SHEILA D. HARRIS, PhD.

I, Sheila D. Harris, PhD., do hereby declare as follows:

- 1. I am over the age of eighteen and am competent to testify as to all the matters set forth in this Declaration and would so testify if called upon to do so.
- 2. I have personal knowledge of the matters set forth in this declaration. My personal knowledge is based upon my observations and participation in the events described below.
- 3. I currently serve as a consultant to the City of Phoenix regarding interactions between the police and people experiencing homelessness and have served in this role since August of 2022. I am also currently assisting the City in review of its policies and procedures aimed at ending homelessness.
- 4. I have substantial experience working with homelessness issues throughout the State of Arizona. In 2002, Arizona created a Department of Housing, and I was selected by Governor Hull to be the Director of the new state agency. I served in this role for approximately 6 years, through 2007, being reappointed by Governor Napolitano during this time. Since that time, I transitioned to private consulting, focusing on homelessness solutions and affordable housing issues throughout the state. During my time as a consultant, I served as the Director of the Human Services Campus for approximately 18 months and have continued to focus on the identification and implementation of homelessness solutions.
- 5. My duties for the City of Phoenix include: (i) conducting outreach with key stakeholders and partners in the City addressing homelessness including the Human Services Campus, Central Arizona Shelter Services ("CASS"), and Saint Vincent DePaul; (ii) interviewing people experiencing homelessness and people residing near the Human Services Campus downtown to understand their interactions with police and social support services; (iii) discussing homelessness issues with business owners in the downtown area to identify concerns and recommendations; (iv) compiling information for the City's review regarding homelessness; and (v) advising on engagement opportunities and best practices.
- 6. The City of Phoenix has developed a plan for outreach opportunities and cleanup procedures for the area near the Human Services Campus downtown. This is not just a "cleanup" process, but rather a dedicated effort to provide "Engagement Opportunities" to identify needs for social services, medical care, and shelter. During Engagement Opportunities, the City is working to identify people's individual needs

including shelter for couples, families, mental illness, drug use, and other impediments to shelter.

- 7. On May 10, 2023, I observed the Engagement Opportunity conducted by the City of Phoenix at Ninth Avenue and Washington. I was present for approximately four hours, beginning at the time Scott Hall, the Deputy Director of the City of Phoenix's Office of Homeless Solutions, was briefing the media about the cleaning and ending when the Street Department crew started cleaning the street.
- 8. During this timeframe, I did not observe anyone being forced to have personal property removed that the owner did not provide permission to move, although individuals did voluntarily ask that items be disposed of on that date. People may request to have items disposed of for several reasons, including to pare down property to access shelter.
- 9. It is not uncommon for individuals to accumulate a substantial volume of personal belongings including sleeping bags, tents, chairs, and other property that have accumulated while living on the streets. Prior to May 10, the City conducted outreach to identify people, their belongings, and assess options for shelter. The City typically works over the span of multiple encounters to identify resources and develop relationships. This is a client-focused encounter that can be time-consuming. For example, belongings may need to be stored or disposed of, at the discretion of the unsheltered person, to decrease the volume of goods.
- 10. In fact, my observation was more time was spent on May 10 speaking to persons experiencing homelessness prior to moving their possessions than in the three previous street cleaning activities I have observed. Although on each Engagement Opportunity I observed, the City has (i) provided notice of the cleaning at least a week in advance; (ii) offered indoor shelter or housing that is currently available; and (iii) worked to transport individuals' personal belongings with them to shelter and store or dispose of items that exceeded shelter capacity or could otherwise not be moved.
- 11. During the May 10 Engagement Opportunity, I saw a woman who was moving her possessions start arguing with a cameraman from Channel 12 News who was filming her as she did so. She told him at least twice to stop filming her. He informed her that he had a right to be in the public right of way and he would continue to film despite her protests. Later that morning I happened upon a conversation between this cameraman and the reporter from Channel 12. The reporter was telling the cameraman that it was inappropriate to film someone who did not want to be filmed and he was stating it was his right to do so. I spoke to them and told the cameraman that the woman he was filming had asked him to stop and his refusal was disrespectful. The reporter agreed and said the footage would not be used.

- 12. I also observed three individuals consisting of a white man and woman, and a white woman in a wheelchair, commenting to random people on the street that the City was throwing away the possessions of people who had been living on the street. They had a running commentary about how wrong the City was in their actions. Occasionally, they were joined by an African-American man. They became rather agitated when the Phoenix Police Department arrived. The police were called in because one of the persons living on the street had a firearm (rifle) in their possession. Per protocols of all cleaning activities, the Police Department is to be informed and they are responsible for removing weapons safely from encampments. When the African-American man returned to this group, he was stating quite loudly and in a joking manner that the rifle was at least three feet long and was gesturing with his hands how long the gun was. After that interaction, this group stopped commenting on the Police being at the encampment.
- 13. I also observed an African-American woman observing the Engagement Opportunity. She was speaking with her friend about the activities when they were approached by a news media person. The woman spoke about how the City cannot do this alone and the religious community should get involved. She suggested that churches open their doors and let people sleep in the pews.
- 14. I also saw staff working diligently with persons who were living on that street to find them shelter under very challenging conditions despite a huge media presence trying to film and interview anyone they could while staff were trying to find housing/shelter for those living on the street. For example, one couple wanted to stay together with their dog. It is challenging to find housing for couples with pets. Additionally, both were quite ill and needed to be transported to a hospital for medical treatment. So staff had to help them pack what they were taking to the hospital, separate the possessions they wanted to keep from those items they no longer needed. Staff also had to find a shelter for the dog to stay in while they were in the hospital.
- 15. In my experience consulting the City on homelessness solutions and observing the May 10 Engagement Opportunity, the police did not have any role in cleaning activities unless called for service (as in the above example, where a rifle was located). The outreach staff from the Human Services Campus and Community Bridges were dedicated to making connections with individuals and assessing needs so that the City could offer appropriate shelter.
- 16. I saw no incidents of property being destroyed or removed without the permission of the owner.
- 17. I observed the City working to store property during the cleanings. The City (i) identified what belongings people wanted to take with them to shelter, (ii) what items individuals wanted to keep but couldn't take to shelter that day, and (iii) items that

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individuals no longer wanted to keep. The City provided vehicles to take people to shelter and they were allowed to take their personal property with them that met shelter rules. Staff would help load the vehicles to assist in transportation. If property could not be taken to shelter and needed to be stored, the City would roll out a bin for storage, and, based on the volume of property, identify the bin or bins used by number with the name of the individual. The property could then be moved for storage on the Human Services Campus. Property that individuals no longer wanted to keep was disposed of by the City.

- 18. In my opinion and based on my experience in homelessness and housing solutions, the City's May 10 cleaning (i) was conducted in a respectful and courteous manner; (ii) after notice was provided of the cleaning; and (iii) in a manner that protected people's personal property and belongings. Shelter was offered to all individuals requesting services.
- I, Sheila Harris, declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.

BILL MORLAN

I, Bill Morlan, do hereby declare as follows:

- 1. I am the co-owner of Electric Supply, Inc., located at 917 W Madison Street in Downtown Phoenix.
- 2. On May 10, 2023, I walked from my office to the corner of 9th Avenue and Jefferson Street at least three times.
- 3. I was going to this corner to watch what was happening with the City of Phoenix cleaning of 9th Avenue between Washington and Jefferson Streets.
- 4. On these three trips, I saw multiple employees from the City of Phoenix engaged with the people who had been camping in the area. I saw people wearing shirts with logos of service organizations such as Community Bridges Inc (CBI) and the Human Services Campus (HSC), so I assume those were employees of those organizations on-hand to also provide support to the homeless population.
- 5. From what I saw, the interactions all these people had with the homeless community appeared peaceful, respectful and cooperative. I did not see or hear any conflicts or arguments.
- 6. It appeared to me that the people moving from the block were given the opportunity to collect any belongings they wished to keep. It appeared that the people from the City and the service providers were assisting the unsheltered population with organizing and moving their belongings.
- 7. In the week before the cleaning, I saw at least one employee from the City of Phoenix Office of Homeless Services walking the block and talking to the people camping there. My understanding is that he was letting them know the cleaning was coming and offering them the opportunity to accept placement in a shelter or other facility. The person I saw was alone, with no police or security. My impression was that he was approaching tents and people camping in a calm, respectful way.
- 8. The evening of May 9th, I saw what appeared to be a few campers using identical yellow bags to organize their belongings. My assumption was that these were provided by City of Phoenix to help them prepare.
- 9. On May 10th, I saw a cleanup crew and a private security firm on site to help with the logistics of the situation. I did not see them interacting directly with the homeless

population. I did not see anyone disposing of tents or belongings while the owner was objecting or requesting additional time.

- 10. I did not see any police on the actual block where the cleaning was occurring, and I did not see the police interacting with any of the people who had been camping in the area. I understand that the Police did go onto the block and enter one tent, but this was only when a City of Phoenix employee reported that a weapon had been left behind in a tent that had been vacated.
- 11. The only negative interaction that I even heard about was between an unsheltered individual and a member of the media. From what one of my neighbors told me, the homeless individual asked that the media not film him, and he was upset when they refused to comply with that wish.

- I, Commander Brian Patrick Freudenthal, do hereby declare as follows:
- 1. I am over the age of eighteen, am of sound mind, and am competent and capable of making this declaration and would so testify if called upon to do so.
- 2. I am a law enforcement Commander for the City of Phoenix. Among other duties, I supervise a team of law enforcement officers who handle daily police functions in the area surrounding the Human Services Campus ("HSC") located at 204 South 12th Avenue, Phoenix, AZ 85007.
- 3. I was on duty on May 10, 2023, and I was aware that City of Phoenix employees were conducting a cleaning of the public right-of-way near HSC in the area of Ninth Avenue between Washington and Jefferson streets.
- 4. The Phoenix Police Department was not directly involved in the cleanup, nor were officers stationed at the site of the cleanup. Instead, the only involvement the Phoenix Police Department had in relation to the May 10, 2023 cleanup was a response to assist and recover what was believed to be a rifle for safe keeping and assisting a homeless motorist with a flat tire. The Phoenix Police Department did not have any other role related to the May 10th cleanup.
- I, Brian Patrick Freudenthal, declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.

- I, Officer Brandon McCombs, do hereby declare as follows:
- 1. I am over the age of eighteen, am of sound mind, and am competent and capable of making this declaration and would so testify if called upon to do so.
- 2. I am a law enforcement officer for the City of Phoenix, and I work as a Community Action Officer and have a working relationship with multiple other City of Phoenix Departments and outside entities.
- 3. I was on duty on May 10, 2023 when at about 9:21 a.m. I received a call from Scott Hall with the City of Phoenix's Office of Homeless Solutions. Mr. Hall advised me that his team, which was cleaning an area of Ninth Avenue between Jefferson Street and Washington Street, had found some sort of rifle or long gun inside an abandoned tent. Because an unattended firearm in an unsecured public space poses immediate public health and safety concerns, Mr. Hall requested police assistance for the purpose of retrieving the firearm, making it safe, and storing it for safe keeping. Mr. Hall said none of his team had touched the firearm but had left it in place since they did not know how to make it safe.
- 4. Shortly after my telephone conversation with Mr. Hall, Sergeant Zabatka Colbert and I arrived at the cleanup site where we located the firearm and took photos of it and the tent. We then placed the firearm in a plastic bag, secured it in the back of my police vehicle and left the cleanup site without any further police action. We did not have any interactions with any homeless individuals at the cleanup site. We were at the cleanup site for approximately five minutes. The firearm, which was determined to be a pellet gun, was secured as found property under police incident 23-705753.
- 5. Later that morning at about 10:44 a.m., I received another call from Mr. Hall regarding a homeless individual known as Brian Patrick who had been staying on Ninth Avenue and was placed into a housing program. Mr. Hall said Mr. Patrick was having trouble traveling to the men's housing facility due to a flat tire on his truck. I proceeded to retrieve an air compressor from our downtown office and then I aired a tire on Mr. Patrick's truck, which I located just outside the cleanup site in the vicinity of Ninth Avenue and Adams Street. Mr. Patrick thanked me for my assistance and then left in his truck after informing me that he was headed to a housing facility.
- I, Brandon McCombs, declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.

- I am over the age of eighteen, am of sound mind, and am competent and capable of making this declaration and would so testify if called upon to do so.
- I work in the Crime Analysis and Research Unit for the City of Phoenix Police Department as a Crime Analysis Supervisor. My job duties include creating data reports that detail, among other things, law enforcement activities and crime trends. Among the reports that I generate are reports on arrests as well as Arizona Traffic Ticket and Complaints ("ATTCs"), which are generated based on data collected by the Phoenix Police Department. These reports can include arrests made and ATTCs given for violations of particular statutes/codes within particular areas of the City of Phoenix.
- 3. I was tasked with the creation of reports on adult and juvenile arrests and ATTCs between December 22, 2022 and May 21, 2023 for violations of Phoenix City Code §§ 23-30 / 23-30A (Camping) and 23-48.01 (Lying or Sitting on Public Right-of-Way / Prohibited Use of Public Right-of-Way). Attached to this Declaration are true and correct copies of these reports.
- These reports show that there were no adult or juvenile arrests and no ATTCs between December 22, 2022 and May 21, 2023 with charges under Phoenix City Code §§ 23-30 / 23-30A (Camping) and 23-48.01 (Lying or Sitting on Public Right-of-Way / Prohibited Use of Public Right-of-Way) within the boundaries of City of Phoenix Grid BA26, which is approximately the area encompassed by Van Buren St. and the Railroad Tracks/Buchanan St., 15th Ave. and 7th Ave. This area includes the portion of the City that individuals in the media have colloquially referred to as the "Zone."
- I, Jennifer Jarosi, declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing is true and correct.


