Commander's Report of Disciplinary Action Taken (DA Form 4833) is not required.

DETAILS

BASIS FOR INVESTIGATION: About 1600, 10 Jun 04, this office was notified by CPT [REDACTED] Division Central Collection Point (DCCP), Legal Advisor, Forward Operation Base (FOB) Danger, APO AE 09392, of the suspected abuse of Detainee Number (DN) [REDACTED] prior to his transfer to DCCP.

About 1210, 11 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] and SA [REDACTED] briefed CW2 [REDACTED] OIC, DCCP, on the accusations of abuse on detainee [REDACTED] CW2 [REDACTED] related that detainee had been in DCCP custody since 11 May 04; however, ODA 065 detained the individual on 9 May 04. CW2 [REDACTED] related the detainee did not initially report the abuse when he in processed the DCCP. Although when CW2 [REDACTED] conducted his weekly censing session; prisoners DN [REDACTED] informed him that he had been slapped three times in the face by an Arabic interpreter and kept in a small cell which played loud music. Mr [REDACTED] related he then informed SJA of this incident. Additionally, Mr [REDACTED] related DOD Interpreter, GS4 [REDACTED] level 3+ interviewed DN [REDACTED] and related he was very cooperative during the initial interview and would be available to interpret if needed.

AGENTS COMMENT: Mr [REDACTED] accompanied with Mr [REDACTED] SA [REDACTED] and SA [REDACTED] observed SA [REDACTED] interview DN [REDACTED]

About 1450, 11 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] interviewed DN [REDACTED] Mr [REDACTED] 1st INF DIV, DCCP, FOB Danger, APO AE 09392, with DOD Interpreter GS4 [REDACTED] regarding his allegation of abuse by Coalition forces between 9 -11, May 04, prior to being transferred to the DCCP. Mr [REDACTED] provided a sworn statement in which he refused to make a complaint regarding an incident wherein Mr [REDACTED] was slapped in the face by an "Arabic Interpreter" (NFI) while being questioned by US Forces. Mr [REDACTED] was adamant that US Forces never abused him; rather the US forces corrected the translator when he slapped him in the face. Mr [REDACTED] further related he had been treated very well by US forces at the DCCP and only wished to go home to his family. (See sworn statement and English translation of Mr [REDACTED] for details)

About 1430, 14 Jun 04, SA [REDACTED] advised Mr [REDACTED] of his legal rights which he waved, but refused to provide a sworn statement, fingerprints or mug shot. Mr [REDACTED] adamantly denied any allegation of abuse, claimed his loyalty was to U.S. Forces, rather than Iraq. Mr [REDACTED] related he is a college professor and quit his job to assist the American forces when the war began. Mr [REDACTED] was from Kurdistan and was extremely disturbed when he found out about the false atrocities made against him. Mr [REDACTED] did confirm he was the interpreter for the interrogation of DN [REDACTED], Mr [REDACTED] but adamantly denied ever slapping any detainee in the face.

I [REDACTED], was arrested on Saturday, May 9, 2004 by American force. They took me from my home with my hands cuffed and eyes blinded to the cage of the north gate. I stayed there for one day, then the American force came to me afternoon and cuffed my hands and blinded my eyes and took me to somewhere I don't know where it is but it is in Tikreet. They put me in a cell of about one meter (little bit over one meter) for two days or more. There was tape recorder with a tape ~~on~~ on in loud voice and they did not let me sleep even for a minute and without food and water. After that the investigator called me for questioning. He was wearing a mask and asked me several questions. Suddenly I was beaten on my face by the translator with his hand three times but the investigator stopped his beating me. Then they took me to the small cell and I refused to get in. Then the investigator came and took me again to the ~~in~~ investigation for a half hour. After that they brought me water and food. At the night of that day they took me here with hands cuffed and eyes blinded in this location.

- Question: Did the translator hit you by his fist or ~~pan~~ palm?

Answer: He beated me with his palm

- Question: Do you want to complain formerly against this translator?

Answer: no

- Question: How do Americans treat you here?

Answer: Very good

- Question: Is there any American treating you badly?

Answer: no

- Question: How do CID treat you in this interview?

Answer: Very Very Very good

- Question: Do you want to add anything to this statement?

Answer: No, I don't want to add anything.
