DECLARATION OF ANDREW C. KOTVAL

- 1. I am a Visa Specialist in the Visa Office, Coordination Division, of the United States Department of State's Bureau of Consular Affairs. My responsibilities include writing and reviewing Security Advisory Opinions. I have been employed by the Department of State since January 1999, and have held my current position since August 2004.
- The information contained in this declaration is based on firsthand knowledge or information obtained in my official capacity.
- Although the Department of State does not maintain statistical data of this nature, the Department exercised due diligence in conducting a search of Department

records in order to ascertain the requested information to resolve this lawsuit. We have determined that only one alien, a Lebanese national, has been found ineligible for a visa on the basis of any version of the "endorse or espouse provision" at issue in the above-referenced lawsuit. Although that individual was found ineligible for a visa on three separate occasions, in each case a visa ultimately was issued to the individual on the basis of a waiver issued by the Department of Homeland Security. The relevant visas were issued on March 19, 2005, October 11, 2005, and October 4, 2006.

Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1746, I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.
