1. Claimants name and address: [REDACTED] Iraq.
2. Incident date and place the incident occurred giving rise to the claim: Incident occurred on 29 Sep 05, in Khalis, Iraq.
3. Amount of claim and filing date: Claimant filed a claim in the amount of \$11,000 on 11 Nov 05.
4. Chapter the claim was considered under and a brief description of the incident or of the issues raised by the claimant on reconsideration: Foreign Claims Act and Chapter 10, AR 27-20; claim filed for a death resulting from a vehicle collision with US Forces.
5. Facts: On 29 Sep 05 the claimant's father died in a vehicle collision with US Forces.
6. Opinion: In order to form a basis for a claim under the FCA, the incident in question must have arisen outside the United States the incident must be caused by either non-combat activities of the United States Armed Forces or by negligent or wrongful acts of military members or civilian employees of the Armed Forces. The evidence submitted is insufficient to support the claim and it presents two questionable points. First, there is no engine of the vehicle shown in the pictures which reasonably led to the question of the vehicle's involvement in the incident that gave rise to the claim. Secondly, after carefully examining the pictures and discovering the absence of blood trail or evidence on the car seats or in any area of the car, it is appropriate to conclude that this claim is not compensable.
7. Recommended Action: This claim is not payable under the FCA for the above mentioned reasons. Consequently this claim for \$11,000 is denied.

5. Facts: The claimant's father died in a vehicle collision with US Forces.
6. Opinion: In order to form a basis for a claim under the FCA, the incident in question must have arisen outside the United States. In addition, the incident must be caused by either non-combat activities of the United States Armed Forces or by negligent or wrongful acts of military members or civilian employees of the Armed Forces. Upon reconsideration of the claim the US government stands firm on its original denial decision. Its hard to believe that someone would be interested in stealing a broken engine and thus raise an issue on the validity of the claim. There is no evidence to substantiate that US negligence or wrongful act was involved.
7. Recommended Action: This claim is not payable under the FCA for the above mentioned reasons. Consequently this claim for \$11,000 is denied.
