1 2 Declaration of Peter J. Eliasberg

I, Peter J. Eliasberg, hereby declare:

I make this declaration based on my own personal knowledge and if
called to testify I could and would do so competently as follows:

I am the Chief Counsel at the ACLU Foundation of Southern
 California. I am admitted to practice law in the State of California and before this
 Court. I am one of the counsel of record for the Plaintiff class in the above captioned action. I make this declaration in support of Plaintiff's ADDITIONAL
 BRIEFING RE: MOTION FOR AN OSC RE: CONTEMPT (Doc. 375).

3. Attached as Exhibit A is a table showing the number of people held in 10 the Inmate Reception Center (IRC) for more than 24 hours, the number of people 11 held in IRC for more than 36 hours, and the number of hours in IRC for the person 12 who had been in the IRC for the most hours on any given day for the period from 13 November 17, 2022 through June 1, 2023, and the booking number for the person 14 who had been in IRC the longest as of a particular day, and a column showing 15 number of people held for more than 24 hours excluding those who were at court at 16 when they exceeded 24 hours. 17

The table is submitted pursuant to Federal Rule of Evidence 1006 and 4. 18 was prepared in the following manner. Until May 7, 2023 Defendants provided 19 Plaintiffs' counsel with three reports every day, which include, among other 20 information, the name and booking number of every person who had been held in 21 IRC for more than 24 hours at the time of the report. An example of one of these 22 e-mails is attached as Exhibit C to the Declaration of Melissa Camacho filed today 23 along with the Reply in Support of Plaintiffs' Motion for an Order to Show Cause 24 re Contempt. I will refer to these e-mails hereafter as "IRC 24-hour reports." 25

26 5. People working at my direction compiled all the IRC 24-hour reports
27 we had received for November 17, 2022 through June 1, 2023. Then they went
28 through each of those reports and entered into an Excel spreadsheet the name,

booking number, time spent in IRC according to those IRC 24-hour reports for 1 each of the three shifts each day as well as other information including the code 2 listed as the reason the person was held in IRC and the number of people held in 3 "overflow". 4

Starting May 7, 2023 when Defendants transferred to the new to the 6. 5 new SIMS (Shared Intake Monitoring System), they provided violation reports 6 based on SIMS data, starting with violation reports for May 7, 2023. Declaration of 7 Camacho Decl. at ¶¶ 71-72. These reports contain all reports of all three types of 8 violations: 24-hour (or Processing), 12-hour holding cell (or Cell), and 4-hour 9 Front Bench (or Tethered). Id. at ¶ 73. At our direction, ACLU SoCal interns created 10 an Excel spreadsheet recording the name, booking number, and amount of time 11 over the relevant violation. We then copy and pasted that Excel spreadsheet 12 information into the 24-hour Excel spreadsheet and began providing a full report and 13 a summary report that showed the name of every person. 14

7. Once we had entered all the information into the Excel spreadsheet 15 through April 1, 2023 I created the table attached as Exhibit A. To create the table, 16 I went through names of every person listed as being held for more than 24 hours 17 for each day and counted them, excluding multiple entries for the same person on 18 19 the same day. For example, if John Doe appeared on the Early Morning (EM) report as having been in IRC for 25 hours and then appeared again on the AM 20 21 report for the same day as having been in IRC for 32 hours, and did not appear on the PM report we only counted him as a single person who had been in IRC on that 22 day for more than 24 hours. However, if someone showed on any report on a 23 specific day as having been in IRC for more than 36 hours, we included him on the 24 count of people in IRC more than 24 hours and the count of people in IRC for 25 more than 36 hours for the same day. In addition, we omitted from the table 26 people whose time in IRC seemed so extreme that it appeared to be an error. 27 Then we tallied up the total number of people in IRC for 24 hours and 28 8.

for 36 hours on a given day and entered those numbers into the table. We also 1 looked at the time in IRC for every person in any report on a given day and 2 determined who was listed as having spent the most hours in IRC on any report for 3 a given day and entered that person's booking number and hours in the last column 4 in the table. 5

I added a column to the spreadsheet called "Number of People Held 9. 6 more than 24 hours without court as reason." Under my direction, ACLU SoCal 7 staff populated that column by looking at the 24-hour Excel spreadsheet and 8 removing from the count any violation where Defendants reported that the reason 9 for the violation was that the person was at court, as designated by an "A." See, 10 e.g., Camacho Dec. ¶ 32 Ex. C (table of violation types by letter). If the change in 11 data impacted the number of people held over 36 hours or the longest stay, staff so 12 indicated in the 36-hour and longest violation columns. 13

- 10. For the dates from May 7, 2023 to June 1, 2023, an ACLU SoCal 14 intern looked at the "full summary" document and added a column to the 24-hour 15 Excel spreadsheet indicating with a Y where someone's IRC clock hit the 24-hour 16 mark when they were at court. Camacho Dec. ¶ 72, Ex. K (full summary report, 17 June 1, 2023). ACLU SoCal staff updating the 24-hour violation table then went 18 through the same process, indicating in the "Number of People Held more than 24 19 hours without court as reason" column the number of people whose violations did 20 not occur when they were at court, and adjusting the 36-hour and longest violation 21 columns as needed. 22

For the period between 11/17/22 and 6/1/23, which totals 197 days, 11. the attached table shows the following: 24
