**DECLARATION OF MARISOL
DOMINGUEZ-RUIZ IN SUPPORT
OF PLAINTIFFS' ADDITIONAL
BRIEFING IN SUPPORT OF
MOTION FOR AN ORDER TO
SHOW CAUSE RE: CONTEMPT
(Doc. 375)**

1 I, Marisol Dominguez-Ruiz, hereby declare:

2 1. I make this declaration based on my own personal knowledge and if
3 called to testify I could and would do so competently as follows:

4 2. I am a Justice Catalyst Fellow at the ACLU National Prison Project
5 (ACLU NPP) and am admitted to practice law in the State of California and before
6 this court. I am one of the lawyers who represent the plaintiff class in this action.

7 3. I serve as a monitor, along with ACLU SoCal counsel, Melissa
8 Camacho, in LA County Jails (Jails). As a monitor, I have unescorted access to each
9 of the jails so that I can talk to people incarcerated there and observe conditions first-
10 hand.

11 4. On Monday, May 1, 2023, I visited the Inmate Reception Center (IRC)
12 and the IRC – 231 as a routine monitoring visit and to interview Mr. Carlos Martinez
13 Cruz who reported not receiving his psych medication even though he had a
14 prescription. I arrived around 2:15 pm and headed over to the IRC 231 area, the last
15 known whereabouts of Mr. Carlos Martinez Cruz.

16 5. From where I was standing, I could see a towel on the floor of IRC 231
17 F-Pod. Water was clearing seeping onto the floor of the dorm. I spoke with a deputy
18 who explained that a combination of people clogging the toilets, repeatedly flushing
19 toilets and old plumbing causes this. As I was leaving, an hour after I had been there
20 and observed the seeping water, I heard him ask trustees to mop up the wet floor.

21 6. Around 3:42pm, I headed over to the Custody line where the holding
22 cells are at. Most holding cells were empty or had 1-3 people. Holding cell 206 had
23 the most people in there with 8 people. I asked if anyone had been there for long
24 periods of time and I was told no. It ranged from half an hour to two hours. I asked
25 if they needed toilet paper and they said they had enough. The holding cells in
26 general looked clean.

27 7. I asked to meet with the Compliance Sergeant to check-in and introduce
28 myself. The deputies called Lt. Paxton Reinecker who came out to meet me. He

1 explained that no one was in a holding cell for over 12 hours and showed the holding
2 log cells. He also had the deputies show me the computer screen featuring the new
3 tracking system.

4 8. After our conversation, I headed over to the IRC clinic area around 4
5 pm. It was relatively calm and looked clean. There were about 10 people sitting in
6 chairs watching television. There were about 3 people near the nurse section and one
7 person was completing an interview.

8 9. There was only one person on the front bench. There were a few juice
9 cartons by him. I tried to speak with him but he was unable to answer basic questions
10 as to how long he had been there so I did not continue the conversation.

11 10. The IRC Cage was unlocked, and I observed one person pacing back
12 and forth.

13 11. I checked two of the three toilets in the clinic area. The toilet bowls and
14 surrounding area looked relatively clean. One of the toilets had a few scraps of toilet
15 paper on the floor.

16 12. I asked the custody deputies to provide me with the 24-hour log and
17 Front Bench log as well. No one currently in the IRC Clinic had been there for an
18 excess of 10 hours.

19 13. On Friday, May 12, 2023, around 4pm, I returned to the IRC for another
20 visit. I headed over to the Clinic area where there was one person on the floor and
21 about ten people sitting in chairs. It appeared there had just been an incident because
22 someone was in a cart. By the time I arrived, the incident had died down and
23 everyone looked calm.

24 14. There were a couple of trustees mopping up the floors. The toilets in
25 the Clinic area looked relatively clean.

26 15. Two people were on the front bench and I noted they had been fed
27 because they had a lunch sack and juice carton near them.

28

1 16. I asked the deputies working if anyone had been there for over 24 hours
2 and if I could have a copy of the log. I was provided the list and noted no one was
3 past 24 hours. The longest someone had been in the IRC clinic was 14 hours.

4 17. Holding cells 101 – 105, 107, 108, 109, 111, 113, 119, and 122 were
5 empty and appeared to be clean: there was no trash on the floor, toilet paper was
6 available, and trash cans were visible.

7 18. I went upstairs to the custody line holding cells. I spoke to one person,
8 Michael Deville (Booking # 6590813) in holding cell #208. His main complaints
9 were not having toilet paper and being moved around. He had arrived at the IRC on
10 May 10, 2023, later moved to the IRC 231 Overflow area, and brought back down
11 to a holding cell. He wanted to get permanent housing already. During my visit, I
12 saw the deputies provide him with toilet paper. Mr. Deville had been in a holding
13 cell for a couple of hours.

14 19. I walked by the other holding cells in this area. They were either empty
15 or below capacity. I saw people sleeping inside holding cell #214 with their arms
16 wrapped inside their clothes for warmth. As I walked by holding cell #210, I saw 6
17 people sleeping on the floor.

18 20. I asked the deputies if anyone had been there for long periods of time
19 or in excess of 12 hours. I was told no and provided a list as well which confirmed
20 that no one had been in a holding cell for over 12 hours.

21 21. I left the IRC around 5:20 pm at which time things remained calm.

22 22. My next visit to the LA jails was on May 19, 2023 as part of the tour
23 with Judge Pregerson. I visited Pitchess Detention Center and Century Regional
24 Detention Facility.

25 23. I returned to the IRC for another routine monitoring visit on Thursday,
26 May 25, 2023. I arrived at the IRC around 8:40am.

27 24. I asked to be shown the shower areas. We have received reports of
28 people being left in the shower area for a long period of time, sometimes even a

1 couple of hours. I was taken to that area and was informed that the showers were not
2 in service at the time. I asked the reason for this. I was told by a deputy that it was
3 due to staffing issues. Whenever they are short-staffed, the shower area is one of the
4 first areas to get shut down because it requires a lot of staff and supervision. I was
5 told that the early morning shift is usually short staffed because they anticipate less
6 people coming through.

7 25. I headed back to the clinic area and observed less than 20 people
8 watching television. I did notice trash on floor and a strong odor emanating in the
9 clinic area. I could smell the feces-like odor through my mask.

10 26. I checked one of the toilets and it had not been flushed. I flushed it and
11 the toilet worked fine.

12 27. I saw two people on the floor sleeping in the clinic area.

13 28. I asked deputies if anyone had been there for long periods of time or if
14 anyone was on the front bench. I was told no one was on the front bench, no one had
15 been there longer than 24 hours – the longest time was 16 hours.

16 29. Holding cells 101-105 had trash cans with plastic bags, rolls of toilet
17 paper, and no trash on the floor.

18 30. Holding cell 122 was empty and I could see a trash bin with plastic bag,
19 2 rolls of toilet paper, and no trash on floor.

20 31. I headed upstairs to the holding cells in the custody line area.

21 32. I spoke to people who were in holding cells and asked how they were
22 and if there were any issues. No one reported being in a holding cell for long periods
23 of time. The general complaint was that it was really cold. I saw people sleeping on
24 the floor in holding cells and many wrapped their arms inside holding cells for body
25 warmth.

26 33. Most of the holding cells in this area were clean, with trash cans, and
27 toilet paper available for use. Most of the holding cells were empty.

28

1 34. I asked the deputies to see the holding cell list and noted no one was
2 there for an excess of 12 hours.

3 35. I left the IRC around 9:50 am.

4 36. My next visit to the IRC was Thursday, June 1st around 1:55 pm. I was
5 greeted by Lieutenant Rojas upon my arrival. He let me know he'd be at the Watch
6 Commander's desk and to reach out if I had any questions.

7 37. There were around 20 people in the Clinic area with three people
8 sleeping on the floor and two people with wheelchairs. I asked people how they were
9 doing and only one person stated he felt hungry. Everyone else said everything was
10 okay.

11 38. I saw one person in holding cell 120, labeled as "KTP," shorthand for
12 Keep The Peace. I asked the deputies why he was there. I was told this person had
13 been in the general population area and around 1:40 pm he started acting erratic and
14 speaking incoherently. I approached this person, later identified as Alberto
15 Rodriguez (Booking # 6612093), to ask how he was doing. He was not cogent and
16 unable to speak with me. I was told he was placed in a holding cell until mental
17 health staff could do an assessment.

18 39. I asked the deputies if anyone had been there for an excess of 24 hours
19 and was informed no. I also spoke with incarcerated people and no one claimed to
20 have been in the IRC for a long period of time.

21 40. I also asked if there were any concerns and no one in the IRC voiced
22 any issues. One person did say he was hungry, but a deputy had previously stated
23 food would arrive in a couple of hours.

24 41. I went upstairs to the holding cells in the custody line area. I walked
25 down the hall and noticed most of the cells were either clean or empty. Holding cell
26 #220 was empty but there was trash on floor, including empty juice cartons, plastic
27 wrappers, and shreds of toilet paper.

28

1 42. I stopped at holding cell #207 because there were people there. I spoke
2 with them and asked if they had any issues or if anyone had been there for a long
3 time. I was told they needed toilet paper but other than that, no one had been there
4 for a long time and did not voice any issues.

5 43. I went down to the custody line booth and asked for the 12-hour holding
6 cell log and requested toilet paper for #207. The deputies complied with both
7 requests. I reviewed the data and did not identify anyone who had been there for a
8 long time.

9 44. I went back down to the Clinic area where Mr. Rodriguez was still in
10 the holding cell 120. I asked for his movement history and the 24-hour list as well. I
11 noted Mr. Rodriguez arrived at the IRC on May 31, 2023 at 11:58 pm so he was still
12 under the 24-hour requirement. The 24-hour list did not identify any violations
13 which confirmed what the deputies told me.

14 45. Attached herein is Exhibit A and B are tables showing the number of
15 people held in holding cells for longer than 12 hours for the period of March 16,
16 2023 through June 1, 2023. This data is retrieved from the most recent set of records
17 provided by Defendants to Plaintiffs' counsel. The data is divided between periods,
18 March 16, 2023 through May 3, 2023, and May 7, 2023 through June 1, 2023. This
19 is due to a change in tracking systems used by Defendants so Exhibit A relies on the
20 old system and the information is tracked differently than information starting May
21 7, 2023. The table for Exhibit A includes the booking number and for each person,
22 the time and date they were in a holding cell, time and date they left the holding cell,
23 and the total length of time they spent in a holding. The table for Exhibit B includes
24 the booking number, the total time they were in a holding cell, and the date they
25 were released from the holding cell.

26 46. There are several reporting gaps between March 16, 2023 and June 1,
27 2023. Plaintiffs do not have information for eighteen dates: March 19, March 26,
28 April 1, April 2, April 13, April 14, April 15, April 16, April 19, April 20, April 22,

1 April 23, April 29, April 30, May 3, May 4, May 5, and May 6. The gap reporting
2 from May 4-6 accounts for the period when Defendants switched over to the new
3 reporting system. Because the reporting system was not automated prior to May 7,
4 2023, I do not know whether the dates we are missing information are days for which
5 there are no violations or dates Defendants failed to report violations.

6 47. Both tables are submitted pursuant to Federal Rule of Evidence 1006
7 and were prepared in the following manner. Under my direction, we reviewed all the
8 Holding Cell PDFs. Under my direction, I worked with co-counsel to enter relevant
9 information into an excel spreadsheet, including name, booking number, time of
10 placement, the time the person was removed from holding cell, and the total time
11 each person was placed in a holding cell.

12 48. Once information was recorded and time was calculated, I removed
13 duplicates and anyone with incomplete information that made it impossible or
14 unclear to determine the length of time in a holding cell. I also identified and
15 removed duplicates that had been recorded in previous filing. *See* Doc. 382-5, Ex.
16 A. Due to missing information in the PDFs and reporting gaps, the tables underreport
17 the amount of people held in excess of 12 hours.

18 49. Exhibit A and B show the following:

- 19 a. Between March 16, 2023 through May 3, 2023, there were 312
20 holding cell violations.
- 21 b. Between May 7, 2023 through June 1, 2023, there were 47 holding
22 cell violations.
- 23 c. The total number of violations between both, Exhibit A and B, are
24 359 violations.
