- > A U.S. Army report on abuses at Abu Ghraib prison documented one case of
- > an American guard sexually abusing a female detainee, and a Pentagon
- > spokesman said Monday that 1,200 unreleased images of abuse at Abu Ghraib
- > included "inappropriate behavior of a sexual nature."
- > Whether it was one or numerous cases of rape, many Iraqis believe that
- > sexual abuse of women in U.S.-run jails was rampant. As a result, female
- > prisoners face grave prospects after they are released: denial, ostracism
- > or even death.
- > A woman who is raped brings shame on her family in the Islamic world. In
- > many cases, rape victims have been killed by their relatives to salvage
- > family honor, although there is no evidence this has happened to women who
- > have been prisoners in Iraq.
- > "It is like being sentenced to death," said Sheik Mohammed Bashar Faydhi,
- > a senior cleric based at Baghdad's largest Sunni mosque.
- > Some Iraqi women said they were struggling to come to terms with the
- > alleged abuses of female detainees at Abu Ghraib and other U.S.-controlled
- > lockups. Few female inmates will talk about it. Their lawyers lower their
- > voices when the subject of rape comes up.
- > "I hope it's not true, because were it to be true, it is just too horrible
- > to imagine," said Rajaa Habib Khuzaai, an obstetrician who is one of three
- > women on the Iraqi Governing Council.
- > This week, Khuzaai was allowed access to a detention center housing women
- > - a privilege rarely granted to outsiders before the scandal.
- > But female lawyers who visited the prison in March said their clients
- > provided accounts of abuse and humiliation.
- > To enter the prison west of Baghdad, the attorneys waded through dirt and
- > coils of barbed wire, and waited for hours.
- > Inside, they met with nine female detainees - four of whom, they said, had
- > not been charged with any crime. U.S. military officials said at the time
- > that there were 10 or 11 women being held at Abu Ghraib.
- > One lawyer, Sahra Janabi, said her clients found it difficult to talk
- > about their experiences in prison. Seemingly minor actions by U.S.
- > soldiers, such as removing a woman's head scarf, represented a violation
- > to these Muslim women.
- > A prison translator was present in the meetings and took notes, Janabi
- > said.
- > "We could not talk freely," she said. "The women were devastated. They
- > broke down crying."
- > According to Janabi, only one prisoner, a middle-aged owner of a cigarette
- > stand, would speak openly, and said she did not care if the guards
- > punished her.
- > She told the lawyers that she had been forced to disrobe in front of male
- > guards, an action that an Iraqi translator found so disgraceful he turned
- > his head away in embarrassment.
- > Janabi and her colleagues said many women who had been detained are wives
- > or relatives of senior Baath Party officials or of suspected insurgents.
- > U.S. Army officials have acknowledged detaining women in hopes of
- > persuading male relatives to provide information. The lawyers said
- > interrogators sometimes threatened to kill detainees.
- > Dozens of people - lawyers, Iraqi officials, Iraqi and foreign human

- > rights activists - have sought access to the prisons during the last year
- > with minimal success. Stories of physical and sexual torture were rampant
- > for much of that time. Iraqi officials and lawyers say U.S. military and
- > governmental secrecy created a climate that allowed abuses.
- > Women represented a small percentage of about 40,000 detainees processed
- > by U.S. authorities.
- > Once the women are freed, a new trauma begins, Iraqis say.
- > Khuzaai, the Governing Council member, said most female detainees cannot
- > talk about what they've been through. They and their families try to
- > pretend nothing ever happened, she said.
- > Another lawyer, Amul Swadi, said her client fainted before providing
- > further details of being raped and knifed by U.S. soldiers.
- > Five former detainees described to their lawyers having been beaten. But
- > they did not say they had been raped.
- > "They are very ashamed," Janabi said. "They say, 'We can't tell you. We
- > have families. We cannot speak about what happened.' "
- > In Iraq, silence may be their best protection.
- > Faydhi, the cleric, said an Iraqi man cannot acknowledge having had a
- > female relative in prison. The shame, he said, is bad enough if the woman
- > was in an Iraqi jail. To have been taken by the Americans compounds the
- > humiliation.
- > Her life may be in danger especially if the woman is from a large,
- > prominent tribe, he said, and her family believes she has been raped,
- > Faydhi said.
- > Faydhi, an official with Iraq's Board of Islamic Clergy and a professor at
- > the Islamic University, said a man will be discouraged from killing his
- > female relative who has been released from prison if he seeks permission
- > of an imam to restore the family's honor. But the cleric also said imams
- > have limited ability to prevent this kind of murder.
- > "I would remind him that she is a victim, and ask, how can we victimize
- > her even more? I would tell him to keep it secret, but that if word gets
- > out, I would try to convince him that she should be seen as a patriotic
- > symbol," Faydhi said. "But it is really difficult to convince an Iraqi to
- > think in such a manner."
- > Khuzaai said the stigma would be unbearable.
- > "Like any woman who is raped, there is the mental, psychological breakdown
- > and everything that is related to the self," she said. "But then there's
- > the family and society. If a rape has happened, a family will never talk
- > about it, not to the public, and maybe not even among themselves."

## DETAILS

**BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION:** On 14 Jun 04, this office received a Request for Assistance (RFA) from the 78th Military Police (MP) Det (CID), Baghdad, Iraq, to review and determine the identity of a female victim of rape as reported by the Los Angeles Times, dated 11 May 04. Further, to attempt to interview the interpreter that would have been present during her conversation with a lawyer, Sahra JANABI (NFI) whom she reported the incident.

About 1300, 17 Jun 04, INV <sup>b7c-1, b6-1</sup> [REDACTED], this office, interviewed SGT <sup>b7c-3, b6-3</sup> [REDACTED], 301st MP Company, Baghdad Central Confinement Facility (BCCF), Abu Ghraib, Iraq (AGI), as to her knowledge of a lawyer visiting with female detainees. SGT [REDACTED] stated she recalled the incident and she escorted the female lawyer around to the various locations inside the "hard site." SGT [REDACTED] stated she logged everything into the daily duty journal. The journal revealed about 1535, 27 Mar 04, Sahrah JANABI, from the Iraqi Governing Counsel, Humanitarian Aide Department, came to BCCF and visited with five female detainees; <sup>b7c-3, b6-3</sup> [REDACTED] National Detainee Reporting System (NDRS) [REDACTED] NDRS [REDACTED] NDRS [REDACTED] NDRS [REDACTED], and [REDACTED] NDRS [REDACTED]. SGT [REDACTED] stated that the nature of the conversation Ms. JANABI had with the detainees was unknown because SGT <sup>b7c-3, b6-3</sup> [REDACTED] section did not have a translator to monitor their discussions.

AGENT'S COMMENT: The logs were not collected, due to the fact they were running logs.

AGENT'S COMMENT: It was determined after viewing the dossier photograph, that Detainee [REDACTED] was a male.

<sup>b7c-3, b6-3</sup> About 0900, 23 Jun 04, INV <sup>b7c-1, b6-1</sup> [REDACTED] coordinated with SGT <sup>b7c-3, b6-3</sup> [REDACTED], 391<sup>st</sup> MP BN, Detainee Aid Station (DAS), BCCF, AGI, who provided copies of the medical records for Detainees [REDACTED]. No medical record could be obtained for Detainees [REDACTED]. (See Medical Records)

<sup>b7c-3, b6-3</sup> About 1330, 23 Jun 04, INV <sup>b7c-1, b6-1</sup> [REDACTED] coordinated with SSG <sup>b7c-3, b6-3</sup> [REDACTED], Magistrates Cell, BCCF, AGI, to obtain detainee files of the aforementioned detainees. Copies of the detainee files for Detainees [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were obtained. Furthermore, Detainees [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] were not Coalition Detainees, but rather Iraqi criminals, thus no detainee file was ever kept by BCCF, AGI. (See Detainee Files)

AGENT'S COMMENT: This office coordinated with the originating Case Agent, who advised to close this RFA.

Iraqi women stigmatized by prison  
Once freed, they often disappear

BAGHDAD -- Amal Swadi Kadhern has a tough job with little thanks. The Baghdad lawyer works to free women being held in U.S.-run jails in Iraq and when she does, she rarely hears from them again.

"They disappear," Ms. Kadhern said in an interview. "Their families either move, or when I call they say that she has 'travelled.'"

According to the International Committee of the Red Cross, about 30 Iraqi women were jailed in the infamous Abu Ghraib prison last October; now, only two women remain. Most of the women, like thousands of men detained in the jail, were held for allegedly supporting insurgents opposed to the U.S.-led occupation.

After reports of physical abuse and sexual humiliation of inmates at Abu Ghraib, Iraqi women released from U.S.-run jails carry not only the stigma of having been behind bars, but also the shame of being seen as unchaste.

"In Iraqi society, when a woman exits a prison there will be a lot of questions after her name," explained Jinan Salman, a researcher at the Ministry of Justice. "What happened to her in prison?"

In this conservative Arab and Muslim society, a woman's honour is based on her chastity.

"We consider the woman's virginity the most important thing," added Ms. Salman. "It is a document of honour, not only for her but for her whole tribe." That honour cannot be recovered simply by punishing rapists and abusers; for many, the dishonoured victim must be killed.

Some families escape the shame by abandoning their homes and moving away. "I visited one woman I got released on the evening of her release," said Ms. Kadhern, who volunteers her services on behalf of female prisoners. "Her family's house was empty. They moved out that day."

**One former detainee who is not afraid to speak about her experience is Mithal Il-Hassani, who was arrested by U.S. forces and accused of supporting insurgents.**

**The 55-year-old divorced mother of five was detained for three months and released in May. Speaking in hushed tones in her living room, Ms. Il-Hassani told of being dragged, beaten, and stripped of her clothes by U.S. soldiers.**

Two of her former prison-mates were sisters Hoda and Nahla al-Azzawi, now the last two women still being held at Abu Ghraib. The sisters have been behind bars for more than seven months, also accused of supporting insurgents.

Last week, Hoda's daughter, Farah, was able to visit her mother, a 35-year-old businesswoman. Farah would not speak of any abuse against her mother, but predicted that she will not accept any mark of shame when she finally leaves the jail.


"My mother will go out in the streets and she will go back to work," she said, "and she won't disappear."

The U.S. military has not charged any U.S. soldiers for assaulting or abusing female detainees. A Pentagon report prepared by U.S. Army Major-General Antonio Taguba, however, found that soldiers videotaped and photographed naked female detainees at Abu Ghraib.

Many Iraqis believe that for their women to be seen naked, or possibly sexually assaulted, by foreign soldiers disgraces the nation of Iraq as a whole. "They want to humiliate the Iraqis, because they hate us," said Jenan Doleimi, a 30-year-old Baghdad resident. "Do you think any father will walk in the street when people point to him and say, 'How shameful. That man's daughter was violated by the Americans?'"

Ms. Doleimi was not surprised by the infamous photographs depicting sexual humiliation and physical abuse of male Iraqi detainees by U.S. troops. Like most Iraqis, she had heard of a letter attributed to "Noor," a woman said to be jailed in Abu Ghraib.

In the letter, circulated last winter, Noor wrote that she had been raped by a U.S. soldier and that male and female Iraqi prisoners were kept naked in their cells. The letter (which has been distributed by insurgent groups as part of their efforts to recruit members) called on Iraqis to attack the prison and kill the detainees to save them from their humiliation and suffering.

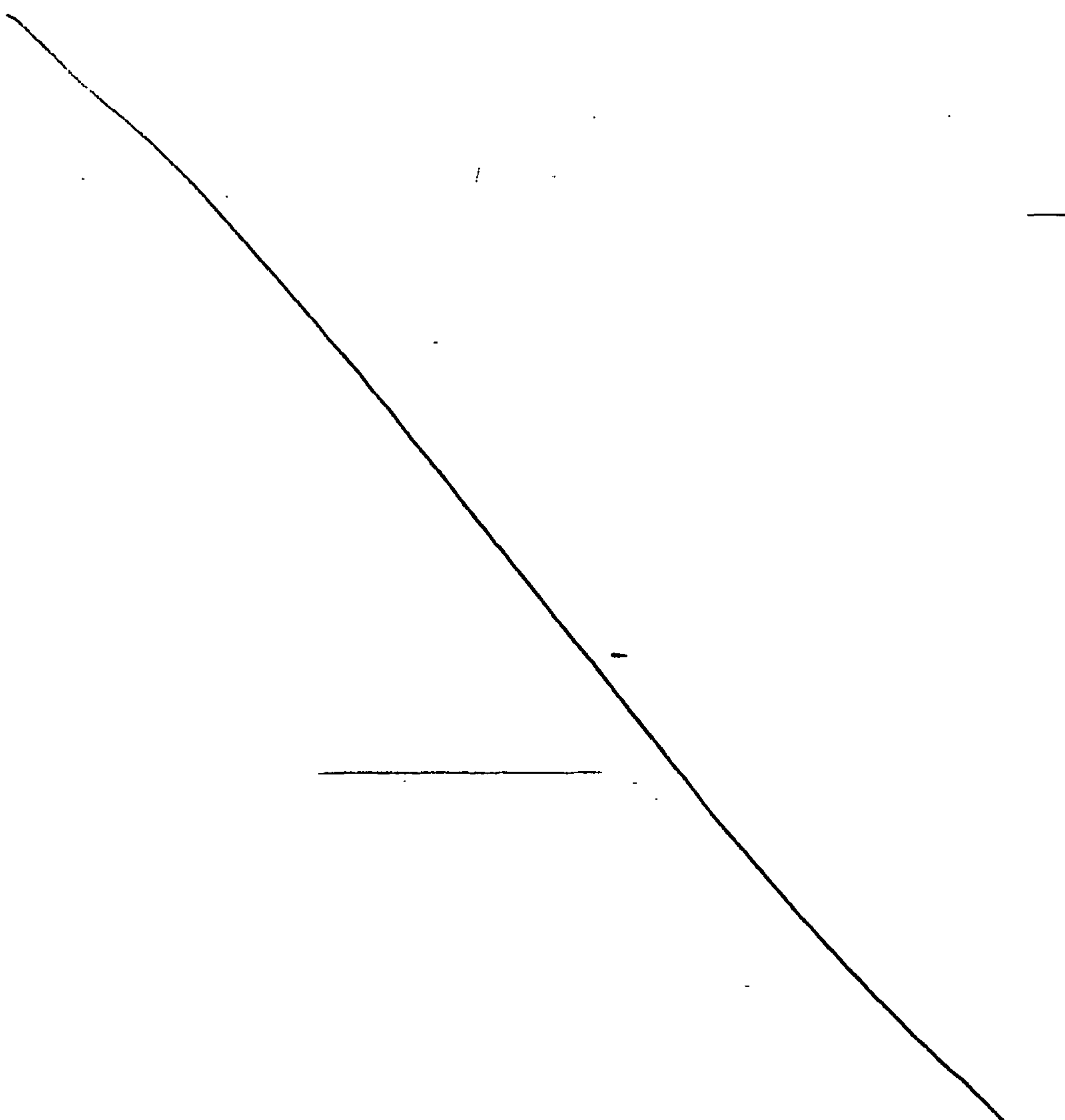
