1. You are hereby appointed an Investigating Officer pursuant to conduct a Commanders Inquiry, to investigate the circumstances surrounding the shooting and death of local national, [REDACTED] involving Iraqi Army and B/20502 IN on 22 November 2005 during combat operations in Saab Al-Bor, Iraq.
2. In your investigation, all witness statements will be sworn and Privacy Act Statements taken. From the evidence, you will make specific findings into the circumstances behind the incident and the potential for criminal or administrative liability. You will also make recommendations for corrective action to prevent similar acts or incidents and for administrative and/or disciplinary action, if appropriate.
3. You may obtain advice and assistance from the Administrative Law Division, Office of the Staff Judge Advocate. Administrative support will be provided by CPT [REDACTED] the Brigade Legal Office located at Taji, 242-6306.
4. Prior to interviewing any service member whom you suspect may have violated the UCMJ, you must provide an Article 31 rights warning. The Article 31 rights warning should be done using DA Form 3881. Please consult with your legal advisor for more information.
5. Coordinate and report to the Task Force Executive Officer upon receipt of this order for an initial briefing.

\_\_\_\_\_ coordinated with LTC \_\_\_\_\_ for the IA company to conduct the operation with U.S. supervision. CPT \_\_\_\_\_ approved LTC \_\_\_\_\_ plan and provided himself plus 1st section, 1st Platoon (18 soldiers) to overwatch and supervise the mission. 1LT \_\_\_\_\_ the IA company MiTT officer was also on hand to support the mission. As part of his mission brief, CPT \_\_\_\_\_ warned LTC \_\_\_\_\_ about detainee abuse. LTC \_\_\_\_\_ assured CP \_\_\_\_\_ that neither he nor his soldiers would abuse the detainees.

At 0420, the unit departed the Alamo with three BMPs, a WAZ truck, a civilian vehicle, approximately 30 IA Soldiers, and the informant, followed by four M1114s with 18 U.S. Soldiers, 1LT \_\_\_\_\_ and one interpreter. At grid \_\_\_\_\_ just north of the intersection with RTE Blues, the convoy stopped and dismounted the Iraqi Soldiers with six U.S. Soldiers, the informant, and 1LT \_\_\_\_\_ to establish the ambush. The remainder of the patrol moved north to the Iraqi TCP \_\_\_\_\_ and staged there to support the operation. The IA positioned an OP at the intersection of Routes Islanders and Lincoln to act as early warning. At approximately 0730, the civilian vehicle driven by two Iraqi soldiers moved to the ambush site and staged as per the insurgent instructions.

At 0805, LTC \_\_\_\_\_ relayed to CPT \_\_\_\_\_ that a maroon Opel (The target vehicle) had passed the IA OP. The TCP vehicles moved and set a blocking position on the north end of RTE Islanders, \_\_\_\_\_. At the ambush site, the

maroon Opel pulled up and the occupants gave the proper password. With the insurgents properly identified, the IA soldiers pulled the driver [REDACTED] from the vehicle. The passenger ([REDACTED]) jumped into the driver's seat and attempted to escape. 1SG [REDACTED], the IA Company First Sergeant, drew his 9mm and fired two rounds into [REDACTED]'s leg to prevent him from escaping. IA Soldiers proceeded to move the injured local national from the vehicle. SGT [REDACTED] the U.S. squad leader (Eagle First Responder qualified), conducted an initial assessment on [REDACTED]. He determined that the two gunshots were superficial and that [REDACTED] was stable. He assessed him as a "routine" casualty.

All elements with the four detainees withdrew from the ambush site at 0845 and arrived at the Alamo patrol base in Saba Al Boor at approximately 0900. As [REDACTED] was removed from the vehicle, it became clear that his condition had deteriorated. SGT [REDACTED] the senior company medic, reassessed [REDACTED] (AIF), and determined he was in near cardiac arrest with little to no pulse. The Soldiers moved the individual to the aid station where SGT [REDACTED] began CPR. Renegade called Thunder X-Ray for MEDEVAC and evacuate [REDACTED]. Lonestar Dustoff 50 was wheels up at 220959NOV05L. The flight medic, SGT [REDACTED] pronounced the AIF DOW at the evacuation site and his body was taken to the 10<sup>th</sup> CSH. SGT [REDACTED] assessed his leg gunshot wounds were superficial and there were no signs of heavy bleeding. SGT [REDACTED] found no further wounds or signs of injuries.

3. FACTS:

a) Was there a patrol brief given to the Iraqi Army and U.S. soldiers? Yes, a mission brief, along with a brief about the abuse of detainees was given by CPT [REDACTED] before the patrol left the Alamo.

b) Were U.S. soldiers present to supervise and support the Iraqi Army patrol and ambush? Yes, a squad leader from 1<sup>st</sup> Platoon, his bravo team leader, and bravo team were located with the IA at the ambush site while CPT [REDACTED] and the rest of 1<sup>st</sup> platoon's 1<sup>st</sup> Section were located with the IA commander at the Thunder TCP.

c) Was the Iraqi Army 1SG justified in shooting the LN? Yes, the LN tried to flee the scene after IA soldiers tried to detain him because of evidence indicating he was trying to coordinate payments to an insurgent cell. This was explained to U.S. soldiers by the IA because they did not see the actual shooting because of their position in the hide site.

d) Was the LN provided adequate care by U.S. forces after he was shot and detained? Yes, a U.S. squad leader, SGT [REDACTED] immediately left his hide site on the ambush line and went to the scene of the shooting to provide first aid. SGT [REDACTED] Eagle First Responder qualified and assessed the wounded as routine. He was coherent and there was only a small amount of blood loss.

e) Was the LN evacuated for further treatment? Yes, the LN was brought to the Alamo after the area around the shooting was secured. The reason it took 30 minutes to leave was because of a potential VBIED threat. He was transported to the Alamo with the IA because their vehicles were closest to the scene.

**B/2-502 Report: IA Fatal Shooting of LN 22 November 2005**

Intelligence: For several days, my battalion had been working on the insurgent cell with [redacted] and [redacted]. The THF had been involved and had published a DIFR naming several members of the cell. These members included [redacted] and [redacted]. On the night of 21 November, LTC [redacted] made a recording (his third) of an informant's conversation with [redacted] in the cell.

Planning: I allowed [redacted] company to take the lead on this operation with U.S. supervision, the first operation I had allowed the IA to plan and lead. Since the plan involved two IA soldiers in a civilian vehicle wearing civilian clothing, [redacted] the IA company MITT officer, ensured that the plan was within their allowed actions. I approved [redacted] plan and provided myself plus my 1st section, 1st Platoon (18 soldiers, led by [redacted] overwatch and assist as necessary. Twice before the operation, I warned [redacted] but detainees abuse and he assured me that neither he nor his soldiers would touch the detainees.

Initial Set: At 0420, we departed the Alamo with three BMPs, a WAZ, a civilian vehicle, approximately 30 IA soldiers, and the informant, followed by four U.S. M1114s with 18 U.S. soldiers, 1L [redacted] and one interpreter. We moved through the IA TCP (1) and traveled south on RTE Islanders. At grid [redacted] just north of the intersection with RTE Blues, we stopped and dismounted the Iraqi dismounts plus six U.S. soldiers, the informant, and 1L1 Chenerev to set up the ambush. The rest of us moved north to the Iraqi TCP (1) and staged to support the operation. The IA also left an OP at the intersection of Islanders and Lincoln to act as early warning. At approximately 0730, the civilian vehicle driven by two Iraqi soldiers moved to the ambush site (2) and staged as per the insurgent instructions.

Ambush: At 0806, LTC [redacted] relayed to me that the vehicle had passed the IA OP. We got in the vehicles and moved set a blocking position on the north of RTE Islanders, and [redacted] the ambush site (2), the maroon Opel pulled up and gave the password. At that point, the IA soldiers pulled the driver [redacted] from the vehicle. The passenger [redacted] jumped into the driver's seat and attempted to escape. ISG [redacted] to prevent him from escaping. The soldiers then pulled him from the vehicle. Both insurgents were struck several times by the IA. In the process of being detained, my soldiers in overwatch moved in to control the IAs and to ensure the situation did not get out of hand. SGT [redacted] the U.S. squad leader (Eagle First Responder (EFR) qualified, the 101st equivalent of PO) qualification, "routing" at that time. As this was occurring, the three BMPs, the WAZ, and two M1114s from the north (3) moved south to the ambush site, leaving two M1114s to secure the RTE Islanders at point (3). As we arrived, the IA soldiers noticed a BMW turning around south of the ambush site (4), and one BMP and one M1114 moved to secure the BMW. The IA saw a cell phone in the Opel and thought that it may be a VBIED, to be detonated by the BMW. All personnel backed off and set up a cordon. My soldiers secured the BMW and detained the two passengers [redacted] and his brother [redacted]. At that point, the IA decided that the car was not a VBIED and moved in to search and take control of the detainees. The informant also [redacted] and also identified [redacted].

Withdrawal (MEDEVAC): One of the key tasks in planning was to withdraw quickly as to not advertise the occurrence to other insurgents in the cell and potentially burn future operations. We left the ambush site at 0945 and arrived at the Alamo at 0900. My M1114s crew had room for two detainees (all we planned for was two), so we had the IA carry the other two back after strict warnings about detainee abuse [redacted] in the back seat of his car, and Malik [redacted] in the WAZ. Because we assessed [redacted] as routine and saw no change in his condition, [redacted] move him back to the Alamo driven by two IA soldiers. [redacted] wanted him back alive and well so we could TQ him and get more information about the insurgent network. I did not call for air MEDEVAC because he was routine and did not see the need to risk a MEDEVAC A/C. I also called ahead to the Alamo and told them to have [redacted] standing by. When SGT [redacted] assisted by SGT [redacted] and SGT [redacted] unloaded [redacted] from the vehicle, his condition had deteriorated markedly. He was in near cardiac arrest with little to no pulse. The soldiers moved them to the aid station where SGT [redacted] began CPR. We called Thunder X-Ray for MEDEVAC, and evacuated [redacted] although he was dead before he even got on the aircraft. During medical care, SGT [redacted] removed [redacted] bandages and tried to determine the source of his cardiac arrest. The leg wounds were still superficial and there was no sign of heavy bleeding. He also found no further wounds or signs of injuries that would indicate any foul play by the IA.

Follow-up: Once [redacted] had been evacuated, we began TQing the detainees and sorting through the evidence. The detainees had no weapons or incriminating evidence except for cell phones [redacted] that contained other known insurgent numbers. While being TQ'd [redacted] admitted to being part of an IED making cell, emplacing several IEDs, firing RPGs, and kidnapping LNs exiting from Gunner's Gate. [redacted] did not admit to anything, but could not keep a straight story between them. Additionally, [redacted] phone rung on the objective and the voice on the other end asked "is it done." The informant also gave follow up information to THF about [redacted] insurgent activities. LTC [redacted] came to the Alamo to evaluate the situation and talk to LTC Khalil about any potential detainee abuse. At 1400, after we completed TQing the informants, we departed for Camp Taji with the three detainees.

I, [Redacted], WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

AT 0400 on 22NOV05 I went on an ambush with my SQD (1st plr 2nd SQD). Our role was to provide soldiers to set up a hasty blocking position on route Islanders. During the actual snatch/grab of the identified personnel. The Iraqi Army along with the informant would conduct the actual snatch mission after the informant could ID the individuals. Iraqi soldiers hid behind a berm on Islanders in a ambush position in case of a fire fight. During the meeting, the informant and Iraqi ISGT dressed in civis positively ID. the individuals, the Iraqi ISGT shot one individual in the leg after the person got spooked and tried to take off. once my SQD heard the shot we ran out on the road to block any cars from leaving/entering. SGT [Redacted] and I went to the actual site of the meeting and saw one person shot on the ground and one detained. This happened at about 0815. We also noticed a second vehical in the AO, it was a BMW 5 series. they were detained due to the informant intel on a second vehical that would escort the suspected insurgents. We loaded the wounded person in a vehical and after searching the area, persons and cars conveyed back to the Aloma. We arrived at about

I, [redacted], WANT TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT UNDER OATH:

That on or around 22 Nov 05 0400 my team along with SGT [redacted] and the Iraqi army left the alarm to execute a Ambush on Rte ~~106-10~~ <sup>Islandia</sup>. Around 0815 Linkup was made Between the I.A. and the suspected insurgents. We "2nd squad 1st plt" were 200meters south of the linkup to execute a Blocking position. Due to the terrain I could not see the linkup. Because we would have compromised the mission. We heard gunfire and looked to find one man had been laid on the ground and the other insurgent was being Detained. at this point The entire Iraqi element was shooting in the air. SGT [redacted] and myself went to the Linkup point and found one insurgent shot and one lying on the ground. at this point we stopped a BMW 5series that was 300meters south of the shooting site. we went Down to the BMW and Detained two men. By now the wounded was being loaded up with the Detainees. We left for the alarm and arrived at 0900. as soon as we received the wounded from the Iraqi Army we immediately took him to the Aid station and tried to save his life. SGT [redacted] pronounced him Dead after working on him for approximately a half hour. Doc pronounced him Dead at 0933.
