SECTION IV - FINDINGS (para 3-10, AR 15-6)

The (investigating officer) (board), having carefully considered the evidence, finds:

In the matter of the vehicle/occupants presenting a threat to the US patrol, evidence supports that there was a threat to the patrol. The vehicle bypassed stopped traffic, accelerated East bound towards the cordon position, ignored a total of 5 warning shots and numerous flash/spot lights, drove through a line of chem-lights, and did not stop when engaged with the Bradley Coax, M1114 50CAL, or M1114 M240B. These actions displayed by the vehicle are all indicative of a vehicle borne improvised explosive device (VBIED). The location of the incident is a vicinity where Coalition and Iraqi Forces are attacked on an almost daily basis. In addition, elements were responding to a report of a construction of a VBIED.

In the matter of escalation of force procedures followed, the evidence does not support the escalation of force procedures were violated. At approximately 2110HRS on 12 NOV 2005, elements of C Co, 1-184 IN and 4-64 AR were directed to this location by [REDACTED] to investigate reports of construction of a possible VBIED (vehicle borne improvised explosive device). At approximately 2120HRS, elements arrived at the location and by 2124HRS had entered the target compound. Due to the size of the target location, all available dismounts were involved with the search. The remaining vehicle crews were tasked with providing a tight cordon security and CASEVAC. Chem-lights were placed on [REDACTED] road and Route [REDACTED] approximately 50M from the cordon elements to establish a trigger line. Traffic was stopped to the West on both [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] approximately 300M from the cordon elements near [REDACTED] Bridge. The patrol leader, 1LT [REDACTED], radioed White 6 to bring his 3 vehicle patrol to the target location to assist with search and cordon positions. At approximately 2140HRS, White 6 arrived and began dismounting elements to assist. At approximately 2145, a vehicle bypassed the stopped traffic near [REDACTED] Bridge and accelerated eastbound on Route [REDACTED] towards the cordon elements. The vehicle was engaged with spot lights from multiple sources in an attempt to warn the driver. Approximately 250M from the cordon, SGT [REDACTED] shined his flashlight at the vehicle and attempted to stop the driver. At approximately 200M, SGT [REDACTED] fired the first of his 4 warning shots, the first two were tracer rounds. He continued to fire consecutive warning shots until the vehicle was almost parallel to his position. The vehicle had passed through the chem-lights. At this time, SSG [REDACTED], TC of [REDACTED], fired his shotgun at the front right tire of the vehicle. After the vehicle did not stop, he instructed SGT [REDACTED] to fire the Coax. The vehicle continued and was engaged with the 50CAL by SPC [REDACTED] gunner in C26. As the vehicle continued, it was then engaged by SPC [REDACTED] with the 240B from C23. Only after this engagement, the vehicle came to a stop. All evidence supports that the driver of the vehicle was given ample warning that he was approaching coalition forces. Comments made by the driver of the vehicle to C Co's interpreter, [REDACTED], show that he was aware of coalition presence, had used multiple approaches and was trying to get around the cordon. His actions were perceived by US Forces as hostile, who reacted in accordance with the escalation of force procedures. The driver was identified as [REDACTED] and was evacuated to 86th CSH. The passenger, identified as [REDACTED], eventually died.

That any soldiers directly involved in the fatal shooting receive counseling from the battalion Chaplain, should they so desire.



That battalion produce a SOP to include graphic depictions for cordon/blocking and TCP positions.

That the unit conduct 100% retraining on cordon/blocking positions and TCPs.

Civil Affairs work with the Iraqi authorities to locate the relatives of the deceased and begin the process of administering solatia payment.

I have been asked to relook at the matter of the unit failing to follow Brigade TCP standards. In reviewing the statements of the individuals involved, I cannot find any evidence that the on-ground commander failed to follow the TCP standards. All unit vehicles carry the necessary equipment to establish a cordon/TCP to standards. All briefings include the Brigade TCP standards. This was a last minute follow on mission directing the unit to locate a VBIED at the provided grid. The unit was directed to this location by [REDACTED]. The unit did not have the advantage of conducting a recon of the target location and preparing accordingly. Once the unit was on the objective, LT [REDACTED] realized that more soldiers were needed to accomplish the mission and actioned another patrol that was in the area to assist in search and cordon. The initial cordon was a tight cordon surrounding the compound and [REDACTED] Road. The soldiers started the process of pushing the cordon out to include Route [REDACTED]. Traffic was already stopped 300 meters away near [REDACTED] Bridge. When the additional patrol ([REDACTED]) arrived, they dismounted the soldiers needed for the search. The intention was once the soldiers were dismounted, the vehicles would move up onto Route [REDACTED] to improve the cordon being established. As depicted in Exhibit 1, White Platoon had just arrived and were still unloading the dismounts when the vehicle bypassed the traffic on Route [REDACTED]. The vehicle had first tried [REDACTED] Road and saw the Bradley IFV. One of the purposes of a TCP is to make it known that Coalition Forces are ahead. It was clear to the other vehicles already stopped by the bridge and it was clear to the driver ([REDACTED]) that Coalition Forces were ahead. I see no evidence that supports the matter of the unit failing to follow Brigade TCP standards. The evidence shows that there were not enough soldiers initially on ground to secure the objective and secure a wide cordon. LT [REDACTED] had full situational awareness and was taking the necessary steps to accomplish the mission and establish the cordon to Brigade standards.

LINE 6: Summary of incident: At approximately 112147NOV05 C CO was conducting a hasty raid on a garage in [REDACTED] vic [REDACTED]. The CO elements were actioned to the garage after TF TOC received information that there was a VBIED under construction in the garage. The garage was actually a walled compound approximately 200m on each side. CO elements arrived at the location at approximately 2120 and immediately detained 5 personnel and recovered 6 AK 47's. The bulk of available dismounted soldiers were inside the compound searching for the VBIED. The available CO vehicles (7 total) were parked in cordon positions around the compound, with the north part of the cordon on [REDACTED] Road. Each vehicle was over watching multiple avenues of approach. CO elements were at the location for approximately 15 minutes. Cones, wire and chemical lights were out at some of the positions. All positions had at least chemical lights to for early warning/trigger lines. 2PLT elements arrived to assist with the search when the 1PL stated the objective was too large to search with available elements. 2PLT vehicles dropped off dismounted personnel and were preparing to move to cordon positions on RTE [REDACTED], which runs east/west approximately 15 meters north of the road where the northern most cordon positions were located. Traffic on eastbound RTE [REDACTED] was stopped near [REDACTED] Bridge approximately 300 meters west of the cordon. SGT [REDACTED] was on RTE [REDACTED] placing more chemical lights in the road when he saw a white vehicle approaching the cordon at high speed. The vehicle had passed stopped traffic on eastbound RTE [REDACTED]. SGT [REDACTED] waved a chemical light, threw a chemical light toward the vehicle, flashed his flashlight and weapon-mounted light at the vehicle and displayed his weapon. The vehicle continued to move toward the cordon at a high rate of speed. SGT [REDACTED] then fired one tracer round in front of the vehicle as a warning shot. The vehicle continued to move toward him. SGT [REDACTED] fired 2 more tracer warning shot rounds at the vehicle. The vehicle appeared to swerve to avoid the tracers and continued to speed toward the cordon. Bradley TC SSG [REDACTED] then fired one 12GA round at the right front tire of the vehicle in an effort to disable the vehicle. The vehicle did not stop. SSG [REDACTED] then ordered his gunner to disable the vehicle with the M2 COAX machine gun. Gunner SGT [REDACTED] then fired at the vehicle with the M2 COAX. The vehicle was now passing west to east directly in front of and approximately 20-25 meters north of the cordon. As the vehicle passed the Bradley, SPC [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] also fired disabling shots at the vehicle. The vehicle came to a stop on RTE [REDACTED] directly north of the garage compound. CO elements approached the vehicle and searched it. There was no contraband found. The occupants of the vehicle both suffered gunshot wounds. The driver, [REDACTED], suffered a gunshot wound in the upper torso. He was conscious and talking. The passenger, identified by [REDACTED] ID card as [REDACTED], suffered gunshot wounds to the head, torso and abdomen. Hawas was non-responsive. PLT MEDICS SPC [REDACTED] and SPC [REDACTED] stabilized [REDACTED] for transport. MEDICS worked on [REDACTED] for approximately 15-20 minutes to stabilize him for transport, but [REDACTED] died at the scene. [REDACTED] was subsequently transported to the 86th CSH by CO elements. IP's on site recovered [REDACTED] body. IP's were unable to tow [REDACTED] vehicle, so it was left inside the garage compound.

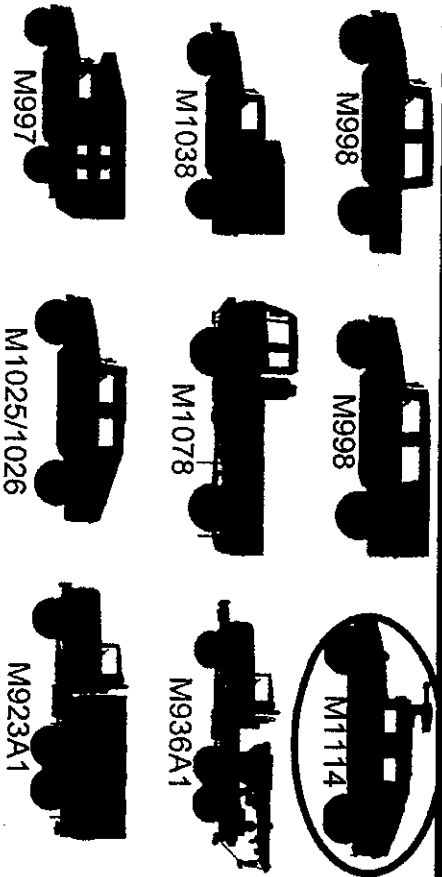
