"This is an Operation Iraqi Freedom investigation"

This office was notified by MSG [REDACTED] Provost Marshal Office, 3rd MP Battalion (Deployed), Baghdad International Airport, Baghdad, Iraq, who reported that an American soldier stole approximately \$40,000.00 from an Iraqi citizen. *b7c, b6, b7*

Investigation did not develop sufficient evidence to prove or disprove [REDACTED] allegation that U.S. soldiers stole approximately \$40,000.00 from him. Further, the investigation did not diminish the integrity or credibility of Mr [REDACTED] allegation. *b7c, b6, b7*

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DETAILS

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: About 1300, 29 Apr 03, MSG [REDACTED] b7C, b6-4
Provost Marshal Office, 3rd MP Battalion (Deployed), Division Collection Control Point (DCCP), Baghdad International Airport, Baghdad, Iraq, reported a U.S. soldier stole approximately \$40,000.00 from an Enemy Prisoner of War (EPW).

About 1715, 29 Apr 03, SA [REDACTED] b7C, b2, b6-1 interviewed Mr [REDACTED] b7C, b6-4 who provided a statement, in Arabic, detailing how the money was stolen (See written statement for details). b7C, b6

Agent's Comment: Mr [REDACTED] b7C, b6-4 Interpreter, assigned to the 3rd MP Battalion, was assigned to assist in the conduct of the interview and subsequently translated the statement.

About 1730, 29 Apr 03, SA [REDACTED] b7C, b2, b6-1 interviewed Mr [REDACTED] b7C, b6-4 Alshreka Street, Alhusainy-Maskat, Baghdad, Iraq, who provided a statement, in Arabic, detailing how the money was stolen (See written statement for details).

Agent's Comment: Mr [REDACTED] b7C, b6-4 was assigned to assist in the conduct of the interview and subsequently translated the statement.

About 1840, 29 Apr 03, SA [REDACTED] b7C, b6-1 interviewed Mr [REDACTED] b7C, b6-4 who stated Mr [REDACTED] b7C, b6-4 had related to him that he did not notice the names of the soldiers who took the money or any other identifying traits. Mr [REDACTED] stated one of the soldiers who transported him to the DCCP was one of the soldiers that stole the money.

About 1900, 29 Apr 03, SA [REDACTED] b7C, b6-1 coordinated with MSG [REDACTED] b7C, b6-4 who stated Mr [REDACTED] and Mr [REDACTED] were transported to the DCCP by C Co, 3rd Forward Support Battalion (FSB) (Deployed), Fort Stewart, GA. MSG [REDACTED] further stated he did not believe the 3rd FSB was the capturing unit. MSG [REDACTED] b7C, b6 stated the 3rd FSB transports captured EPWs to the DCCP daily.

Between 1935 and 2055, 29 Apr 03, SA [REDACTED] b7C, b6-1 and SA [REDACTED] b7C, b2, b6-1 this office, conducted a search of the administrative storage room where

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DETAILS

all EPW belongings are kept. The search for the money, met with negative results.

About 0840, 1 May 03, SA [redacted] interviewed 2LT [redacted] Platoon Leader, B Co, 3rd FSB (Deployed), Fort Stewart, GA, who stated other units captured the EPWs and turned them into the 3rd FSB for transport to the DCCP. 2LT [redacted] further stated when the EPWS are turned over to his unit, there was no tracking system in place to determine who the capturing unit was.

Between 1 May 03 and 3 Jun 03, numerous attempts were made to locate and re-interview Mr [redacted] and Mr [redacted]. All attempts met with negative results.

On 9 Jun 03, this office attempted to determine what unit was working in the area where Mr [redacted] stated the money was stolen. All attempts met with negative results.

Agent's Comment: 1st Armored Division assumed responsibilities of the Baghdad area on or about 27 May 03.

About 0930, 21 Jun 03, this office determined that the 3rd FSB was in the process of re-deployment to the U.S. via Kuwait.

Agent's Comment: The current whereabouts of the victim is unknown as is what unit may have been in the area. ///Last Entry///

THIS OFFICE WAS NOTIFIED BY THE PMO THAT A PRISONER REPORTED THE THEFT OF PERSONAL FUNDS BY U.S. SOLDIERS.

PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATION DISCLOSED THAT ON 28 APR 03, MR.

[REDACTED] AND HIS BROTHER (MR. [REDACTED]) BROTHER,

[REDACTED] WERE

b7C, b6-4

STOPPED AT A U.S. CHECKPOINT ON AL FALESTEEN STREET, BAGHDAD, IRAQ. THEY WERE FOUND IN POSSESSION OF A 9MM HANDGUN, AND SUBSEQUENTLY DETAINED AS SUSPECTED ENEMY PRISONER'S OF WAR (EPW).

THE TWO VICTIMS ALLEGE THAT THEY WERE IN POSSESSION OF A BLACK BAG CONTAINING \$40,000.00 IN U.S. CURRENCY, AND THAT U.S. SOLDIERS SEIZED THE MONEY. COORDINATION WITH THE DIVISION COLLECTION CONTROL POINT (DCCP), 3RD MILITARY POLICE BATTALION (DEPLOYED), BAGHDAD INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT, BAGHDAD, IRAQ, REVEALED THERE WAS NO RECORD OF \$40,000 BEING TURNED OVER WITH THE PRISONERS.

THE VICTIM AND HIS BROTHER PROVIDED STATEMENTS REPORTING THAT THE SOLDIERS DID SEIZE THE U.S. CURRENCY. THE STATEMENTS WERE CONSISTENT WITH EACH OTHER.

A SEARCH OF THE PERSONAL ITEMS AT THE CAMP, BELONGING TO MR. [REDACTED] AND MR. [REDACTED] FAILED TO LOCATE THE MONEY. *b7C, b6A*

INVESTIGATION CONTINUES BY CID.

7. COMMANDERS ARE REMINDED OF THE PROVISIONS OF AR 600-8-2 PERTAINING TO SUSPENSION OF FAVORABLE PERSONNEL ACTIONS AND AR 380-67 FOR THE SUSPENSION OF SECURITY CLEARANCES OF PERSONS UNDER INVESTIGATION.

8. CID REPORTS ARE EXEMPT FROM AUTOMATIC TERMINATION OF PROTECTIVE MARKINGS IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 3, AR 25-55.
