FACTS AND FINDINGS OF INVESTIGATION:

FACTS: AT APPX. 1430 HRS, A TROOPER WAS MANNING A GUARD POSITION [REDACTED] ON THE SOUTHEASTERN CORNER OF [REDACTED] WHEN A TOYOTA WITH 2X LN MALES APPROACHED THE M1 CP. THE VEHICLE DISREGARDED MULTIPLE ATTEMPTS BY THE INP'S MANNING THE CP TO STOP IT, WHICH WAS ALSO CLEARLY MARKED. PASSING THE CP, THE VEHICLE WAS SIGNALLED BY THE GUARD TO STOP BY HAND AND ARM SIGNALS AND WAS SIGNALLED TO MOVE TO THE M1 CP FOR CLEARANCE BY THE INPD. THE DRIVER DISREGARDED THE INSTRUCTIONS AND THEN IMMEDIATELY INCREASED HIS SPEED, HEADING DUE EAST TOWARDS SAMARRA AND [REDACTED] (GUARD TOWER) IMMEDIATELY SOUNDED HIS HORN INITIATING EOF. THE GUARD AT [REDACTED] AGAIN WENT THROUGH EOF PROCEDURES BY WAVING A VS-17 PANEL, HAND AND ARM SIGNALS AND VOICE COMMANDS ("KIF"). AT 10M, THE GUARD BELIEVED THE VEHICLE TO BE A SVBIED AND FIRED A 3-5 RND BURST INTO THE FRONT OF THE VEHICLE TO DISABLE IT. THE VEHICLE STOPPED AND 1X LN DISMOUNTED AND RAN TOWARDS SAMARRA. A TEAM FROM [REDACTED] WAS DEPLOYED IOT CLEAR THE VEHICLE. 1X LN WAS SEVERELY WIA (LATER DOW AT [REDACTED] FAS) AND THE OTHER LN WAS CAPTURED BY INP. BOTH LNS WERE SEVERLY INTOXICATED AND AN OPEN BOTTLE OF WHISKEY AND 2X FULL CUPS OF WHISKEY WERE INSIDE THE PASSENGER COMPARTMENT OF THE VEHICLE. THERE WERE 2X LOADED AK-47S INSIDE THE PASSENGER COMPARTMENT AS WELL. THE SURVIVING LN WAS NOT COHERENT AND WAS ON THE VERGE OF PASSING OUT FROM INTOXICATION. THE LNS WERE LATER IDENTIFIED AS OFF-DUTY INPS. EX 2

FINDINGS:

1) THAT VBIEDS AND ISBS POSE A CLEAR THREAT WITHIN THE TF 3-187 IN AO. THERE HAVE BEEN 6X VBIEDS IN THE LAST 5 MO, WITH THE LAST ATTACK INITIATED ON 11 APR 06. THE PROPER MEANS TO COMBAT SUSPECTED ISBS AND SVBIEDS IS TO BEGIN EOF AND MAINTAIN STAND-OFF. LNS WITHIN THE AO UNDERSTAND THE PROCEDURES AT CF CPS. IAW THE ROE, "WHEN HOSTILE INTENT IS PRESENT, THE RIGHT EXISTS TO USE PROPORTIONAL FORCE, INCLUDING ARMED FORCE, IN SELF-DEFENSE BY ALL NECESSARY MEANS AVAILABLE TO DETER OR NEUTRALIZE THE POTENTIAL ATTACKER OR, IF NECESSARY, DESTROY THE THREAT." THE ROE ALSO STATES THAT CF MUST USE

AS OF 01 MARCH 2006

GRADUATED FORCE. GRADUATED FORCE PREVENTS THE USE OF DEADLY FORCE WITHOUT ALLOWING THE INDIVIDUAL A REASONABLE MEANS TO RESPOND TO CF. THE GUARD INTERPRETED THE LN DRIVER'S NONCOMPLIANCE WITH HIS INSTRUCTIONS (AND FURTHER MOVEMENT IN SPITE OF REPEATED ORDERS TO STOP) AS A HOSTILE ACT AND A DIRECT THREAT TO HIMSELF AND OTHER CF AROUND HIM. ONLY THEN DID HE USE LETHAL FORCE TO DISABLE THE VEHICLE AND PROTECT HIMSELF AND HIS BATTLE BUDDIES.

2) THAT THE GUARD'S APPLICATION OF PUBLISHED EOF PROCEDURES WAS TO STANDARD AND GAVE THE LN EVERY OPPORTUNITY TO ALTER HIS BEHAVIOR AND SAVE HIS OWN LIFE. ANY REASONABLE PERSON WOULD IMMEDIATELY STOP IF A HEAVILY ARMED SOLDIER WAVED, YELLED AND POINTED A WEAPON AT THEM. THE FACT THAT THE LN'S WERE INTOXICATED IS NOT RELEVANT TO THE GUARD'S APPLICATION OF LETHAL FORCE AS HE HAD NO WAY OF KNOWING THE MENTAL STATE OR CAPACITY OF THE MEN IN THE VEHICLE APPROACHING HIM.

RECOMMENDATION(S) OF INVESTIGATION: NO FURTHER ADMINISTRATIVE OR UCMJ ACTION AGAINST ANY SOLDIER. CONTINUE TO REVIEW AND ENFORCE EOF PROCEDURES PRIOR TO AND DURING EVERY OPERATION.

CJA COMMENT: WHILE THE LN'S INTOXICATION IS NOT RELEVANT TO DETERMINING WHETHER THE TROOPER'S USE OF FORCE WAS PROPER, IT IS RELEVANT IN ESTABLISHING THE RECKLESSNESS OF THE LN'S AND THEIR DISREGARD OF CLEAR AND UNAMBIGUOUS EOF PROCEDURES.

SUBJECT: 15-6 Investigation Facts, Findings and Recommendations to A/3 STB Escalation of Force Incident, 26 April 2006.

1. The following are the facts of the A/3 STB Escalation of Force Incident, 24 April 2006:

At 1430 Hrs on 26 April 2006, [REDACTED] manned a guard position on the southeastern most corner of Patrol Base Razor. At 1430 a Toyota Sprinter with two local national approached the M1 checkpoint. The vehicle disregarded the checkpoint which was clearly marked. The vehicle was signaled by [REDACTED] to stop, the vehicle stopped and was given instruction to move to the M1 checkpoint for clearance by the INPD (See Exhibit A). The driver disregarded the instructions given to him. The local national immediately increased his speed and headed east towards Sammara proper. [REDACTED] again went through the steps of EOF, the driver was within 10 meters and could hear and see [REDACTED] clearly. [REDACTED] raised his weapon as a show of force and the vehicle again accelerated towards Sammara. [REDACTED] then engaged the vehicle with a 5-7 round burst to disable the vehicle (See Exhibit C1-2). The vehicle stopped, one LNs dismounted and ran towards Samarra, the second LN slumped over in the vehicle. A team was then deployed from Patrol Base Razor in order to clear the vehicle. One local national was severely wounded (later died of wound at Patrol Base Razors FAS), the second was secured by 1/3 INP BN members and moved to the Patrol Base Razor ECP. Both LNs were extremely intoxicated, an open bottle of whiskey and two cups full of whiskey were inside the passenger compartment of the Toyota. Additionally, both LNs were carrying loaded AK-47s in the passenger compartment. The surviving LN was not coherent and on the verge of passing out from intoxication. Lastly, the INP controlling the CP tried to stop this vehicle and the occupants disregarded their instructions multiple times before speeding through and being engaged.

2. The following are the findings of the A/3 STB Escalation of Force Incident, 24 April 2006:

Vehicle Borne IED's and Individual Suicide Bombers (ISBs) pose a clear threat within the Area of Operations for all units assigned to 3-187IN, as indicated in Enclosure 5, FRAGO 43 to 3/187 (Exhibit F). There have been instances of AIF willing to kill themselves in order to kill US forces in the 3-187IN AO. The most recent attack was initiated against C/3-187 on 11Apr06. In the last 5 months, there have been 6 VBIED incidents in AO IRON (Exhibit E).

The proper means to combat suspected ISBs and SVBIEDs is to begin escalation of force procedures and maintain stand-off. As directed in FRAGO 43, [REDACTED]

Local Nationals within the 3-187IN AO know not to interfere with Coalition Forces and to follow instructions at traffic control points. According to the Rules of Engagement [REDACTED]

SUBJECT: 15-6 Investigation Facts, Findings and Recommendations to A/3 STB Escalation of Force Incident, 24 April 2006.

The ROE also states that Coalition Forces must use graduated force. Graduated Force prevents the use of deadly force without allowing the individual a reasonable means to respond to Coalition Forces. [REDACTED] interpreted the LN driver's noncompliance with his instructions and further movement in spite of repeated orders to stop as a hostile act and a direct threat to himself and other coalition forces around him. He then used lethal force to disable the vehicle and protect himself and his battle buddies. His application of published escalation of force procedures was to standard and gave the LN every opportunity to alter his behavior and save his own life. Any reasonable person stop whatever they were doing immediately if a heavily armed Soldier waved, yelled, and pointed a weapon at them. The fact that the LN's were intoxicated is not relevant to any analysis of [REDACTED]'s application of lethal force as he had no way of knowing the mental state or capacity of the men in the vehicle approaching him.

3. Recommendations by the Investigating Officer (IO) in reference to the findings of the B/3-187IN Escalation of Force on 25 April 2006:

Based on my findings the proper Escalation of Force procedures were used within the Rules of Engagement for Task Force Band of Brothers. I recommend no further administrative or UCMJ action against PFC Johnston or any other Soldier. I recommend that A/3 STB and all units within Task Force Iron continue to review and enforce Escalation of Force procedures prior to and during every operation.

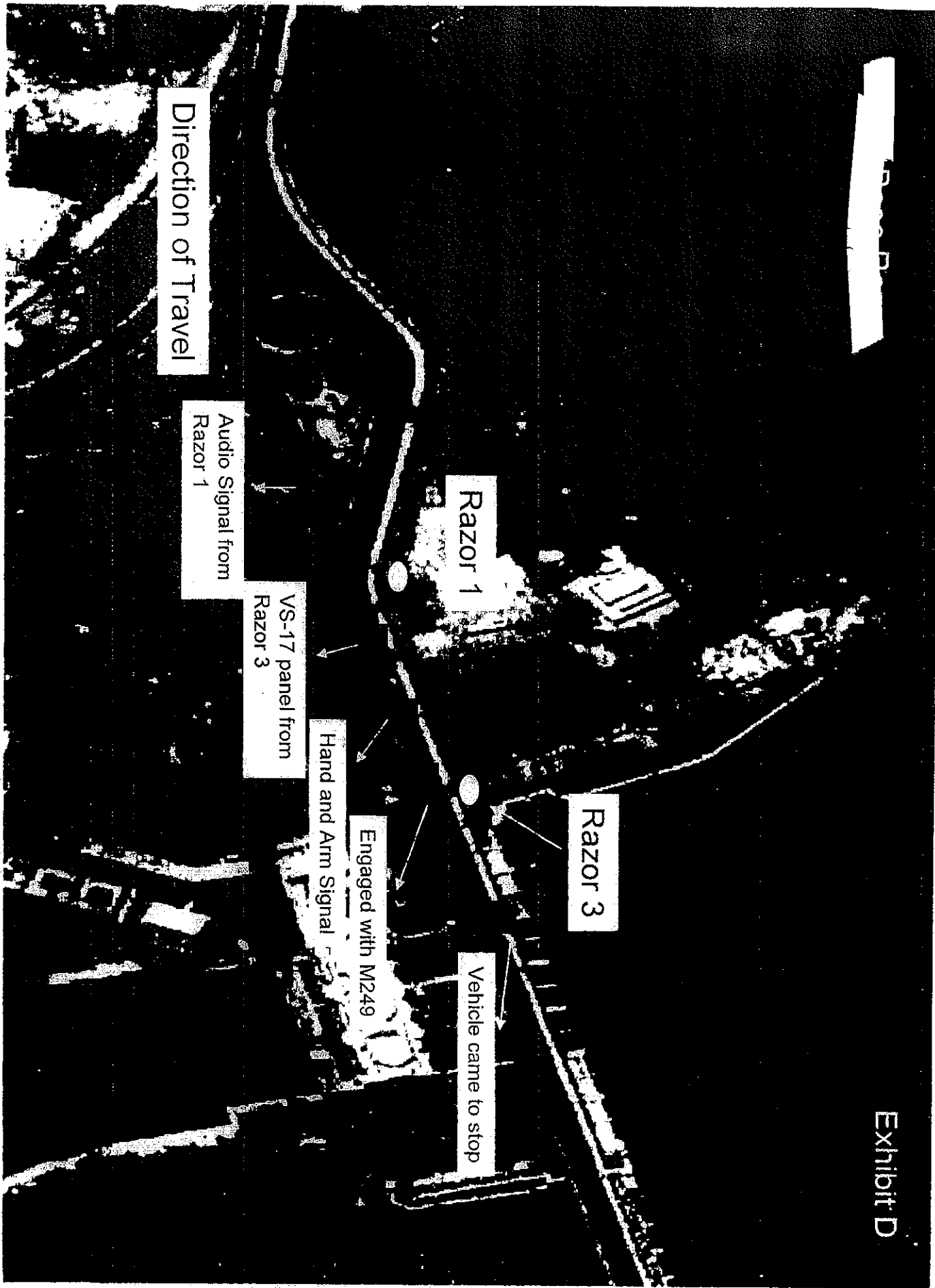

I [REDACTED] on 26 April 2006 at P.B. Razor at Razor 3 position facing west. Brief by the S.O.G [REDACTED] about the last days. Yesterday escalation of force by the MOI found I.E.D material in the truck. Today at 1400 a vehical coming from the west by pass 21 the check point. Razor 1 sound the horn which initiated escalation. By the vehical kept moving I throw the VS 17 panel in front of the 50 cal. By then the vehical was still moving at this time I felt it might be a SVB IED. I got out and showed hand and arm signals and yelled KIF 3 times. The vehical kept moving and I engaged with my M249 3 to 5 round burst into the front of the vehical. The vehical pass Razor 3 came to a slow roll. The passenger got out the drivers door open the vehical kept moving and stop about 150-200 meters, stop in the west bound lane. At the same time the passenger started to move east and I yelled stop and put up his hands. The passenger kept walking got into

VBIED Roll-Up, AO IRON 27 DEC 2005 – 25 MAR 2006

At 271340DEC05 an MOI commando patrol was struck by a VBIED on [REDACTED] EX 2
[REDACTED] The VBIED was described as a white truck which approached the patrol from the left flank and detonated between the first and second trucks of the patrol. An MOI informant had described this attack in detail, along with AIF who would be filming the attack in a black Opal. Based on the informant's information, commandos positively ID'd 2 AIF in a black Opal filming the attack. The blast of the VBIED had cause the Opal to catch fire, which killed the driver, and MOI engaged the filmer, shooting him in the head. ID was recovered naming the driver of the VBIED as Qaiser Najim Altaki, the filmer as Ahmed Latef Medhi (he also had a fake ID with the name of Abdelah Salih Ferhan). The driver of the Opal was burned too badly for ID to be recovered. The video being filmed was also destroyed in the fire. BDA: 3 x EKIA, 4 x MOI WIA (evaced to PB Razor, 2 x evaced from PB Razor to FOB Speicher).

At 051220CIAN06 a B/1/17 FA CLP traveling north on the [REDACTED] EX 2
reported being struck by a static VBIED. The VBIED was sitting approximately 1 meter off the right side of the road, and detonated on the 6th vehicle of the 27 vehicle CLP. The VBIED was described as a white, normal cab sized Nissan Datsun pickup truck. The VBIED had no occupants. After the VBIED detonated, KBR employees traveling with the CLP observed 1 x individual sprinting away from the site, a possible triggerman. The VBIED damaged 1 x Humvee (2 x flat tires) and no injuries were reported. The CLP had multiple [REDACTED] in use, including an [REDACTED] EOD is being dispatched to conduct a PBA. UPDATE: Vehicle was a white Datsun with approx 80lbs and the frag was consistent with a 155MM round. Explosives were located in the cab and 2 spots in the bed of the truck. NFI EX 2

At 101421MAR2006, a VBIED Detonated against a Samarra Iraqi Police (IP) combat patrol in the Salah Ad Din province of Iraq, in Samarra vicinity grid [REDACTED] EX 2
The Samarra Joint Coordination Cell (JCC) reported an unknown explosion. Shortly thereafter, the report was updated to a confirmed VBIED Detonation targeting the IPs. The JCC also confirmed IP and Local National (LN) wounded; 8x IP WIA (7x RTD; 1x Air Medevac'd to LSAA for closed head injury); 3x LN WIA (Released); and 1x LN KIA (LN was the Imam for the Authman Eban Afan Mosque). EOD and WIT reported that the VBIED consisted of various types of artillery and mortars; 2x 155mm shipping plugs were discovered; fragments from 160mm and 240mm mortars were identified. The VBIED was a white Toyota truck parked in front of the Sunni mosque named above and was RC triggered. CLOSED: 101742MAR1006.

At 251333MAR2006, a Vehicle Borne IED (VBIED) Detonated against a 1st Special Police Commando Brigade (CDO) patrol in the Salah Ad Din province of Iraq, in Samarra at the intersection of [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] EX 2
The CDO patrol was directly outside the CDO Headquarters. The VBIED detonated effectively against the patrol resulting in 4x CDO WIA. The WIA were ground evaced to Patrol Base (PB) RAZOR's Level II Medical Treatment Facility. The casualties were categorized as 3x Urgent Litter patients and 1x Priority Ambulatory patient. All 4x CDO WIA were Aero-MEDEVACed to LSAA for further treatment.
