Due to the complexity of the investigation, investigative team members will have to conduct the interviews. This will require constant travel by FBI personnel. Overseas travel is anticipated within the next 60 days. Each week, several team members are traveling throughout the United States conducting interviews.

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In addition to [redacted] it will be necessary to interview and gather evidence and documents from other US Government agencies. Already, evidence preservation letters and requests for documents have been made to multiple components of the DOD and the Department of State. The contracts and documents involved in this matter are voluminous and will require months to review and analyze. IntelPlus has been employed to facilitate the storage, [redacted] and retrieving of the documents.
