## **TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER**

The Court having considered the Plaintiff's Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order, Memorandum of Law in Support, Declarations, and Exhibits appended thereto, hereby **ORDERS** that Plaintiff's Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order is **GRANTED**.

The Court **FINDS** that Plaintiff has shown that immediate and irreparable injury will result unless a temporary restraining order is granted. Plaintiff will face irreparable injury without a preliminary injunction because she will remain jailed at least until June 6, 2018, without the prerequisites of equal protection and due process. The Court further **FINDS** that

Plaintiff is likely to prevail on Claims One and Two, that the balance of interests shifts in favor of Plaintiff and the Class, and that the interest of the public favors granting a temporary restraining order.

Accordingly, Defendant Cofield is **ENJOINED** from continuing to jail Plaintiff due solely to her inability to pay a secured monetary amount as a condition of release, unless the Defendant is notified in writing that there has been a prompt inquiry into Plaintiff's present ability to pay the monetary amount, consideration of alternative non-financial conditions of release, and a finding on the record, where counsel was made available to represent Plaintiff and present evidence, that any condition of release was the least restrictive condition necessary to achieve public safety and court appearance.
