I was assigned as the Executive Officer (Major) for the 9th Engineer Battalion, Schweinfurt, Germany, from April 1998 to June 1999. During that time, I had multiple occasions to observe Staff Sergeant (SSG) Werst's conduct, both on and off duty. He worked in both an Engineer Squad and as an Administrative Clerk in the Battalion Personnel Administrative Center (PAC). As the Battalion's Executive Officer, I observed maintenance operations in the motor pool and my contact with SSG Werst was many times each week. My contact with SSG Werst was many times daily during the time he worked as an Administrative Clerk in the Battalion PAC.

During my 15 month assignment, SSG Werst was an exemplary Soldier who was always willing to go the extra distance required to ensure any assigned job was done correctly. There were never any occasions of disciplinary problems involving him and he was often looked to as a problem solver for junior enlisted Soldiers. He was an excellent mentor - caring and involved with those under his command. During my time with him he was truly an exceptional Soldier and leader.

I was able to observe SSG Werst on many occasions where he was with his wife and family - Unit functions, Organization Day, Christmas Ball, etc. It was easy to see that he was both a dedicated father and husband. He enjoyed life in the Army and working hard at his job as well as the sights and experiences offered in Germany.

His tactical and technical proficiency combined with his outstanding leadership in Engineer and Infantry operations were essential to my platoon's and battalion's success during Operation Ivy Blizzard and the mission A/1-8 IN executed on 2 JAN 03.

After training with and conversing with him during these planning phases for each of our missions, I immediately gained a respect for his knowledge, experience, and

This is my story; please do not stop reading until the end!

I was born September 1956. My parents divorced not long afterwards. My mother was my primary caregiver until January 1969 when she died of cancer. Thankfully, since I was only 12, I had a sister and brother-in-law that took me to raise. At that time, I had the first "true" family I had ever had. My sister and brother-in-law made great parents, and he was the only "dad" I ever knew.

My brother-in-law, James L. Watson Jr. (Jimmy), was a helicopter pilot with the United States Marine Corps. After he served 13 months in Vietnam, he was stationed at Santa Ana Air Facility in Tustin, California. At that time, my sister and Jimmy decided to take in foster children because they were unable to have children.

On March 11, 1974, Shane Werst was placed in our home as our first foster child. We were so excited. I loved being an aunt and taking care of him. It was one of the most memorable days of my life. Three months later, we received his sister Shelly. We had a perfect family! What other blessings could we ever want? They were such good children and brought us such joy. The court was going to let my sister and brother-in-law adopt Shane and Shelly; but our whole world came tumbling down on us faster than we could imagine. On February 18, 1975, Capt. James L. Watson Jr. was killed in a helicopter crash while on a training mission around El Toro, CA. Following the funeral, my sister and I had to give up the two children we had grown to love so much. They stayed in California and we moved to Tennessee.

Throughout the years, Shane and Shelly's new adoptive parents were great about letting us stay in contact. Thank the Lord for them. They sent us photos and came to Cleveland, TN, to visit us.

After Shane joined the Army, he was stationed in Ft. Benning, GA. This was close enough to come visit us; it was wonderful being around him. We have kept in close contact since he has been in the Army. I met his wife Stacey right after they married, and I have been around Shane as a father with his girls', Kendra and Brooke. I've never seen such a devoted dad. Many dads with young children go out with their buddies all the

time and have no close ties to their children, but NOT SHANE!! He puts his wife and daughters before anything else, except his military duties. The Army has provided him a true military family life

I want to talk about Shane as a soldier in the Army. He has been such a "gung ho" soldier and so pro Army. He is decorated for serving in Kosovo and South Korea and received a bronze medal. It seems 13 years of complete devotion means nothing now. Would he have made it to be a squad leader if he was not a very dedicated soldier? All the medals and honors have just faded away.

I helped him when he was in Iraq by sending him and his troops 31 boxes of items to help them to get through the year. Shane asked me to send one of everything I sent for each of his troops. He did not want to get anything that he couldn't share with others.

Now I ask you to give him some compassion. You "the United States" send these soldiers over to Iraq to keep "peace;" I do not know what went on over there, but I do know Shane's character as well as if he was my own son!

I lost the only "dad" I knew to the Marine Corps. Please don't let me loose the only "son" I've ever felt I've had, to the Army.

Again, please show some compassion to a very dedicated soldier!!

I served with SSG Werst during this period of time, which included deployments to the National Training Center and Iraq. Our paths crossed on numerous occasions in the field, in garrison, and at family support group meetings. I knew him and his wife Stacy on a personal and professional basis.

SSG Werst is a skilled, professional soldier. He cared for the men under his command as their Squad Leader. I saw this on a regular basis as I visited, and at times lived with, Bravo Company in Iraq. I watched him work with, encourage, and train his soldiers in the profession he loved. Never was there a time that he did not concern himself for their personal well-being and that of their families. He frequently put the best interest of his squad above his own. And while I cannot comment on his technical proficiency (due to my inexperience), I can say that he was admired by soldiers above and below him in rank, for his skill and abilities as a leader of men. The respect I saw given to him was the kind given to one who knows his craft especially well. He was trusted both up and down the chain of command.

SSG Werst is also a committed family man. He loves and values Stacy and their children more than anything on this earth. At Fort Carson, I saw them as having a warm and loving home, which overflowed to others. Both Shane and Stacy were involved in the family support group at Bravo Company. There, I saw them taking care of younger soldiers and families through their actions and their words. It was a team effort on their part. On several occasions I had the opportunity to talk with Shane and Stacy about some concerns they had for several soldiers and family members in Bravo Company – people that they were trying to help. These actions are a statement of who they are as a couple. To me, this experience speaks volumes to the quality of their relationship and the importance of family in their lives. Even now, SSG Werst's first concern is how to best take care of his loved ones.

Finally, SSG Werst is a spiritual man, a person of faith. He attended many of my field worship services throughout our time together in Iraq. From my conversations with him, I can tell you that he is a man who believes in right and wrong, accountability and responsibility, and forgiveness and grace.

When the occasion for reading this letter is long forgotten, SSG Werst will need to rebuild his life. I think it is important to note that he has a life that can be rebuilt. The foundation for it is already in place: in the people he loves, in the faith he espouses, and in the standards of conduct that he lives by in his daily life. There are productive days ahead him. He will go on to make new contributions for his own well-being, for the good of his family, and for the benefit of the larger community. I expect him to rise and make a valuable impact in the future. I am confident of it.
