



HOME OF RECORD MEDICAL SEPARATION NOTIFICATION

Dear Jeremiah S Johnson,

Your current medical condition has not resolved. This condition limits your ability to perform your Volunteer assignment and has the very real potential for further aggravation during the remainder of your Peace Corps service.

After serious consideration and consultation with the Office of Medical Services, Peace Corps/ Washington (OMS), we do not feel that you can safely continue to serve as a PCV in Ukraine. Consequently, you are being medically separated to your Home of Record because:

The resolution of your condition(s) will take longer than the maximum-allowable 45 days.

We are unable to provide adequate follow-up for your condition overseas.

Your medical condition has a high risk of being aggravated by or recurring during Peace Corps service, which would jeopardize your health.

You would be medically unable to perform your Volunteer assignment.

If your medical condition resolves within one year, you may be eligible for reinstatement. To apply for reinstatement, you should call the Country Desk Unit in Washington (#800-424-8580). The Desk Officer will contact OMS and request medical clearance for you. Prior to determining whether medical clearance can be granted for reinstatement, OMS will need to review information from your physician.

You have the right to appeal the decision for medical separation. Appeals can only be submitted AFTER you are medically separated and should be sent, in writing, to the Director of Medical Services. Any appeal must be supported by medical documentation from a provider.
