

Voting In Missouri With A Criminal Conviction

If you were convicted of **any felony** in a state or federal court, you are barred from voting:

- While incarcerated
- While on probation
- While on parole

If you were convicted of a **misdemeanor**, you **only lose the right to vote while incarcerated**. If you were convicted of a felony or misdemeanor relating to election laws, you are permanently disfranchised unless you receive a pardon from the Governor.

Once you have completed your sentence, you can register or re-register to vote. **You do not need to show any special documentation.**

Vote to empower yourself, your family and your community. Vote so that the needs of your community are addressed by those in office. Vote because your voice is important and deserves to be heard.
