DECLARATION OF SUSAN K. DUNN IN SUPPORT OF PLAINTIFFS' MOTION FOR CLASS CERTIFICATION

- I, Susan K. Dunn, declare as follows:
- 1. I am the Legal Director of the ACLU of South Carolina ("ACLU-SC") and cocounsel for Plaintiffs in this case. I am a member in good standing of the bar of the State of

South Carolina. I respectfully submit this declaration in support of Plaintiffs' Motion for Class Certification. Except as otherwise noted, I have personal knowledge of the facts set forth in this declaration and could testify competently to them if called to do so.

- 2. The ACLU-SC is a state-wide, non-profit legal organization based in Charleston, South Carolina. The ACLU-SC has experience in complex civil litigation, including class actions in federal and state courts. The ACLU-SC also has significant experience in class actions seeking injunctive relief for individuals whose constitutional rights have been infringed.
- 3. Prior to joining the ACLU-SC in January 2009, I worked in private practice in Charleston for more than 30 years. For 12 years, beginning in the mid-1990's, I litigated a high-profile and groundbreaking constitutional case challenging a policy mandating the testing of pregnant and postpartum women at a public hospital for cocaine use, and the delivery of those test results to law enforcement. My clients ultimately won a favorable ruling in the United States Supreme Court that led to a settlement of the case.
- 4. In 1998, I was awarded the Jean Galloway Bissell Award, which is presented annually by the South Carolina Women Lawyers Association to a person who has contributed to the advancement of women in the practice of law in South Carolina.
- 5. I received my undergraduate degree from Duke University and my J.D. from the University of North Carolina-Chapel Hill.
- 6. The ACLU-SC will zealously represent Plaintiff Xavier Larry Goodwin and Plaintiff Raymond Wright, Jr. and the proposed Class members in this case and has the resources
