I just spoke with Lisa and Dana and after discussions with them this is the way I think we should go forward with scheduling.

Dana will begin scheduling all of Judge Richards' hearings, except for Summary Judgments, beginning immediately. She would be called directly for scheduling these hearings. I don't think this will create too much confusion for the plaintiff's firms. Prior to Judge Richards' taking over foreclosures the firms emailed LJ for the Summary Judgment hearings and called the individual JAs for all other hearings. This system seemed to work well. The new system would allow them to call Dana for all non-SJ hearings instead of the individual JAs. This would cut out the extra step, and delay associated with it, of LJ having to sort through the emails and determine the nature of the hearing and then forwarded the email to Dana. Dana has her Lee County phone set up to forward to Charlotte County when she is in Charlotte County.

As far as the Notice for Trial issue. I found out that currently the clerk's office is the one who is forwarding the Notice of Trial to Mediation when they receive the Notice. This alleviates the necessity of either Dana or the JAs checking to see if the case has been mediated or not and then sending it to Bruce Waddell's office based on the results of their inquiry. I don't think it makes sense to give these cases a trial date until we get a notice from the mediator's office that the case has impassed. Once the case has impassed the case will go back to the Judge that it was assigned to. I doubt that many of these will actually go to trial, but if they do and Judge Richards' schedule permits him to try them and he is so inclined he can always take the trials. As a procedure I would recommend they go back to the original Judge however.

I think this outlines my recommendations on the topics we discussed today. If you have any other questions feel free to contact me.

- 3. Have Sharon case manage these cases and serve as a feeder for court dates that would include hearing dates and trial dates. Set parameters with Lee's approval regarding the scheduling of hearings and trials.
- 4. Need to decide how many days to use for hearings v. trials during her Lee weeks.

Sandi and I have agreed to the following plan for scheduling foreclosure cases:

- 1) Case scheduling will continue as is with the clerk using the established procedures already in place
- Court Admin will schedule cases in JACS for any cases that we set for DS/Trial, MSJ or Status Review before Mag, etc.. (Basically anything that requires us to notice).

Judge Cary, has Lee Co. developed (or considering) a standard Foreclosure Final Judgment similar to the  $12^{ ext{th}}$  ( $^{ ext{(attached)}}$ ? Perhaps we can have one circuit-wide for the 20th? If so, I'd suggest that the "interest" entry have a specific recitation of something like: (#) \_ days X \_\_\_\_\_ interest rate = accrued interest through date of judgment. We don't have the clerk checking the math up here like in Lee Co. and when I was doing foreclosures up here I was constantly finding errors in proposed judgments charging excessive interest (repeatedly). I always required the above referenced calculation in the judgments. I'd also suggest some language requiring the timely payment of clerk's fees and publication/notice fees to effectuate the sale so that the sales are not continuously postponed. There is a general fear among the judges that with hurricane season closing in a lot of companies don't want to gain legal ownership of the homes yet to minimize their risk, among other reasons.

We had a civil case management meeting today with Judges Schreiber, Richards, Jon Embury, and a number of others, including private attorneys. Given that a lot of the mill firms are not pushing their cases and are working on flat fees, perhaps for our civil case management system circuit-wide we should consider mandatory case management for foreclosures – the more these mill firms have to attend court hearings if they are not pushing their cases towards closure, the less ultimately they'll be making – good incentive to keep the files moving once filed.

I cannot make the meeting on the 14th, but I'd suggest something along the lines of the following:

Case gets filed. – Filing Attorney is required to serve a case management conference order on each party setting an initial case management conference five months out from the filing month. At that juncture, the 120 service period have passed (4 months) along with an additional month in which all parties at the latest should have answered. At the first conference the clerk or judge could enter all appropriate defaults and order mediation (if mediation was not ordered in the initial case management order to be served with the petition) and inquire as to what if anything further is needed by any party in terms of discovery and set a deadline – the next conference. - Names/Numbers of Magistrate and Assistant? Magistrate Stella Diamond started this week. Her assistant is Craig Freeman and he begins Monday, 7/12. They are located on the first floor judicial pod next to the Child Support Hearing Officers (previously where Judge Thompson was located). Magistrate Amy Hawthorne is part-time and she beings August 10. Her part-time assistant is Shannon Dolson and she started last week. They will be on the third floor-Judicial office (previously where Judge E. Adams was located). Shannon is working out of DV Office right now while she is being trained on notices and Odyssey. (I will provide numbers shortly)
- 2) Where are their hearings and courtroom? Magistrate Diamond will use 1-B and Magistrate Hawthorne will use 5-I.
- 3) Will they receive all M F/C paperwork (Exparte motions)? I think this was answered earlier by separate email. On 8/1, Scott Reduga will receive all of the motions/paperwork to provide to the Senior Judges and or set on an available calendar before the Senior Judge or Magistrate. Anything time sensitive matters should be marked since we do not have a Senior Judges here every day and do not want to miss anything. We are still working out how all of this will work but we will have one central location for the paperwork received. Until 8/1, cases are still being handled by
- 4) Who will sign the orders? If only Judges, is it only 2 weeks a month? The Judges are here throughout the month and not necessarily at 2 week intervals. We will set up a system with the Senior Judges on how they would like for us to handle. We will be meeting with them some time in the next week. I will provide more information as it becomes available.

I am available this Friday at 3:30pm and will come to your office. Since Nov/Dec are holiday months- I was checking to see if Penelope was aware of any dates to avoid before trying to establishing the next calendar. I will email you a draft tomorrow or earlier if I hear from Penelope before then. I will not be asking her to secure coverage until we speak and you approve.

I have been monitoring the progress of the dockets to determine how many DS to schedule. Our observation is that with the present set-up requiring the Senior Judges to review and sign on the same day they are scheduled for court may be too much for them. I am observing signs of exhaustion by the Senior Judges with the 10-12 hour days. The additional factor considered is the # of cases continued to these existing DS dates. Using the formula below appears to be ideal:

Judges -75 in the morning and 75 in the afternoon. Magistrate- 60 in the morning and 60 in the afternoon.

If we factor additional office days we may be able to increase the numbers but I did not get the impression at yesterday's meeting that they wanted to put in more time. It has not been said but I am concerned they may not want to continue at this pace. Judge Starnes has been coming through to help Judge Thompson this week since it is his day to sign since he is covering the contested hearing foreclosure dockets. I had a chance to speak with Judge Starnes concerning the # of DS to be set on a docket. He feels 220 per day is achievable when factoring in additional signing time.

For the Senior Judges, I would recommend:

- 1) Setting 170 new DS cases per day (85 morning/85 afternoon) and allowing for 50 additional cases to be set for continued DS. So the dockets will be at 220 per day and the Judges will continue to sign/review foreclosure paperwork on those dates.
- 2) In the event docket space is still available: I will use those times to reset DSs where an objection has been filed to the Magistrate since I do not need a 60-day notice for those cases.

#### For the Magistrates, I would recommend:

1) Setting 200 DS cases per day (100 morning/100 afternoon) and allowing for 50 additional cases to be set for continued DS. So the dockets will be at 250 per day.

Judge Carlin said we needed the Circuit Civil Judges approval before we could act on this. Also there may be "emergency" situations that need to be dealt with somehow. My only interest in this is to reduce the unnecessary paperwork for both the Judges and clerk. It may not even be a problem, but I have come to expect very little from the foreclosure mills. I reviewed Sandi's and J Carlin's comments and have no problem with reviewing and signing orders on the motions in accordance with the suggested procedures. Once an order is signed, the judge's ja could simply e-mail the clerk of that fact so the sale could be timely cancelled.

In determining the procedure to use, I thought it important to determine the reason behind the adoption of new form 1.996(b) and whether an order to cancel and reschedule a f/c is mandatory. My review follows if anyone is interested:

New Civil form 1.996(b) entitled "Motion to Cancel and Reschedule Foreclosure Sale" simply states in a Note at the bottom of the form, "This form is used to move the court to cancel and reschedule a foreclosure sale." And rule 1.900 entitled "Forms" only states in (b) that the Forms for Use with Rules of Civil Procedure that follow are sufficient for the matters that are covered by them.

The supreme court, in their opinion adopting new form 1.996(b), does not say the order is mandatory but cites the Task Force's reasons for recommending that the new rule be adopted as follows:

"Currently, many foreclosure sales set by the final judgment and handled by the clerks of court are the subject of vague last-minute motions to reset sales without giving any specific information as to why the sale is being reset. It is important to know why sales are being reset so as to determine when they can properly be reset, or whether the sales process is being abused... Again, this is designed at promoting effective case management and keeping properties out of extended limbo between final judgment and sale." (My Emphasis added)

So I view the form as a case management tool to avoid last minute motions and orders and that as long as the procedure we set up is reasonable it should be ok. And I think the procedures set forth is entirely reasonable.

Further, as long as a rational reason is stated in a timely filed motion and the cancellations /resets are not being abused (i.e. if you see 7 cancellations and resets, it probably is and the judge will probably deny the motion.), reviewing these motions and signing orders will be pretty perfunctory.

I returned the call of a woman who was losing her home to foreclosure. The conversation began with her apologizing for bothering me but she didn't know who else to contact. She was embarrassed that she was going through foreclosure and said that nothing like this had ever happened to her. That she was sure I had heard the same story from other people b/c lots of people were going through foreclosure, but that this was devastating to her. Nevertheless she wanted to do the right thing and follow procedure to the letter of the law. She had written a response but didn't know what to do with it and the letter she received was confusing and full of legal terms. What she needed was to file her response with the clerk. I provided her with the information she needed and she thanked me- profusely.

During the conversation she told me that she fell into financial difficulties b/c her husband had an organ transplant a couple years ago and they were buried in medical bills. Over the last year he had upwards of 10 strokes and had just been released from the hospital the day before after having open heart surgery. Also, he was going into kidney failure. In addition to all this, her son had returned from Iraq this past year and has had multiple surgeries b/c he returned home badly wounded. Finally, both her parents had died during the last two years. She was clearly overwhelmed and distraught and began crying- but just a little. She said if I had called her the afternoon before it wouldn't have been pretty b/c she had a meltdown and had been crying all afternoon. (I think anyone would agree this is entirely understandable.) Then she said to me that she pulled herself together because "other people have it worse than she does...what else can you do but just go on".

She ended the conversation thanking me for listening to her "complain" and for being understanding.

I am sharing this for two reasons:

- 1. To show that taking some extra time to be kind to someone could be the lifeline that person needs at that particular moment;
- 2. To remind us all that there really are "other people who have it worse"

This woman touched me in a profound way. I was having a rough morning-or so I thought- then I realized was rough really was.

A local attorney apparently has advised that he disputes the court's ability to set matters for trial, hence the specific inclusion of the reference to FRCP 1.440(c). (The rule requires only a minimum of thirty days notice.)

I hope all is well down there. This last month (July) we had the lowest number of foreclosure filings here in Charlotte since May, 2007!

Judge Carlin:

Rule 2.505 specifically addresses the way in which an attorney may appear in a case and the way in which an attorney's appearance may be terminated. An attorney may appear "[b]y substitution of counsel, but only by order of court and with written consent of the client, filed with the court." (emphasis added). Fla. R. Jud. Admin. 2.505(e)(2). Likewise, in the context of substitution of counsel, the appearance of the first attorney shall terminate "[b]y order of court, under the procedure set forth in subdivision (e)(2) of this rule." The filing of the stipulation is just the first step, but the firm language of the rule shows that the intent is that counsel cannot actually be considered substituted absent an order from the Court, and counsel cannot be considered relieved of his/her obligation absent an order from the Court.

I hope this helps to answer your question. Please advise if I can provide any further assistance.

## Just wanted to alert you to a problem with the dockets:

I was just informed that we had some cases scheduled for continued docket sounding that were set incorrectly: correct date and time-wrong Judge/Magistrate. The error occurred when the user entered the case into JACS and forgot to change the name of the Judge/Magistrate. This only occurs when we have more than one docket running for the same date.

**Problem:** This doesn't present a problem when the Judge hears a case noticed before the Magistrate but it does present a problem for the Magistrates since an Order of Referral would not have been entered in the case.

Solution: The Magistrate's clerk will alert the Judge's clerk that the case is an add-on to the docket and the case will be moved to the proper courtroom.

I apologize for any inconvenience this has caused or is causing in the courtroom. With the high number of docket soundings we are scheduling, I expect that we will have some errors along the way. Thank you

# Hello

Me again. Here are the questions I received today:

- 1) Names/Numbers of Magistrate and Assistant? Magistrate Stella Diamond started this week. Her assistant is Craig Freeman and he begins Monday, 7/12. They are located on the first floor judicial pod next to the Child Support Hearing Officers (previously where Judge Thompson was located). Magistrate Amy Hawthorne is part-time and she beings August 10. Her part-time assistant is Shannon Dolson and she started last week. They will be on the third floor- Judicial office (previously where Judge E. Adams was located). Shannon is working out of DV Office right now while she is being trained on notices and Odyssey. (I will provide numbers shortly)
- 2) Where are their hearings and courtroom? Magistrate Diamond will use 1-B and Magistrate Hawthorne will use 5-I.
- 3) Will they receive all M F/C paperwork (Exparte motions)? I think this was answered earlier by separate email. On 8/1 , Scott Reduga will receive all of the motions/paperwork to provide to the Senior Judges and or set on an avaiable calendar before the Senior Judge or Magistrate. Anything time sensitive matters should be marked since we do not have a Senior Judges here every day and do not want to miss anything. We are still working out how all of this will work but we will have one central location for the paperwork received. Until 8/1, cases are still being handled by Judge Schreiber.
- 4) Who will sign the orders? If only Judges, is it only 2 weeks a month? The Judges are here throughout the month and not necessarily at 2 week intervals. The Senior Judges' calendar may overlap on some days but for the most part we are indentifying separate days for each Senior Judge throughout the month. The schedule is not the same as it was for Judge Schreiber with a 2-week rotation. We may not have a Senior Judge avaiable for signing every day and will need to work through how this will operate when review and signatures are needed immediately.
- 5) What are the Magistrates hearing and what are the Snr judges hearing? Foreclosure Fridays continue with uncontested Motion for Summary Judgment handled by the Snr Judges. Other dockets before the Magistrate and Senior Judges are mixed with contested hearings, docket soundings and motions for Summary judgment.
- 6) Who will handle emergency motions? This will again depend on the Senior Judges' calendar and the dockets. Scott will be provided a calendar for days that the Senior Judges are avaiable. We will set up a system with the Senior Judges on how they would like for us to handle. We will be meeting with them some time in the next week. I will provide more information as it becomes available.

Calls concerning foreclosures may be addressed to Sharon English, Civil Case Manager, or myself. She can be reached at 533-2801 and my number is below. The procedures for scheduling residential foreclosures remains the same and all are required to email the Massforeclosure email account. Foreclosures information has been provided on the court's webpage. The clerk continues to assist us with the scheduling of these cases. Docket Soundings are being scheduled by Court Admin using the Magistrate Assistants and internal staff being pulled from various depts. We started with the oldest cases first and are halfway through 2008.
