Election Day is Tuesday, November 6, 2012

QUICK TIPS FOR VOTERS

- ★ Find your polling location and check the hours by calling your county auditor or by going to <https://vip.sos.nd.gov>
- ★ North Dakota is the only state where you do not have to register to vote! You can go to your polling place and vote as long as you are: 1) a U.S. citizen, 2) at least 18 years old on Election Day, 3) a North Dakota resident, and 4) a resident in the precinct where you're voting for 30 days preceding the election.
- ★ If you have identification (driver's license, Tribal ID), bring it with you to the polls. When you vote, you must verify your street address and date of birth. Address can be verified by showing a utilities statement.
- ★ If you do not have ID, you can still vote if you sign a sworn statement called a Voter's Affidavit or if an election poll worker can vouch for your identity and residence.
- ★ If you vote at the polls, go early in the day to avoid the last-minute rush. Consider voting absentee.
