The enclosed documents were reviewed under the Freedom of Information/Privacy Acts (FOIPA), Title 5, United States Code, Section 552/552a. Deletions have been made to protect information which is exempt from disclosure, with the appropriate exemptions noted on the page next to the excision. In addition, a deleted page information sheet was inserted in the file to indicate where pages were withheld entirely. The exemptions used to withhold information are marked below and explained on the enclosed Form OPCA-16a:

The enclosed material is from the main investigative file(s) in which the subject(s) of your request was the focus of the investigation. Our search located additional references, in files relating to other individuals, or matters, which may or may not be about your subject(s). Our experience has shown, when ident, references usually contain information similar to the information processed in the main file(s). Because of our significant backlog, we have given priority to processing only the main investigative file(s). If you want the references, you must submit a separate request for them in writing, and they will be reviewed at a later date, as time and resources permit.

Details: On 01/23/2002 at 10:00 a.m. SA [redacted] and SA [redacted] attended a Domestic Terrorism Symposium that was hosted by D/TRP [redacted] of the Michigan State Police Criminal Intelligence Unit.

Others attending the meeting were officials from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), United States Secret Service (USSS), Michigan Department of Corrections (MDOC), Michigan State University Public Safety, Michigan National Guard/Army Reserve and Michigan State Police.

The purpose of the meeting was to keep the local, state and federal law enforcement agencies apprised of the activities of the various groups and individuals within the state of Michigan who are thought to be involved in terrorist activities.

Detective [redacted] presented information on The Aryan World Church, web address www.aryanworldchurch.com, a Christian based white supremacist group from Dodgeville, Michigan. This group was founded by David Gregg Donnelly Jr., 86 Main Street, Dodgeville, Michigan. Michigan State Police has no other information on the group at this time, but they are continually attempting to gather more information on the group.

Detective [redacted] also, presented information on a meeting to be held on February 24, 2002 at the Holiday Inn Express, 46194 North I-94 Service Road, Belleville, Michigan, by the Christian Identity. The principle speaker for this event will be Pastor Pete J. Peters leader of the Christian Identity.

Detective [redacted] presented information on a protest from February 8-10, 2002 in Ann Arbor, Michigan, by the group Any Means Necessary. Michigan State Police has information that in the past demonstrations by this group have been peaceful.

Finally, Detective [redacted] presented information that ALF/ELF has declared February 12, 2002 as a day of action. It is thought that any demonstrations on this day will be to protest the trial of a prominent ALF/ELF member. Detective [redacted] will provide more information when available.

[redacted] Michigan State University (MSU) Public Safety, presented information on a group called East Lansing Animal Rights Movement (ELARM). This group is similar to and may have links to ALF/ELF. The [redacted] student at MSU. MSU Public Safety feels that this group has approximately 12-15 members at this time.

[redacted] had information that ELARM has also been linked to the Direct Action Group (DA). This group is [redacted] and protests perceived injustices by law enforcement. Both ELARM and DA protested the FBI Lansing RA on Friday, January 19, 2002.

Special Agent [redacted] from the FBI Bay City RA presented information that [redacted] is in the process of reforming the Michigan Militia. SA [redacted] will provide more information when available.

[redacted] Sergeant MDOC, reported that the MDOC has 100 confirmed inmates with 5% Nation tattoos. The 5% Nation is a radical splinter group of the Nation of Islam. [redacted] also had information that the 5% Nation has a school in the Detroit area named D-Mecca.

Special Agent [redacted] Detroit FBI, presented information pertaining to an FBIHQ, CTD alert sent to all FBI offices in reference to the Salt Lake City Winter Olympics and the fact that right wing and left wing extremist groups may target each other at these games. SA [redacted] requested help in obtaining any information on threats referenced to the Salt Lake City Olympic Games.

Dozens march against terrorism

Some support nation's efforts overseas, others see it as larger problem

EAST LANSING - Dozens of students and others marched Friday to protest racial profiling and terrorism - which they say includes United States military action in Afghanistan.

"Bombing is not going to stop terrorism," said Steve Swart, member of Direct Action, the group that led the march. "It's a base for more terrorism."

The anti-war group, formed after the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks, marched from the Michigan State University Union to the local office for the Federal Bureau of Investigation east of campus.

The FBI began interviewing 37 Lansing-area men last month as part of a national effort to contact more than 5,000 visitors to determine if they have any information on Osama bin Laden and his terrorist organization.

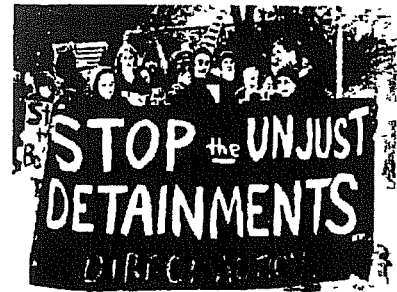
Many of the local men are from Middle Eastern countries. Direct Action thinks questioning them displays racial profiling - a practice where someone is singled out because of his race.

"A lot of people don't think destroying our civil liberties is going to make us feel more secure," Swart said

Lansing police, who have helped the FBI interview several men, say it's been positive.

"We looked at it as an opportunity to build bridges and build a close relationship with members of the community who we had little contact with before," said Lt. Raymond Hall

Hall said the police department only agreed to assist the FBI with the interviews if it wasn't profiling and the dignity and rights of the interviewees would be safe-guarded.

East Lansing police declined to help the FBI, citing concerns about racial profiling. MSU officials also decided not to help.

As about 50 members and supporters of Direct Action marched down Grand River Avenue shouting "This racist war has got to go" and other chants, members of a local conservative group protested them.

About 20 members Young Americans for Freedom local branch were there to say force in Afghanistan is a must to end terrorism.

"We would love to live in a peaceful world, but we don't," said John Farley, a war supporter.

"Sometimes the military is necessary."

By protesting the war on terrorism, local YAF Chairman Marc Stemmer says Direct Action is protesting America.

"They seem to be undermining the war on terrorism," said the 20-year-old MSU sophomore.

Direct Action supporter Julie Hartman thinks there's a more peaceful way terrorism can end.

"There's been thousands of people killed over there, innocent civilians like you and me," said Hartman, a 22-year-old MSU graduate student.

"Continuing this war is saying that their lives aren't worth as much as ours, which sends a message that this is a racist war."

Hartman says she doesn't understand the people supporting the war, but they have as a much right to speak out as she does.

"They don't seem to understand we're as much pro-American as they are," Hartman said.

"If you're not voicing your opinion, if you're not standing up for it, nobody's going to be there to defend our rights."
