ACM blood trails from (b)(2)Hig position that led to Landigal. Not wanting to be overextended (b)(2)Hig held the platoon back from moving to Landigal.

Shortly afterwards (b)(2)Hig worked up a scheme of maneuver with (b)(2)Hig to move into Landigal. While continuing the planning, (b)(2)Hig ordered the C2 element to consolidate and to augment (b)(2)Hig with his security in preparation for movement into Landigal. The C2 element moved that evening to (b)(2)Hig position. Established a CP and began receiving reports from an Arabic that items were left behind and that they would attack tomorrow. Reports continued to come in that this would occur throughout the night.

As the night went on a resupply occurred and security was tightened with (b)(2)Hig overseeing the security of the perimeter. On the 24 OCT 2007, (b)(2)Hig again picked up and talked about an eventual attack. As the day prior we were ready, only this time we were a large element with less distance between element and the security posture was more alert. The attack started as the previous days did with SAF and PKM from the north followed by the south and then another attempt at the hill. (b)(2)Hig and the WC element were throwing hand grenades and CCA was used to engage and push them back. CCA continued to engage while IDF and artillery were used as well. CCA continued to pick up ACM exfiltrating off the Sawtalo Sar Spur towards (b)(2)Hig and engaged with rockets and 30mm. Dude engaged with several strikes on structures that supported the SBF of the PKM. This attack was less intense and was initiated by the ANA when they saw the ACM moving into place. This allowed us to get the upper hand and didn't allow them to get in close as they did the day prior. ter that night we conducted resupply and false extractions from LZ Eagles which based on (b)(2)High made the ACM believe we had left. Based on this we were able to gain an upper hand on the enemy. As the next day came the ACM were looking for us and wondering about the number of troops in the area. (b)(2)High moved that night into place along the Gatigal Spur south of the village of Landigal to isolate it to the south. The C2 element moved further to the west towards (b)(2)High (2)Hi where we would be able to overwatch and isolate (b)(2)High as he moved into Landigal from the east. After in place (2)H moved from east to west towards Landigal arriving shortly after day break in order to clear the village to disrupt ACM C2 and log support nodes.

Once (2)H arrived (b)(2)High throughout the morning. AC were talking about shooting helicopters, and moving into position on the element on "top". Believing that they were talking about the C2 element we used CCA and CAS to conduct shows of force over NAIs, and IDF and artillery for disruption fires on known ACM locations. Believing that this allowed us FOM we brought in (2)Hiç and (b)(6) for a shura with the Landigal elders.

The security shura went without a hitch. CCA was used for (2)Hiç and to show force and power to the ACM. Shortly after the shura ended (2)Hiç and the Governor left while (2)H handed out HA to the local villagers. As they were doing so (b)(2)High picked up that they were moving towards our positions on the high ground. Using IDF and artillery again to disrupt we shot targets to prevent them from moving on us. Thinking again that the ACM would be in the same area as before we expected the C2 to be attacked rather than (b)(2)High as they were such a large element. As the C2 element broke down and moved to LZ Relish we found the DSHKA site with several rounds and casings lying around, but no weapon. (b)(2)High indicated they saw us and were moving into position. Again using 120mm we hit targets ISO the C2 exfil. The UH-60s and AH-64s were on station and the first bird left Relish for the KOP.

As I hit the ground at the KOP I heard the fire fight in the background. I ran to the CP and began to C2. (2)H was engaged in a near ambush with several casualties. I quickly ordered the CCA to engage just north and west of his location, but they wouldn't or couldn't. Either way they wasted time by not getting out of my airspace after 10 minutes of me telling them to engage something to suppress or leave so that I could shoot 120mm and artillery. The (b)(2)High element wouldn't answer. Once I told them to leave or possibly be hit by mortars they responded and left. Immediately shooting targets with 155mm and 120mm we began to suppress the enemy. Using the (2)H element to drop ordinance on ACM exfilling as well from DIVPAT we were successful in suppressing the enemy. (2)Hi was ordered to immediately reinforce from the east and did so. (2)H moved from Landigal to secure the west of (b)(2)High and the bridge across the river to Alia Bad. In doing so they engaged several ACM in Marasti Naw as well. (2)Hiç element checked on station and was able to engage several ACM to the east of the ambush location heading to Qalaygal as did (b)(2)High was used to watch for exfilling ACM while (b)(2)High cleared the rest of the spur in search of ACM and US equipment. They found 2x AKs, 1x ACM dead, 1x (2)Hiç and several papers. During the fight the (2)Hiç from the KOP was launched to Alia Bad to secure the GLOCs in case MEDEVAC through the air was unable to occur. Fortunately the MEDEVAC using hoists was possible and after three trips was complete (b)(3), (b)(6)
