THIS IS AN OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM (OEF) INVESTIGATION.

This Report of Investigation (ROI) was initiated at the direction of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations (DCSOPS), USACIDC, Fort Belvoir, VA, regarding soldiers assigned to 2nd Platoon, B Co, 2nd Battalion, 22nd Infantry, (2/22nd Inf Bn), Fort Drum, NY (FDNY), who allegedly participated in the abuse or maltreatment of detainees (Persons Under U.S. Control (PUC)) while deployed in support OEF. The original complaint was initiated under USACIDC ROI 0078-04-CID369-69288, by the Afghanistan Military Police Detachment (MP Det) (CID), APO AE 09354.

On 24 Jun 04, the Afghanistan MP Det (CID) obtained a compact disk (CD) containing digital images of what appeared to be abuse and maltreatment of detainees under the control of members of 2nd Platoon, B Co, 2/22nd Inf Bn, while deployed to Afghanistan. A review of the CD disclosed digital images of uniformed Soldiers pointing pistols and M-4 rifles at the heads of bound and hooded detainees, at what was subsequently identified as Fire Base (FB) Tycze, Dah Rah Wod (DRW), Afghanistan. One image on the CD identified during the preliminary investigation by the Afghanistan MP Det (CID), appeared to depict a dead local national from apparent gunshot wounds; it was not known whether the death was combat related or a result of foul play.

Investigation determined the deceased local national was shot after he launched an armed attack against a guard post on FB Tycze in which three soldiers were seriously wounded.

Investigation established probable cause to believe PFC [REDACTED] SGT [REDACTED], SPC [REDACTED], SPC [REDACTED], SPC [REDACTED], SSG [REDACTED], and PFC [REDACTED] committed the offense of dereliction of duty, when as guards detailed to secure and protect detainees, they willfully failed to perform their duties with no reasonable or just excuse, by jokingly pointing weapons at the bound detainees, and exposed photographs of this unwarranted activity.

Investigation established the offense of aggravated assault did not occur as initially reported, in respect to PFC [REDACTED], SGT [REDACTED], SPC [REDACTED], SPC [REDACTED], SPC [REDACTED], SPC [REDACTED], SSG [REDACTED], and PFC [REDACTED]. Investigation did not establish credible information to indicate an intent on behalf of these individuals to harm the PUC's, and no evidence identified to indicate the bound detainees were in fear for their lives, or of grievous bodily harm, or even aware weapons were being pointed at them as depicted in the images.

Investigation established probable cause to believe SPC [REDACTED] committed the offenses of accessory before the fact and false official statement, when he exposed photographs of referenced soldiers pointing weapons at the detainees and later rendering a sworn statement

denying any participation in such activity; a statement he knew at the time to be false.

Investigation established probable cause to believe SPC [REDACTED] committed the offense of assault consummated by a battery, when he punched a bound detainee in the back of the head.

This investigation was terminated in accordance with paragraph 4-17a (5) and (12), CIDR 195-1, where in the supported SJA was of the opinion sufficient admissible evidence was available to prosecute the subjects for the listed offenses, and further investigative activity would no result in the identification of additional subjects or offenses; and the supported commander indicated an intent to take action amounting to less than a courts-martial, and no further assistance from the USACIDC was required.

As a result of early termination, investigative efforts to fully identify, locate, and interview individuals referenced in certain statements, who were not assigned to B Co, 2/22d Inf Bn (e.g. SF Soldiers at FB Tycze), were not accomplished. A supplemental report will be generated on receipt of the laboratory findings on evidence submitted for forensic examination.

Basis for Investigation: About 1310, 13 Jul 04, the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations (DCSOPS), USACIDC, Fort Belvoir, VA 22060, directed this office initiate a ROI in relation to a Request for Assistance (RFA) from the Afghanistan MP Det (CID), pertaining to alleged detainee maltreatment by members of B Co, 2/22nd Inf Bn, FNDY, under ROI 0078-04-CID369-69288.

Agent's Comment: For reader clarification, this AIR incorporates investigative activity conducted under the original RFA (0122-04-CID452) prior to 13 Jul 04 when the CID DCSOPS directed the Fort Drum CID to manage the ROI pertaining to this incident. Further, the letter P followed by a number (P-1 thru 21) refers to photographs of suspected detainee abuse produced from the CD found in the SJA office in Afghanistan, containing images of suspected detainee abuses. Distribution of the photographic packet (Exhibit 02) produced from the CD is limited to specific recipients of this report, and was used during this investigation to facilitate interviews and to ensure accurate descriptions and identification of the of images.

About 1640, 2 Jul 04, CPT [redacted] ^{b7c-2, b6-3}, Office of the Staff Judge Advocate (SJA), FDNY, was interviewed by SA [redacted] ^{b7c-1, b6-1} and SA [redacted], regarding his knowledge of the CD found in the SJA office in Afghanistan. CPT [redacted] ^{b7c-1, b6-7} rendered a sworn statement wherein he had no knowledge of the existence of the CD while in Afghanistan. (See AIR of SA [redacted] and statement for details).

About 2145, 2 Jul 04, 1SG [redacted] ^{b7c-4, b6-4}, HHC, 2/22nd Inf Bn, FDNY was interviewed by SA [redacted] and rendered sworn statement where in he claimed he had no knowledge concerning the existence of the CD found in the Afghanistan office. 1SG [redacted] ^{b7c-4, b6-4} identified SSG [redacted] ^{b7c-4, b6-4} SFC [redacted] ^{b7c-4, b6-4} and PVT [redacted], all of B Co, 2/22nd Inf Bn, in some of the photographs. 1SG [redacted] described the images of what appeared to be bound Soldiers, as an activity called PUC'ing (Person Under Control); a ritualistic activity done on birthdays, re-enlistments, and similar events, by fellow platoon members. In respect to the photographs of Soldiers pointing weapons at bound and hooded detainees, 1SG [redacted] ^{b7c-4, b6-4} stated such activity was not sanctioned by the unit SOP or any level of the command. (See statement for details)

About 1045, 06 Jul 04, SA [redacted] ^{b7c-1, b6-1} interviewed CPT [redacted] ^{b7c-3, b6-3}, Legal Claims, Staff Judge Advocate (SJA), FDNY, who was also deployed in the theater of operations where the CD was initially found. CPT [redacted] stated he had no knowledge as to where the CD originated, or how it came to be found in the former SJA office there. He did not recall seeing the CD while deployed there. CPT [redacted] stated there were numerous boxes in his office, which he never looked through, and believed the CD was put in his office after he left on or about 1 Apr 04. CPT [redacted] recalled one instance where an interpreter (NFI) gave him a disc and asked him to put some photographs on it. CPT [redacted] related he never looked at the CD, and never got around to putting any images on it. CPT [redacted] asked the interpreter whether he wanted the CD returned; however, the interpreter told him not to worry about it. He described the interpreter as a thin, Middle Eastern male, about 5'6", who normally wore "preppy" clothing, and worked at the Bagram Collection Point.

^{b7c-3, b6-3} CPT [redacted] was unsure whether that particular CD was the CD found with the questioned images found in the SJA office. CPT [redacted] related he did not know anyone from 2/22nd Inf Bn personally; however, he had clients in his office from the unit for claims and legal assistance issues (NFI).

^{b7c-3, b6-3} About 1430, 6 Jul 04, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} [redacted] and SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} [redacted], this office, coordinated with 1SG [redacted] B Co, 2/22nd Inf Bn, FDNY, and determined the entire company was on block leave through the end of Jul 04. 1SG [redacted] provided copies of all leave forms and a tracking sheet generated by the unit to assist in locating individuals for interviews.

About 1745, 6 Jul 04, SA ^{b7c-1, b6-1} [redacted] and INT ^{b7c-2, b6-2} [redacted], this office, interviewed PFC [redacted] B Co, 2/22nd Inf Bn, FDNY, who stated he deployed to Afghanistan at the end of July 03 with 2nd platoon. His duties included grenadier and guard at FB Tycze. PFC [redacted] stated he was deployed from Jul 03 to approximately Dec 03, at which time he went on emergency leave, and the returned and was at FB Tycze. He stated his duties included patrol, guard duty, and detainee guard. PFC [redacted] stated after his mission in FB Tycze, his platoon was assigned to Qualot until April 04, after which he returned to Kandahar for redeployment. PFC [redacted] stated the detainees lived in suitable living conditions, which subsequently improved when the new PUC facility was built. PFC [redacted] stated he felt they lived in better conditions than the soldiers. PFC [redacted] was shown the images taken from the CD. After view several images contained in a photographic packet PFC [redacted] identified SSG [redacted] and SFC [redacted] as the individuals depicted in P-1, and PVT [redacted] in P-2. PFC [redacted] believed SPC [redacted] was depicted in P-4, since SPC [redacted] was the only one PUC'd in the old PUC facility. PFC [redacted] defined this particular conduct (being PUC'd), as a sort of "right of passage" or event, which occurred on birthdays and special events, and was done in and aspect of camaraderie. He was not aware of any individual ever complaining about being PUC'd, and everyone who was went along with the activity. PFC [redacted] identified the individual depicted in P-7 as PFC [redacted] HHC, 2/22nd Inf Bn, FDN, when he was PUC'd. PFC [redacted] stated he did not witness the event occur and believed it happened on PFC [redacted] birthday. PFC [redacted] was unable to identify any individuals from P-7 through P-9. PFC [redacted] stated he was unaware of any detainees being treated inhumanely and was shocked to see individuals from his unit would participate in this sort of behavior. When asked to define maltreatment, PFC [redacted] stated it would be hitting, slapping, or general mistreatment of other individuals. PFC [redacted] stated the activity depicted in the photographs he viewed was abuse and maltreatment. PFC [redacted] stated no standard operating procedure (SOP) was published by the chain of command, or by the Special Force (SF) leadership at FB Tycze. PFC [redacted] stated they were authorized to play loud music and keep detainees awake if the interrogators wanted them to. PFC [redacted] stated they kept the detainees awake by holding them up or by playing the loud music. PFC [redacted] further related the detainees were only kept at the facility from only a few days to about to a week. PFC [redacted] related P-11 depicted tower one at FB Tycze, after it was struck by a rocket-propelled grenade (RPG) from an Afghanistan male. PFC [redacted] stated this occurred about 0145, 18 Jan 04, while he was on

duty in tower three, which was located across the FB. PFC [redacted] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} stated that there had been machine gun fire the entire night and closer to the time of the attack the gunfire started impacting within the FB. At the time of the attack, he heard three loud explosions and turned back to see tower one had become engulfed in flames. He observed two soldiers blown out of the tower and soldiers firing from the area where the attack came from. PFC [redacted] stated the individual depicted in P-20 was the individual who attacked the guard tower that night. PFC [redacted] all the photographs he viewed were taken at FB Tycze, to the best of his knowledge, and was not aware of any 2/22nd Inf Bn members or the SF soldiers and interrogators at the FB do anything unusual or treat anyone inhumanely. (See photographic packet for details)

Agent's Comment: PFC [redacted] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} declined to provide a written statement documenting the above information.

Between 1850 and 1930, 6 Jul 04, SA [redacted] ^{b7C-1, b6-1} and INT [redacted] ^{b7C-2, b6-2} searched PFC [redacted] ^{b7C-4, b6-4} residence, pursuant to his written consent, for any additional images, cameras, or digital storage media. Nothing of evidentiary value was identified. (See Consent to Search)

About 1030, 7 Jul 04, SGT [redacted] ^{b7C-5, b6-5} was interviewed by SA [redacted] ^{b7C-1, b6-1}. SGT [redacted] ^{b7C-5, b6-5} described his duties in Afghanistan. When shown P-20, depicting what appeared to be a dead foreign national, he described the circumstances surrounding an RPG attack on the FB. He described these images as "bad" ones, which probably should not have been exposed. When asked about the photographs depicted in P-8, P-9, and P-10, he stated he had no knowledge of them. He admitted to exposing and downloading some images of the detainees onto SPC [redacted] ^{b7C-5, b6-5} laptop computer. At this point, SGT [redacted] was advised of his rights, based on his spontaneous admission to exposing and downloading images of detainees. SGT [redacted] invoked his right legal counsel, and the interview was terminated. (See AIR of SA [redacted] and Rights Warning Procedure/Waiver Certificate for details)

SPC [REDACTED] stated SSG [REDACTED] was putting together a CD for the platoon on the computer, using the photographs from Afghanistan. SA [REDACTED] seized the computer, along with a Fuji digital camera, and three compact discs, which SPC [REDACTED] indicated might contain additional images. About 1050, 9 Jul 04, SA [REDACTED] and INT [REDACTED] this office, interviewed SSG [REDACTED] B Co, 2/22nd Inf Bn, FDNY, who stated he was assigned to B Co, 2/22nd while the unit was assigned to FB Tycze, Afghanistan. SSG [REDACTED] stated his platoon was at FB Tycze from Dec 03 to Feb 04, and he served as a squad leader. He stated the only guidance on the handling of the detainees was to cover their heads with sandbags and flexi cuff them. SSG [REDACTED] stated the original detainee location was a temporary fenced in area, after which a cement building with four areas was built to hold detainees. He stated the detainees were given mats to sleep on and food and water whenever they asked for it. He stated weapons were allowed in the detainee area and there was suppose to be two soldiers guarding the detainees at all times. SSG [REDACTED] stated the overall living condition for the detainees was good. He stated while in Afghanistan he only used a disposable camera. SSG [REDACTED] stated he never observed any detainee abuse or rumors of any detainee abuse. He stated the dead local national died after being shot by the SF Soldiers (NFI) and members of his platoon after the local national attacked the camp with an RPG. He stated he does not know if any formal investigation was conducted after the attack/shooting. SSG [REDACTED] stated he was not on shift when the attack occurred. SSG [REDACTED] stated he did not know who took the photographs of the dead local national or any other photographs. He stated he was never given any digital photographs from anyone in the platoon. SSG [REDACTED] stated he believed the individual in P-8 was either SSG [REDACTED] or SPC [REDACTED] B Co, 2/22nd Inf Bn, FDNY. He identified the local national in P-20 and P-21 as the one killed after the attack on the FB. SSG [REDACTED] identified SPC [REDACTED] as *b7c-4, b6-4* *b7c-5, b6-5* *ALB 664*

There were three members of B Co, 2/22 IN BN identified in the images, and they were SFC [redacted], SSG [redacted] and PVT [redacted]. The images, depicted in Group 2, appear to be that of PFC [redacted] (NFI), Brigade Communications section, being PUC'ed at a different time, these images also appear to have been taken at Fire Base Tycze. 1SG [redacted] related the images appearing in Group 3 appear to have been taken at the PUC Facility at Fire Base Tycze. 1SG [redacted] was unable to positively identify any of the soldiers in the images. 1SG [redacted] further related the actions depicted in the images, by the US Soldiers, were not Standard Operating Procedures (SOP), nor were they known or sanctioned by any level of Command. 1SG [redacted] stated the images depicted in Group 4 are that of a guard tower struck by a rocket propelled grenade (RPG) in January 2004. The blood in the images is believed to be that of 3 US Soldiers wounded in the attack. The images depicted in Group 5 appear to be that of an Afghani National and believed to be taken in the Aid Station at Fire Base Tycze, and could possibly be that of the person responsible for firing the RPG at the guard tower (See Sworn Statement of 1SG [redacted] for details).

SGT [REDACTED] B CO, 2ND BN, 22ND INF, 10TH MTN DIV (LI), FORT DRUM, NY (FDNY) 13602: At 1030, 7 Jul 04, SGT [REDACTED] was interviewed by the undersigned and related the following information. Their unit was assigned to Kandahar Air Base, Afghanistan and would move around to different fire bases based on the missions they were conducting. A majority of the fire bases were under the control of Special Forces units in the area. When questioned concerning photographs being exposed which can be considered derogatory in nature, he went on to state that on one occasion he recalls while being assigned to the fire base in Tice, Daira Wu Province (spelling unknown) they had a firefight incident where an enemy soldier or terrorist fired a rocket propelled grenade (RPG) at one of their guard towers. When this occurred in the early morning hours, the unit responded and SGT [REDACTED] led his team to an perimeter area position. SGT [REDACTED] went on to state that this enemy combatant blew up the tower, injuring three unit members, and was in turn justifiably killed by a Special Forces soldier who shot him in the head and SGT [REDACTED] Platoon SGT in turn shot this combatant in the head. This happened in succession to the bombing incident as it occurred and in SGT [REDACTED] mind it was all justifiable. SGT [REDACTED] stated pictures were exposed when they shouldn't have been of the area and dead combatant and went on to reflect that bad pictures were exposed and probably shouldn't have been either. SGT [REDACTED] made this statement and discussed what Persons in Custody (PUC) meant and when he was asked about the "bad" pictures, he stated he had exposed some pictures on his digital camera that was purchased in country and had watched the news of the incidents in Iraq of pictures being exposed and the trouble the soldiers were getting in to. SGT [REDACTED] stated it was his opinion in that he didn't see anything wrong with what they had done. SGT [REDACTED] was then shown photographs 8, 9 and 10 depicting a handgun held by a soldier at the head of an detainee and responded by stating he had no knowledge of this incident, however he did expose some photographs of other detainees and downloaded them on computers provided in the base camp for all to use or on one occasion he downloaded his digital images on SPC [REDACTED] B Co, 2/22nd Inf, FDNY (NFI) personal laptop computer. At this point, the undersigned determined that SGT [REDACTED] may be involved in the abuse and photographing of detainees and the interview was stopped. SGT [REDACTED] was advised of his legal rights, which he did not waive and requested an Attorney. The interview was terminated.

I was one of the main picture takers, that went to Afghanistan, or would let other people use my camera.

On January 18th when we got attacked I was the one that took the pictures of the tower and the destruction that happened around it and of the Dead guy who attacked us so I could show [REDACTED] 67C-5, 66-5 what they lived through.

I also took some of the pics of the pods that we had (People wanted to pose next to them) I did not agree w/ everything that happened in those pics, but I did participate in taking some of the pics.

I never witnessed any detainee Abuse while deployed. However, SA [REDACTED] b7c-5, b6-5 showed me a photograph of myself holding my M-4 Rifle with magazine. I am wearing a Black Fleece coat with black knit hat. I think the individual in the background was [REDACTED] b7c-5, b6-5. This photograph was taken of me prior to my being wounded. I do not remember the date it was taken or who took the photograph. I actually do not remember the photograph being taken, but it is me in the photo. I did not take a digital camera, only disposable cameras. My duties in Afghanistan were Team leader, which consisted of checking the team, roving patrol, guard duty and training and missions with Special Forces. I was stationed in Kandahar Airbase, Bagram and De Rah Woo (DRW). I never witnessed any detainee kicked, hit or inhumanely treated. I never mistreated a prisoner, but I do admit to placing the weapon to the prisoners head while he was zipped tied and blindfolded.

Between the Dates of Aug. 1 2003 to May 7, 2004 I was deployed to Afghanistan as Operation Enduring Freedom (The Fight on Terrorism). During that time I was located in different parts of Afghanistan; Kandihar Air Field, Bagram Air Field, Deh Reh waa providence, Deh She pan, Calot. In Afghanistan I had ~~the~~ different duties from a AA (SAW Gunner) to an AG and also a Rifleman. During the deployment I did have dispoisible Cameras. I didnt take nor see anyone taking pictures of detainees. I did not see any mistreatment or inhumanity treatment of detainees while I was deployed. During the time my unit was deployed to located at the Deh Reh waa providence there were SF (Special Forces) located at the same time. SF gave ~~in~~ passed many SOP's down the chain of command. Some SOP's were about detainees that described the treatment and order in which ~~the~~ detainees were treated. All detainees were taught (via translator) what I call the FINGER SYSTEM. IF ~~a~~ detainee a detainee holds up ONE, TWO, OR THREE Fingers, each single depicts a different need or want, such as: want water, want food, want Bathroom. IF one of the detainees ~~you~~ held up a certain amount of fingers we would always fulfill there ~~finger~~ requests. IF SF told us to do something they we would do it because ~~that~~ they were in charge. ~~They~~ Detainees were only kept for a couple of days, sometimes more, but usually just a couple days depending on SF and if they were finish doing ~~what~~ what they had to do, when the detainees were under U.S. custody there living conditions were about like ~~ours~~ ^{ours}. They were given a mattress ~~we~~ (I called a Hijji Mattress because it was ~~the~~ ^{the} ~~one~~ ^{one} ~~third~~ the thickness of a normal American Mattress), but we were giving the same mattress. I, [REDACTED] want to make the following statement under oath:

I was deployed to Afghanistan with my unit from around July 2003 to 6 May 2004. We were based at Kandahar, Afghanistan and I was a Team Leader assigned to 1st Squad, 2nd platoon. I had four soldiers assigned under me. We moved around to different firebases depending on the missions we were performing. It was a routine deployment in a hostile environment and the only bad fire incident we had occurred at Fire Base Tice, which is in Dairu Wu (DRW), which I don't know how to spell. This incident happened in the early morning hours, about first light of January 18th, 2004 when an enemy combatant came into our perimeter and fired a rocket propelled grenade (RPG) at Tower #1 injuring three of our unit members. I was awakened by the blast and ran outside with my team members and secured a perimeter area. It was about this time that I observed one dead enemy combatant lying on the ground. The incident was over in a matter of seconds and I don't know who actually killed this combatant, however I feel it was justifiable because he shot a RPG at the guard tower. The only other thing I can think of is pictures taken with PUC's (persons under custody) where some unit members were holding weapons to their heads, likes the ones that were shown in Iraq. PUC's were prisoners or detainees under our control. I took some photographs with a Sony Digital camera that I purchased in Qatar while on R & R of prisoners but never downloaded on to a computer or CD. I didn't have access to a personal computer and the computers they had set up for everyone to use on the base were administratively programmed to not allow this. We were told this and I even tried it at the computer station, but it wouldn't let me. The bad photo's depicting fellow soldiers with prisoners were taken before the incident in Iraq and after seeing the problems they had in Iraq I knew this was a problem and should have never been done. I realized there would be another public outrage if these photographs got out so they were destroyed. My photographs were never processed as the camera broke because of the dust and climate we were in so I threw it away while I was over there. I had my picture taken on about two occasions with prisoners who were blindfolded and I held a weapon to their head. I believe it was a pistol and I made sure the weapon was unloaded before I did this. I can't even remember now who photograph me but it was with my personal digital camera that I threw away over there in country. I am aware of the problems this has occurred and knew it was

A: I don't recall who it was. We were working 12 hour guard shifts, then 12 hours guarding PUC's, 12 hour fuel detail and then 8 hours off time.

Q: Did you ever kick, hit or inhumanely treat a prisoner or detainee while they were in U.S. Custody?

A: No.

Q: Did you ever witness a fellow soldier kick, hit or inhumanely treat a prisoner or detainee while they were in U.S. Custody?

A: No.

Q: Where was the photographs taken of you?

A: It was right there at Fire Base Tice where we were responsible for guarding the PUC's.

A: There wasn't anything from our unit or command, everything came down from the Special Forces Group who ran the camp. In this case it was the 3rd Group, Special Forces out of Fort Bragg, NC who were running this camp.

A: We never received anything in writing like you would see in a standard SOP, everything was done verbally through them. We would get instructions on dealing with the prisoners/detainees depending on their status.

A: They advised us that the non-violent detainees were to be flexed cuff on their hands only, no sandbag on their head and they received a mattress, pillow, blanket and were allowed to sleep. The other type of prisoner/detainee were either violent or had information and were to be flexed cuffed on their hands, heads covered and not allowed to sleep. This was our guidance, very general and broad.

Q: Were you ever advised about the handling of the prisoners and not to be photographed with them?

A: No.

Q: Do you know if anyone in your Chain of Command or with the Special Forces Chain of Command their were aware soldiers were being photographed with the prisoners/detainees?

A: I am not sure. To my knowledge no.

Q: Was anyone in the Chain of Command, your unit or the Special Forces Group their were aware that weapons were being held to the prisoners/detainees heads?

A: No, not that I know of.

Q: How long were prisoners/detainees kept at your location?

A: I want to say usually around 2-3 days and then released to the local Police Force or taken were ever they take them. The Special Forces would do this.

I went to Bagram on NOV 1st and stayed until the end of November, Thanksgiving I think, then I went to DRW (Darahwod) from DEC 03 to February 04, I was in Kalat (spelling unknown) for 3 weeks in the month of March 04, I think. While I was in Kalat, we were constantly being shot at, and had RPG attacks almost every other day. To my knowledge no one was ever injured because they always missed us. While I was in DRW, three of my friends were seriously injured during an RPG attack upon Tower 1. I was not a witness to the RPG attack itself, but responded to the horns blowing and assisted in getting the three injured US Soldiers to the Aid Station. I was there when they started returning fire on the Taliban that fired the RPG. I believe the Special Forces in the area got the final shots on the enemy. The attack happened on January 18, 2004.

I don't recall the time frame that I was on this operation. I went back to Kandahar and then went to Bagram, I believe in the September-November time frame. I was in Bagram for about a month and a half. I then went to DRW (Darahwod) from DEC 03 to January 04. I went back to Kandahar for a couple of months and then to Qalat (spelling unknown). At the end of April I went back to Kandahar to come back to Ft. Drum, NY. While I was in DRW, three of my friends were wounded during an RPG attack upon Tower 1. I was a witness to the RPG attack, and immediately ran to my fighting position on the right side of the main gate. I saw the tracer rounds from the enemy's fighting position, but I did not shoot back because I didn't have a clear shot at the enemy. I heard him scream something, but couldn't understand the language. Then I saw the soldiers on my left fire at him, because he was rushing the gate. The enemy was shot and killed. I heard that it was the Special Forces in the area that shot and killed the enemy but I didn't actually witness who exactly shot the enemy. I believe the attack happened between 0130 and 0230 on January 17, 2004.

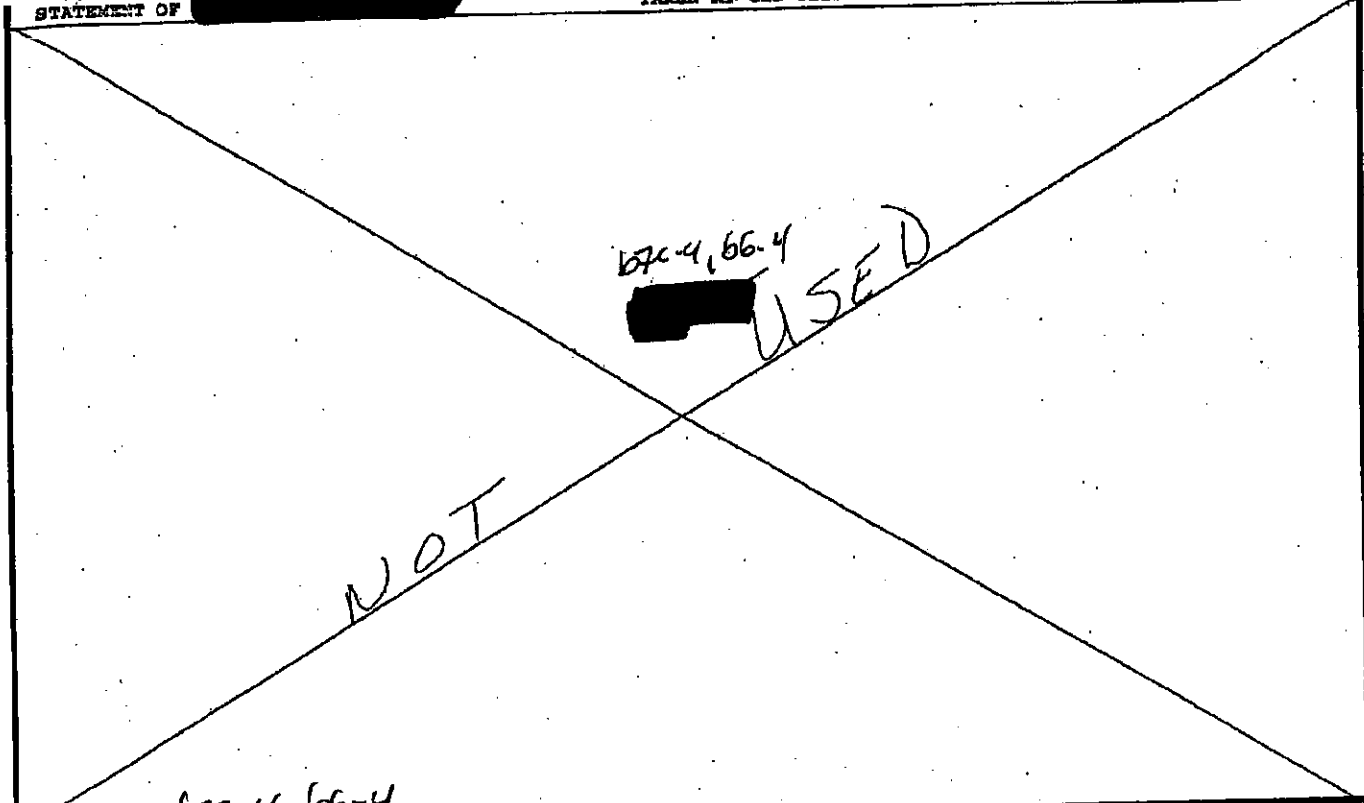

I got to Afghanistan in AUG 2003, I was with B CO. 2/22 INF BN, I was in Kandahar. I was a rifleman, in a line squad. I went from Kandahar to Bagram, I believe, in the October-November time frame. I was in Bagram for about two months. I then went back to Kandahar before going to DRW (Darahwod) from early Dec 03 to early Feb 04. I went back to Kandahar for a little under a month and then to Qalat (spelling unknown) for about 5 weeks. My job changed in Feb 04 from rifleman to RTO (Radio Telephone Operator). In April I went back to Kandahar to get ready to come back to Ft. Drum, NY. While I was in DRW, three of our guys were wounded during an RPG attack on Tower 1. I was not a witness to the RPG attack, I was on the shift just prior to that. I was in bed and heard an explosion and immediately ran outside. Tower 1 was on fire and there was blood everywhere. I ran to the front, which was next to the main gate, to give the "203" rounds to the scouts positioned there, because they needed the ammunition. They were being fired upon by the guy who fired the RPG onto Tower 1. I remember the firing stopped and all of a sudden the enemy started charging the line and I heard him scream something. The enemy was shot and killed. I do not know who shot and killed the enemy. The attack happened in the very early hours around January 18, 2004.

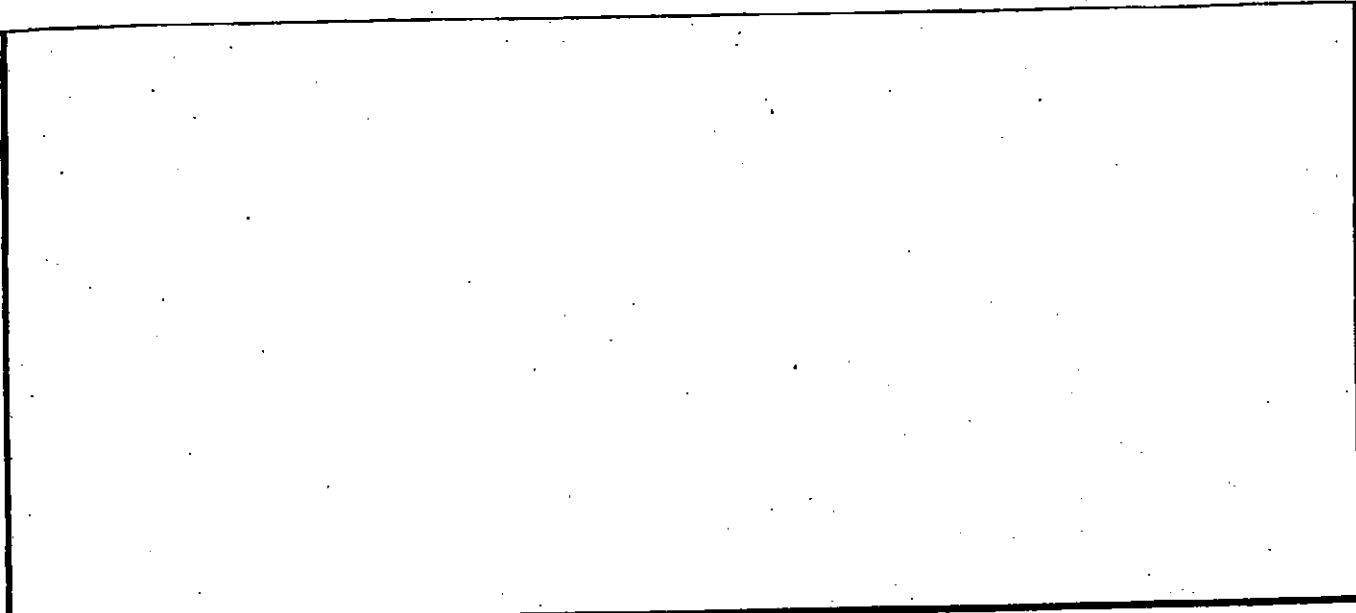

Due to the lack of computer forensic software and technician support, the computers were shutdown and no further examination was completed. During a cursory search of laptop 2 (item #2), no images of evidentiary value were located. During a cursory search of the Compaq Desktop (item #2, 045-04), the computer prompted for a power on password. The computer was subsequently powered down and no further search was conducted.
- DN 046-04 - A cursory search was conducted on the Dell Desktop (Item #3), which identified several images depicting soldiers pointing weapons to the heads of bound detainees. Three additional images, not found on the original CD, were discovered; they appeared to be two different individuals with one soldier in two of the images with his face mostly masked and one soldier with his head to the back of the camera. The picture (file name of "picture 1800") of the soldier with his back of his head to the camera was pointing a rifle at the head of a bound detainee and appeared to be dressed in the same manner as a previously identified picture of SGT [REDACTED]. The other two pictures (file names of "picture 1801" and "picture 1802") appear to depict an as yet unidentified soldier pointing a rifle to the head of a bound detainee. The computer also had an image (file name of "picture 1808") of a previously identified

When PFC ^{b7c-5,66-5} [redacted] was shown a recently discovered photograph depicting a partially masked male pointing a rifle at the head of a bound detainee, PFC [redacted] believed the weapon depicted was his, and the soldier holding it was him. SA [redacted] stopped the interview and advised him of his rights. PFC [redacted] further described the individual who struck the detainee and described his unit patch. PFC ^{b7c-5,66-5} [redacted] described the patch as a cannon with wings.

Between 1220 and 1250, 16 Jul 04, SA ^{b7c-1,66-1} [redacted] searched PFC ^{b7c-5,66-5} [redacted] residence, vehicle, and computer, pursuant to his written consent. ^{b7c-3,66-3} About 1420, 16 Jul 04, SA ^{b7c-1,66-1} [redacted] interviewed PFC ^{b7c-3,66-3} [redacted] B Co, 2/22nd Inf Bn, FDNY, who stated he arrived in Afghanistan on or about 01 Aug 03, shortly after completing basic and advanced individual training as an infantryman. PFC [redacted] related his duties in Afghanistan included fire team member, guard duty, and PUC guard. PFC [redacted] stated he only had disposable cameras in Afghanistan and he did not take his computer with him. PFC [redacted] related he was unaware of the maltreatment of detainees. PFC [redacted] stated he treated as somewhat of an outside, being new to the unit, and was more concerned with getting home alive. 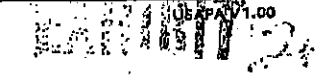

improvement, and other taskings given to us by Special Forces leaders who we were TACON to. My platoon was responsible for these tasks and was decentralized, normally by squad FOR EXAMPLE: One squad would be on patrols, another on perimeter security, and the other either O&F or taking care of various details such as PUC guard. The LT and myself would oversee the taskings and would go on occasional patrol depending on the size. Walk throughs of either the PUC camp or towards was done daily by myself or the LT when we had PUC's. Handling of PUC's was explained to platoon as such. Initially they were searched head to toe for weapons while they cuffed (for other contraband as well). They were seated after every thing was documented and collected. PUC's would be sand bagged and flex cuffed behind their backs. They were given a blanket, a mattress, and the opportunity to use the latrine, medical services, and access to water and food if wanted at any time. They did this by showing fingers (Example: 1 Finger = Water 2 = Food etc...) This was explained to them by step obviously because of the language barrier. There was 1 guard for every two PUC's depending on manning issues. PUC guards used M-4's while on guard and the weapon would be locked and loaded while on safe. The uniform was DCU's with weapon initially but then changed to uniform 28

Just OGU battalions with alternate top and halacalane due to recognition of soldiers because a lot of the prisoners were local and we didn't want the soldiers to be identified at any time (like on patrol). Special Forces initially gave leadership from my platoon the rundown of PUC's to be handled. On almost all incidents PUC's were brought in by Special Forces guys and handed off to us for guarding. Special Forces were normally there initially to ensure everything was smooth and would pull out detainees on occasion to interrogate, but for the majority of the time my platoon was responsible for them.

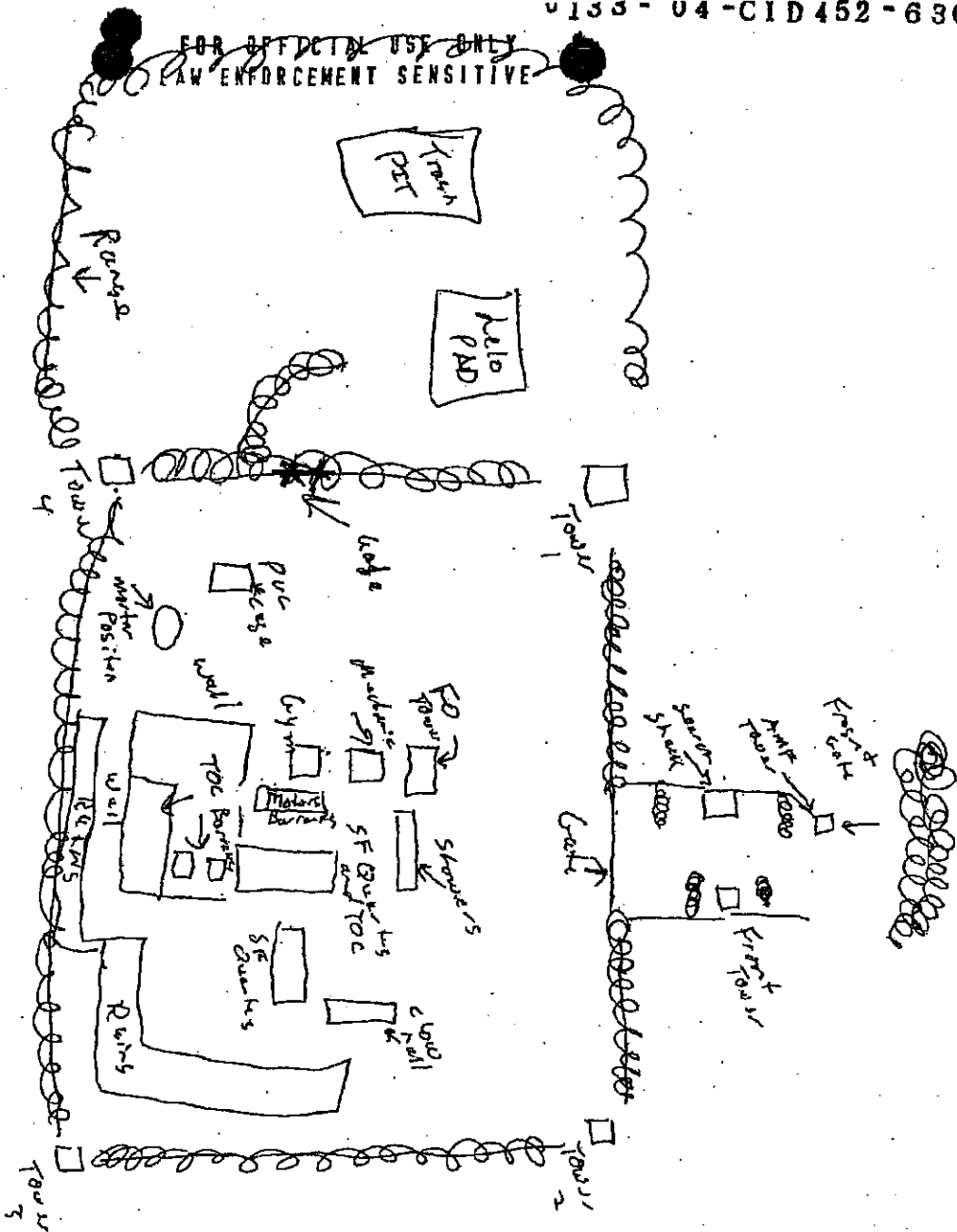

SPC [REDACTED] B CO, 2ND BN, 22ND INF, 10TH MTN DIV (LI), FORT DRUM, NY (FDNY) 13602: At 0900, 16 Jul 04, SPC [REDACTED] was interviewed by the undersigned and provided the following information; SPC [REDACTED] was deployed with his unit to Afghanistan and worked out of Fire Base Tice, Dairawu (spelling). While working at this fire base, SPC [REDACTED] talked about the firefight that occurred in January 2003 where an enemy combatant penetrated the base and blew up a guard tower with an rocket propelled grenade (RPG), injuring three of his fellow soldiers. The combatant was killed during the firefight, which SPC [REDACTED] felt was justified. SPC [REDACTED] also indicated he was involved in guarding Prisoner's Under Custody (PUC's) and at no time indicated they were abused in any way. There was no written Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) in place during their tour of duty regarding Prisoner's or Detainee's and the guidance was all administered verbally by his chain of command. When questioned about photographs being taken of the prisoner's by soldiers in his unit, SPC [REDACTED] stated he was not aware this took place nor was he involved in the photograph taking or being present in photographs. SPC [REDACTED] did not own a digital camera or personal computer system. SPC [REDACTED] utilized disposable cameras in theater to photograph the surrounding areas and unit personnel. According to SPC [REDACTED] he photographed the countryside and unit members at his base and no time were derogatory photographs exposed. SPC [REDACTED] was shown the photographs obtained by this office and his responses were:

Photographs 1 thru 7 depicted his fellow soldiers at a celebration and engaging in what the unit called PUC'ing (person's under control), which he described as conducted for birthdays and promotions, sort of esprit de corps.

Photograph 8 depicting an unidentified soldier standing over a prisoner with a handgun, couldn't identify.

Photograph 9 and 10 depicting a partial body and/or hand holding a pistol over a prisoner, couldn't identify.

Photograph 11 thru 21 depicted scenes after the firefight in January 2003.

Photograph 22 depicting two unidentified individuals were not identified by SPC [REDACTED] who stated photograph was blurry. *b7c-4,66-4*

Photograph 23 depicting an unidentified individual was identified as SPC [REDACTED] (NFI) of his unit. *b7c-5,66-5*

Photograph 24 depicting an unidentified individual was identified as SPC [REDACTED] (NFI) of his unit. *b7c-5,66-5*

Photograph 25 depicting an unidentified individual was not identified due to the mask covering the face.

Photograph 26 depicting an unidentified individual was identified as SGT [REDACTED] (NFI) of his unit. *b7c-5,66-5*

SPC [REDACTED] indicated he was aware of the investigation in Iraq involving U.S. soldiers and felt they went overboard in their duties and he was already aware under the Geneva Convention through prior training that you couldn't photograph prisoners or detainees. SPC [REDACTED] could not provide any further information pertinent to this investigation and when asked if he was willing to put this interview in a sworn statement, he declined.

I arrived in Afghanistan in August 2003 and was with B CO, 2/22 INF BN based in Kandahar, Afghanistan. My job was an Automatic Rifleman and was assigned to first platoon. I had only been with the unit a couple of weeks before being deployed to Afghanistan. We were based at tent city #D5, which was located at Kandahar International Airport (KAF). My platoon was located in Kandahar until about half way through our nine month deployment and we then moved to Bagram Air Base, Afghanistan for two weeks for Operation Mountain Resolve. After Operation Mountain Resolve we moved back to KAF for the remainder of our deployment. I was not located near DRW, but heard through my fellow soldiers three soldiers in a tower were pulling security and an RPG hit a guard tower. The RPG was fired from the Afghan checkpoint. I was informed the soldiers were injured and had to be medically evacuated.

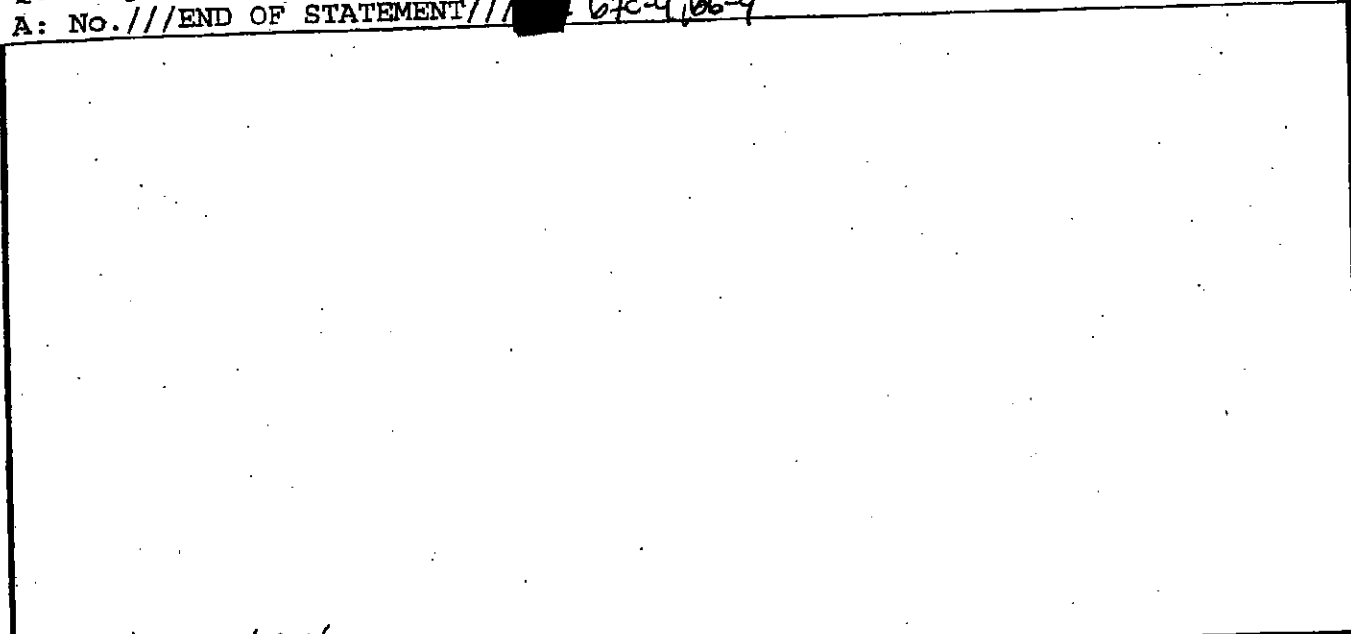
